Supervisor Sharon Bronson Elected President of the County Supervisors Association

Pima County Supervisor Sharon Bronson was unanimously elected President of the County Supervisors Association (CSA) at the organization's Annual Policy Summit on November 20, 2008, in Rio Rico. As President of the CSA, she will lead efforts to advance county constituent interests before the state legislature and the U.S. Congress.

Supervisor Bronson stated, "It is an honor to be elected by my colleagues. I look forward to working with state legislators and the Governor to enact policies that improve county efficiency and protect the county taxpayer. Bronson added, "As all counties struggle to manage services during this economic downturn, I also intend to lead the association's efforts to create a forum to share cost-cutting and innovative strategies to balance county budgets."

The CSA is a non-profit, non-partisan organization supporting the 55 elected supervisors from Arizona's 15 counties. As its chief objective, the CSA represents Arizona's counties at both the state and federal levels to promote efficient, responsive government services.
