Every year the county budgets a certain amount to invest in capital improvements and based on some of the questions our office has received I'm sure some of you are interested to know how much and where the funds have been allocated. For the fiscal year 2012/2013 the breakdown is as follows:

Transportation:	\$ 81,049,405	Community Development:	\$ 4,705,938

The total for the year is \$482,651,151 which includes Capital Improvements from General Funds, Internal Service Funds and Enterprise Funds. The service is available 24/7 and you can receive help by calling **520-284-3517**. If you reside in a rural section of Pima County, including the Tohono O'odham Nation, please call **1-800-796-6792**.

This service is available FREE to any resident of Pima County who is struggling to deal with a traumatic event, or if you need information on how to help others or yourself.

Telephone support staff can also provide referrals to community behavioral healthcare providers and other services to help you cope with trauma and also how to talk with children and teens about tragedy. Such services may include:


Want to save a little money....then make your next stop CHEEEP OLE'S and take your time strolling among the many bargains in discount food items.
