6. **LITIGATION**

The Board of Supervisors' on 8/18/08, continued the following:

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, stated this was a proposed settlement of a valuation appeal that would decrease the full cash value of these parcels from \$2,526,300.00 to \$2,345,850.00 for tax year 2008. The County Attorney's Office and the Assessor recommended settlement.

On recommendation, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to accept the recommendation.

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, stated this was a request to waive a potential conflict of interest for the law firm of Mesch, Clark and Rothschild for an appeal of a decision of the Board of Adjustment, and a written decision of the Chief Engineer with respect to the variances granted for Kitty Wayne's property. The waivers of the conflict are at the discretion of the client and the Board of Supervisors. The County Attorney's Office requested direction on this matter.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to waive the potential conflict of interest.

They provided the following comments:

- A. A lawsuit was brought against the District 4 Board of Adjustment, and Judge Miller ruled in favor of Pima County;
- B. Petitions were previously submitted that indicated over 1,000 area residents did not want ORV tracks operating that did not meet the conditions outlined in the Ordinance;
- C. Concern was expressed that if the Robinsons' were permitted to continue use of their off-road track, that any Ordinance adopted by the County could not be enforced;
- D. The Robinsons' ORV track was previously unpermitted and, if they are allowed to continue the use of their track, it would set a precedent for other previously unpermitted tracks;
- E. A citizen's committee spent the better part of 2005 writing, rewriting and refining the Off-Road Vehicle Ordinance that was adopted in September 2005 unanimously by the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Board of Supervisors';
- F. Grandfathered rights were discussed at great length during the committee meetings, and it was determined that allowing grandfathered rights would do nothing to resolve the issue;
- G. If grandfather rights are granted in this case, it would negate all the work that was done by the committee and would favor a few track owners over the residents who want to enjoy their property; and,
- H. A request was made to accept the ruling of Judge Miller in favor of Pima County.

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, stated this appeal was pending in Division 2 of the Court of Appeals. The County Attorney's Office requested direction from the Board regarding whether or not to defend the appeal or to participate in settlement negotiations pursuant to the Court of Appeals Settlement Program.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Bronson and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to direct the County Attorney's Office to defend the appeal.

12. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

RESOLUTION NO. 2008- 242 , of the Pima County Board of Supervisors, supporting policy changes by the United States Bureau of Prisons to provide safer working conditions for its Correctional Officers. (District 5)

Dave Clifford, a member of the American Federation of Government Employees, requested the Board adopt the proposed Resolution to help provide safer working conditions for employees of Federal prisons. Federal Corrections Officers are not allowed the use of personal protection items such as pepper spray, a tazer, a baton or stab/slash resistant vests, and they are not armed with anything other than a radio that has a body alarm. Federal Corrections Officers need attention and publicity to obtain equipment that would allow them to defend themselves from inmate violence.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elfas, seconded by Supervisor Day and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to adopt Resolution No. 2008- 242 .

13. COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR: REVISIONS TO MERIT SYSTEM RULES AND PERSONNEL POLICIES

Staff requests approval of the revisions to the following Merit System Rules and Personnel Policies:

- A. Personnel Policy 7-105.A.3 (Annual Leave)
This policy is corrected from temporary employee to temporary employees.
- B. Personnel Policy 7-105.B.5 (Annual Leave)
Pursuant to the Meet and Confer Agreement, this policy is amended to provide prorated accruals for eligible part-time or variable time employees rather than the existing tiered accruals for such leave.
- C. Personnel Policy 7-106.B.2 (Sick Leave)
Pursuant to the Meet and Confer Agreement, this policy is amended to provide prorated accruals for eligible part-time or variable time employees rather than the existing tiered accruals for such leave.

- D. Personnel Policy 7-106.D.3.d (Sick Leave)
Pursuant to the Meet and Confer Agreement, this policy deletes the use of sick leave for the death of eligible family members and is replaced with bereavement leave (a special leave of absence) under 7-107.E. Other items under 7-106.D.3 are re-numbered based on this deletion.
- E. Personnel Policy 7-107.E
Pursuant to the Meet and Confer Agreement, a bereavement leave policy will be established as a result of this amendment and will replace PP 7-106.D.3.d above. Further, the Meet and Confer Agreement states that the definition of eligible family members would mirror the relationships defined in the current Personnel Policy 7-106.D.3.d that is proposed for deletion in these amendments.
- F. Personnel Policy 7-108.F (Humanitarian/Personal Reasons)
Pursuant to the Meet and Confer Agreement, this amendment provides for supplemental bereavement leave as stated under 7-107.E for bereavement leave purposes.
- G. Personnel Policy 7-122.B.3 and 7-122.E.2 (Group Insurance)
Personnel Policy 7-122.B.3 is recommended for revision to fully conform to the language and requirements set forth for health and other benefits coverage in the benefits handbook. We further recommend that the effective date for premium changes be contained in Personnel Policy 7-122.E.2 for easy access.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the revisions.

- A. Cancellation of the uncontested Governing Board elections for Special Districts (Fire and School) to be reflected on the 2008 General Election ballot and appointment of those persons who filed nominating petitions.
- B. Cancellation of the uncontested Board of Director elections for the Green Valley Domestic Water Improvement and the Metropolitan Domestic Water Improvement Districts to be reflected on the 2008 General Election ballot and appointment of those persons who filed nominating petitions.

Without objection, these items were removed from the agenda.

16. HEALTH DEPARTMENT: CATALINA COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN

Staff requests approval of the Catalina Community Wildfire Protection Plan.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the protection plan.

17. NATURAL RESOURCES, PARKS AND RECREATION: RENAMING OF THE STARR PASS EAST TRAILHEAD

RESOLUTION NO. 2008-244, of the Board of Supervisors of Pima County, authorizing the renaming of the Starr Pass East Trailhead as the Richard E. Genser Starr Pass Trailhead.

Carolyn Campbell, representing the Coalition for Sonoran Desert Protection and other member groups, expressed their gratitude for the naming of the trailhead in honor of Richard Genser.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Bronson and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to adopt Resolution No. 2008-244.

18. NATURAL RESOURCES, PARKS AND RECREATION: APPROVAL TO SELL NRPR LOGO

Requests to approve the sale of the Beat Cancer Boot Camp logo, which was developed by NRPR, for the ownership and use by the Beat Cancer Boot Camp in accordance with the provisions of A.R.S. §11-251(57).

Anita Kellman, representative of Beat Cancer Boot Camp, stated the boot camp was established for breast cancer survivors but over the years the program has grown to include survivors of other types of cancer.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Bronson to approve the sale.

Supervisor Carroll requested an amendment to the motion for the sale of the logo to be in the amount of \$1.00. Chairman Elías, as the maker of the motion, and Supervisor Bronson as the second, accepted the amendment.

Upon the vote being taken, the motion as amended was approved by a 5-0 vote.

19. REGIONAL WASTEWATER RECLAMATION: PRETREATMENT SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Staff recommends approval of the following proposed Pretreatment Settlement Agreement, RWRD System Development Fund.

Sunbelt Rentals, a North Carolina Corporation, d.b.a. Nations Rent, No. 2008-01. Proposed settlement amount is \$500.00.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the agreement.

20. **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: PIMA COUNTY CODE TEXT AMENDMENT**

ORDINANCE NO. 2008-83, of the Pima County Board of Supervisors, relating to personnel and employee matters, amending Chapter 2.20 of the Pima County Code to provide for additional procedures applicable to the Meet and Confer process; and to provide for an authorized representative and a Meet and Confer process for County certified law enforcement officers.

The Chairman inquired whether anyone wished to be heard.

The following speakers addressed the Board:

1. Ali Farhang, attorney
2. Christopher Rogers, Chairman of the Pima County Deputy Sheriff's Association AZCOPS Local 707; and,
3. David Mitchell, social worker with the Public Defender's Office.

They provided the following comments:

- A. It was felt there were constitutional and practical issues with approval of the proposed Ordinance for Certified Law Enforcement Officers because it was ambiguous and would create problems for organized labor;
- B. The Constitution provides that the Sheriff was vested with the right to control wages, benefits and terms of conditions of employment within the department;
- C. The Sheriff should decide what process would be undertaken by the department with every successive Sheriff having that same right;
- D. The Pima County Deputy Sheriff's Association, AZCOPS Local 707, stated that every other employee of an elected official has the right to the Meet and Confer process and they felt they were entitled to the same right of the Meet and Confer process;
- E. A request was made to omit the phrase: "with the consent of the Sheriff" and,
- F. The Ordinance with the revisions was strengthened and the Board was urged to adopt the proposed Ordinance.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Bronson and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to close the public hearing and adopt Ordinance No. 2008-83, and to omit the phrase, "with the consent of the Sheriff" from the agreement.

Co9-07-23, KLEIN – ORACLE ROAD REZONING

Request of Britt and Cindy Klein, represented by Stantec, Inc., for a rezoning of approximately 4.01 acres from GR-1 (GZ) (BZ) (Rural Residential), (Gateway Zone) (Buffer Overlay Zone) to TR (GZ) (BZ) (Transitional), (Gateway Zone) (Buffer Overlay Zone), on property located on the southeast corner of Oracle Road and Mountaineer Drive Easement, approximately 1 1/4 miles north of Rancho Vistoso Boulevard. The proposed rezoning conforms to the Pima County Comprehensive Plan, Co7-00-20. On motion, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted 8-0 (Commissioners Gungle and Matter were absent) to recommend APPROVAL WITH STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS. Staff recommends APPROVAL WITH STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS. (District 1)

"IF THE DECISION IS MADE TO APPROVE THE REZONING, THE FOLLOWING STANDARD AND SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS SHOULD BE CONSIDERED:

Completion of the following requirements within five years from the date the rezoning request is approved by the Board of Supervisors:

1. Submittal of a development plan if determined necessary by the appropriate County agencies.
2. Recording of a covenant holding Pima County harmless in the event of flooding.
3. Recording of the necessary development related covenants as determined appropriate by the various County agencies.
4. Provision of development related assurances as required by the appropriate agencies.
5. Prior to the preparation of the development related covenants and any required dedication, a title report (current to within 60 days) evidencing ownership of the property shall be submitted to the Development Services Department.
6. There shall be no further lot splitting or subdividing of residential development without the written approval of the Board of Supervisors.
7. Transportation conditions:

- A. The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall provide offsite improvements to Mountaineer Drive Road as determined necessary by the Pima County Department of Transportation.
 - B. Written certification from Arizona Department of Transportation, stating satisfactory compliance with all its requirements shall be submitted to Development Services Department prior to approval of a Development Plan and Subdivision Plat.
 - C. The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall provide offsite improvements to Oracle Road as determined necessary by Arizona Department of Transportation.
8. Flood Control conditions:
- A. Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the property owner(s)/developer(s) shall submit a drainage report for review and approval which determines whether the drainage which affects the property is regulatory or not, and to determine the erosion hazard setback required for the wash.
 - B. The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall comply with detention/retention conditions and restrictions, or provide an in-lieu fee, as stated in the Floodplain Management Ordinance since the property lies within a balanced basin.
 - C. The property owner(s)/developer(s) shall provide necessary on-site and off-site drainage improvements at no cost to Pima County and as required by the Pima County Regional Flood Control District including on-site detention and improvements to Mountaineer Drive adjacent to the rezoning, which may require drainage improvements to meet all-weather access and concurrency requirements.
9. Wastewater Reclamation condition:
The property owner(s)/developer(s) must secure approval from the Pima County Department of Environmental Quality to use on-site sewage disposal systems within the rezoning area at the time a tentative plat, development plan or request for building permit is submitted for review.
10. Environmental Quality condition
At time of Development Plan review, and prior to approval, the property owner(s)/developer(s) shall demonstrate that the site is suitable for the placement of an on-site wastewater disposal system, including the primary and reserve disposal areas, to serve the proposed development while meeting all minimum design criteria, including all setbacks. The size of the primary and reserve areas shall be determined by on-site soil evaluations and/or percolation testing.
11. Environmental Planning conditions:
- A. At least sixty-six and two-thirds (66⅔%) percent of the site shall be dedicated as natural open space, as shown on the preliminary development plan.
 - B. The owner(s)/developer(s) shall draft an Invasive Species Eradication Plan as part of the Landscape Plan, for the annual inspection and removal of invasive non-native plant species, including but not limited to those listed below.

15. The property owner shall execute and record the following disclaimer regarding Proposition 207 rights. 'Property Owner acknowledges that neither the rezoning of the Property nor the conditions of rezoning give Property Owner any rights, claims or causes of action under the Private Property Rights Protection Act (Arizona Revised Statutes Title 12, chapter 8, article 2.1). To the extent that the rezoning or conditions of rezoning may be construed to give Property Owner to any rights or claims under the Private Property Rights Protection Act, Property Owner hereby waives any and all such rights and/or claims pursuant to A.R.S. § 12-1134(I).'
16. Adherence to the preliminary development plan as approved at public hearing."

Tom Hudson, Zoning Administrator, stated approval of this request would allow the construction of a 12,000 square foot single story office building. The project met the concurrency criteria, it conformed to the Comprehensive Plan and met the requirements of the mixed use designation of the Conservation Lands System. Staff received no letters of opposition. The Coalition for Sonoran Desert Protection expressed support but requested changes to the conditions by adding invasive Non-Native Plant Species, revision of Condition No. 12 and the addition of Condition Nos. 17 and 18 as follows:

Mr. Hudson stated one additional change was suggested by the Coalition and that change was to provide a 40 foot natural buffer along the east property line. The applicant agreed to all the conditions, as amended, including the provision of a 40 foot natural buffer line which was reflected on the Preliminary Development Plan.

The following speakers addressed the Board:

1. Carolyn Campbell, Coalition for Sonoran Desert Protection, and,
2. Kathie Schroeder, neighborhood representative.

They provided the following comments:

- A. The applicants were commended for their willingness to work with the Coalition and neighbors to develop the property in a way that would preserve an important wildlife linkage and resolve neighborhood issues; and,
- B. The Board was urged to approve the request.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Day, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to close the public hearing and approve Co9-07-23, subject to standard and special conditions as amended.

24. DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: POWER SUBSTATION PERMIT

Co18-08-01, TUCSON ELECTRIC POWER CANOA RANCH 138KV SUBSTATION
Request of Tucson Electric Power Company represented by The Planning Center

Without objection, this item was continued to the Board of Supervisors' Meeting of October 7, 2008.

25. DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

P21-08-027, LEONETTI – S. GARRISON HILLS DR.

John and Susan Leonetti (Physical Resource Engineering, Inc., applicant) on the property located at 19000 S. Garrison Hills Dr., in the RH zone, requests a Conditional Use Permit for Auto Storage. Chapter 18.97, in accordance with 18.13.030B35 of the Pima County Zoning Code, allows Auto Storage as an other conditional use which is similar in type, scale and intensity to other listed conditional uses. Auto Storage is a Type II Conditional Use in RH. The Hearing Administrator recommends APPROVAL WITH STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS. (District 3)

Jim Portner, Hearing Administrator, stated improvements on the property are concentrated in the southeast corner and covers an area of two to three acres of a parcel 20 acres in size. Two adjacent neighbors expressed their support of the request at the public hearing and, at the time the decision was rendered, there were four letters of opposition and one letter in support. Currently there are six letters of opposition. The Hearing Administrator recommended approval with standard and special conditions.

Supervisor Bronson inquired whether the applicant was required to obtain a variance and setback.

Mr. Portner responded yes and that requirement was noted in his decision for approval. Opposition to the request consisted of three main points that included the possible violation of the private CC&R's, the auto storage was a visual eyesore and some felt that approval of this request would allow the operation of a junkyard on the property.

The following speakers addressed the Board:

1. Ray Garrison
2. John J. Gabriel
3. Tony DiGiacomo

They provided the following comments:

- A. Opposition was based on the fact that the applicant did not meet with all the neighbors to resolve issues nor did they fully disclose their plans and the proposed use was incompatible with surrounding development; and,
- B. Several adjacent property owners expressed support for the proposed use.

John Leonetti, applicant, provided photographs of his automobile collection and indicated that each vehicle was operable, each vehicle was fully licensed, registered and insured, and the vehicles occupy a space measuring 7,600 square feet on a 20 acre parcel. His original intent was to operate an open air museum, but that request was denied by Patricia Thomas, Chief Zoning Inspector. He stated he was pursuing development in accordance with the Code, and he had done everything that he was instructed to do thus far.

Supervisor Bronson stated that the applicant did not meet with all effected neighbors to resolve their issues and, if she were to make a motion on the request this date, her motion would be to deny. The neighbors have issues related to the CC&R's and other concerns so she was going to continue this item for 60 days during which time she suggested the applicant meet with the neighbors to resolve their issues and concerns.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Chairman Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to continue this item to the Board of Supervisors' Meeting of November 4, 2008, to allow the applicant time to meet with the neighbors and address and resolve their concerns.

26. **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT**

P21-08-020, MOORE – N. BLANCO WASH TR.

Carol Moore, represented by Terry Borrer, on property located at 6755 N. Blanco Wash Tr., in the RH zone, requests a Conditional Use Permit for a water pumping and distribution station. Chapter 18.97, in accordance with Sections 18.13.030B28 of the Pima County Zoning Code, allows a water pumping and distribution station as a Type II Conditional Use in the RH zone. The Hearing Administrator recommends APPROVAL WITH STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS. (District 3)

"Should the Board of Supervisors agree with the Hearing Administrator's recommendation for approval, it is suggested that this approval be granted subject only to the following standard conditions:

Standard Conditions (per the Pima County Zoning Code)

1. Shall meet the RH zone requirements for accessory buildings.
2. Shall provide a wall or hedge to screen the site.

3. Where a tower more than twenty feet in height is used in conjunction with the facility, its center shall be located a distance from any lot line equal to not less than one-half of its height.”

The Chairman inquired whether anyone wished to be heard. No one appeared.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Chairman Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to close the public hearing and approve P21-08-020 subject to standard and special conditions as recommended by the Hearing Administrator.

27. **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: APPEAL OF HEARING ADMINISTRATOR’S DECISION**

P21-08-026, PC ROW – 1301 E. ORANGE GROVE RD.

In accordance with Pima County Zoning Code Section 18.97.030F(6), Ernest and Marsha Cohen appeal the decision of the Hearing Administrator in Case No. P21-08-026, to allow a Type I Conditional Use Permit for an antenna co-location and equipment area in the right-of-way at 1301 E. Orange Grove Rd. in the CR-1 zone. Chapter 18.97, in accordance with Sections 18.07.030H(2)d.4 of the Pima County Zoning Code, allows an antenna co-location and equipment area as a Type I Conditional Use in the CR-1 zone. The Hearing Administrator recommends APPROVAL. (District 1)

Jim Portner, Hearing Administrator, stated this was an appeal of a Type I Conditional Use Permit approved by the Hearing Administrator. The proposed antenna site is an existing 45 foot tall telephone pole structure that is part of a string of telephone poles in the area. The site is adjacent to the Orange Grove right-of-way, Pima County fee property. New panels are proposed to be added to the existing pole that are approximately 24 inches tall, about six inches wide together with an on-the-ground cabinet. The Hearing Administrator approved the request subject to standard and special conditions that included the condition that there would be no other alterations in terms of the size or height of the existing pole structure.

The following speaker addressed the Board:

1. Ernest Cohen

He provided the following comments:

- A. There was opposition to the Conditional Use Permit because NextG Network, the applicant, did not disclose that there would be a series of antenna co-locations within the subdivision;
- B. It was believed that significant trenching would occur through washes and private property to achieve the antenna co-locations that would be detrimental to the environment;
- C. All pertinent information was not disclosed at the public hearing so it was requested this item be continued for 60 days to allow time for effected

residents of Santa Catalina Estates to meet with the applicant to resolve their concerns and issues.

Joe Milone, representing the applicant, provided a brief overview regarding the process the company had undertaken over the past year in working with Pima County to comply with the requirements in order to gain approval of the request. He said trenching would be conducted but it would be a total of five linear feet going from the utility pole to the proposed equipment location, there would be minimal disruption and minimal trenching associated with the project. He stated continuing the item would prevent his company from providing the mandated services required by their customer.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Day, seconded by Chairman Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to continue this item to the Board of Supervisors' Meeting of October 14, 2008, in order to allow time for the applicant to meet with the neighbors to address and resolve their concerns.

Supervisor Bronson requested information regarding whether these antenna co-locations were really necessary gap coverage and what constituted a serious coverage gap.

Mr. Milone asked whether this item could be brought back before October 14, 2008, because he felt they could meet with the neighbors before October 14, 2008, to address their concerns. Chairman Elías stated the vote was taken and this item was continued to October 14, 2008.

28. **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: PLAT NOTE MODIFICATION**

P1299-138, SAN JOAQUIN RANCH ESTATES, PLAT BK. 54, PG. 57, PLAT NOTE MODIFICATION FOR LOT 32

Request of Thomas and Liliana Stevens for a plat note modification to allow the exchange of 2,040 square feet of designated natural open space, which has been disturbed, with 3,060 square feet of new revegetated natural open space on another area of Lot 32. The property is 41,011 square feet, zoned GR-1 (Rural Residence) and is located approximately 2,000 feet east of the intersection of Agave Ranch Drive and San Joaquin Road on the north side of Citrus Ranch Place. Staff recommends APPROVAL WITH STANDARD AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS. (District 3)

"Should the Board decide to approve this request, staff recommends the following Permitting Notes to be added to the Mitigation Plan:

1. Environmental Planning Condition:
The Mitigation Plan shall be submitted for approval by County staff within 90 days of approval of the modification, shall be scanned into the Department's electronic P1299-138 subdivision files as an addendum to the originally approved Native Plant Protection Plan and Landscape Plans, and shall have the following changes made to the Plan:
 - A. All vegetation for mitigation shall be planted from nursery containers – creosote bush (23), whitethorn acacia (2) and velvet mesquite (1) shall be from nursery containers that are 5-gallon in size or larger; triangle-leaf bursage (92) and barrel cactus (4) may be planted from 1-gallon nursery containers.

- B. All vegetation shall be planted into basins (not less than 36" diameter x 6" deep); basins shall be supplemented with an organic mulch; all vegetation shall be caged with poultry netting (not less than 24" high) until established.
- C. A temporary drip irrigation system shall be provided to all nursery plants.
- D. Reference to seeding may be removed from the plan."

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Chairman Elías, to close the public hearing and approve P1299-138 subject to standard and special conditions. No vote was taken at this time.

Supervisor Bronson stated the applicant had undergone an onerous process which indicated the possibility of needed changes to the County's interface and interaction with County residents. Fines were imposed for zoning enforcement issues against Mr. Stevens so she requested that staff be directed to determine whether the fines could be reduced or forgiven.

Thomas Stevens, applicant, stated he was available to answer questions.

Upon the vote being taken, the motion carried by a 4-0 vote, Supervisor Carroll not present for the vote.

29. DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: REZONING ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 2008- 84, Co9-06-07, Harvest Properties, Inc. – Limberlost Road Rezoning. Owner: Fidelity National Trust 60357. (District 4)

The Chairman inquired whether anyone wished to be heard. No one appeared.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Bronson, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to close the public hearing and adopt Ordinance No. 2008- 84.

30. DEVELOPMENT SERVICES: REZONING RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION NO. 2008- 245, Co9-94-56, Marchesano – Ajo/Gila Bend Highway Rezoning. Owner: Casa de Jose, L.L.C. (District 3)

The Chairman inquired whether anyone wished to be heard. No one appeared.

Staff requests direction regarding a proposal from Tucson Stampede Hockey Club and Tucson Figure Skating regarding a management agreement for the design, construction and operation of an ice rink on County-owned land.

They provided the following comments:

- A. Those involved in ice activities were not asking for tax dollars to pay for an ice rink, but they requested the use or lease of public land that would allow a private builder to come in and construct an ice rink;
- B. The County would receive revenue from the lease of the land and community businesses would benefit from out-of-town attendees to various ice related activities and tournaments;
- C. Several ice rink developers/owners/operators have expressed interest in the project who have funds available and the necessary knowledge to build and operate the ice rink;

- D. Some families involved in ice sports have moved to Phoenix due to the unavailability of a local ice skating facility;
- E. There are many organizations that would benefit from a local ice rink that included figure skating organizations, youth and adult hockey leagues;
- F. Some people travel to Phoenix just to have time on the ice due to the lack of a local ice rink;
- G. The Tucson Convention Center has limited practice times for various ice activities and having an iced rink is not a priority;
- H. A former four-time National Champion and Olympic competitor has expressed interested in locating to Tucson only if there was an ice rink available; and,
- I. When an ice rink was available locally, there was outreach to youth at-risk.

Chuck Huckelberry, County Administrator, stated this issue was presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission who then forwarded the request to the Board. The next steps would be to develop an RFP to invite proposals, an evaluation of the scope of proposed improvements, and to determine public benefits that would be derived with the construction of an ice rink.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to direct staff to move forward to identify a site for an ice rink, develop an RFP and evaluate the scope and public benefits for the construction of an ice rink.

Jim Barry, Chairman of the Joint City/County Water and Wastewater Study Oversight Committee, requested an extension for both phases because this work was necessary when talks move to a regional basis. He stated this request would be forwarded to the County Administrator then brought to the Board.

Supervisor Day stated all jurisdictions and small water companies needed to be involved in this process. She asked whether this could be done while the committee continued to do their work and what progress was made in getting them involved.

Mr. Barry stated the committee has been asked to allow more individuals into the process. The committee responded that this committee and membership was defined by the Board of Supervisors' and the Mayor and Council so if more committee members were required, the Board and Mayor and Council would need to revise membership requirements. The committee felt it was best to obtain a common set of facts for the City and the County to serve as a baseline for the type of conversations that would take place on a regional basis. If the present committee tried to accommodate additional members at this time, the process would be diluted without the kind of progress that needs to come about. The committee was attempting to develop an outreach plan to invite other jurisdictions to submit their information similar to the committee. The Ray and Vail Water Companies submitted their interest in participation with an indication from SAWAA that they may want to do something jointly.

41. **CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

The Chairman inquired whether anyone wished to be heard.

The following speakers addressed the Board:

Diana Lancaster spoke about unmet mitigation measures for the past eight years from the RTA/La Canada North Improvement from Ina to La Canada.

David M. Davis opposed the decision to use 8-year-old data in relation to noise mitigation from the RTA/La Canada North Improvement.

Steve Hildebrand spoke about the lack of school crossings and lack of plans for them for all the public schools in the RTA/La Canada North Improvement area.

Yvette Gonzalez spoke about being fired from the Public Defender's Office without explanation.

Susan McMahon stated that the RTA/La Canada North Improvement is in a rural residential area that does not need a high-speed, four-lane highway.

Michael Toney spoke about revenue bonds.

Elizabeth Webb requested bus service between Rita Ranch and downtown Tucson, thanked the Board for the zoning process in relation to dealing with the La Cienaga issue, and stated that the ballot intake machine was broken when she voted recently.

42. **RECESS**

The Board of Supervisors' meeting was recessed to September 12, 2008, at 9:00 a.m.

43. **RECONVENE**

The Board of Supervisors' meeting reconvened on September 12, 2008, at 9:00 a.m. All members were present.

44. **DIVISION OF ELECTIONS**

Pursuant to A.R.S. §16-642, canvass of the September 2, 2008, Primary Election.

The following speakers addressed the Board:

They provided the following comments:

- A. Concerns and questions arose regarding early ballot scanning, the number of hand counted precinct audits and the lack of documentation for anomalies such as missing, broken security seals or mismatched paperwork in ballot bags;
- B. Three suggestions were proffered that included (1) a delay of the canvass until a proper hand count audit could be conducted; (2) sort early ballots by precinct and audit the same randomly selected precincts for precinct cast ballots; and, (3) audit contested Board of Supervisors' races to demonstrate that all votes in Pima County are honestly counted;
- C. There were multiple mistakes by the poll workers, observers and the employees of the Elections Division;
- D. The Inspection and Receiving Boards were not operating in accordance with the procedures outlined in the Secretary of State's election manual;
- E. No proof was submitted that any of the problems, discrepancies or anomalies had anything to with the election results;
- F. In failing to show if these problems had an influence on the election results, the Board does not have the authority to delay the will of the voters in certifying the canvass;
- G. It would be intolerable if the canvass was certified and there were investigations and lawsuits;
- H. It was felt that the DRE's should be retired because they are subject to flaws, unscrupulous activity and the elections workers are burdened with the task of starting them up and turning them off when no one uses them;
- I. Concerns were expressed regarding the chain of custody of the ballot bags and the integrity of the balloting;
- J. A suggestion was made that the poll workers should have a check list to ensure proper handling of the ballots, ballot bags, paperwork and seals;
- K. The Elections Director did not document the discrepancies nor what the discrepancies were and the one individual who tried to obtain that information was arrested;

- L. There was sloppiness in the handling of the ballot bags, paperwork and seals due to what was felt to be inadequate poll worker training, the lack of checklists and inefficient procedures;
- M. A request was made to postpone approval of the canvass to Wednesday, September 17, 2008, to ensure the accuracy of the results;
- N. It was the responsibility of the Board of Supervisors' and the political parties to ensure there was no shadow hanging over the election results;
- O. Concerns were expressed regarding the upcoming Presidential Election due to the discrepancies, anomalies and the handling of ballots in the Primary Election; and,
- P. There was concern regarding the separation between observing and giving instructions to audit board members which was not allowed and it was for that reason that attention was called to the actions of Mr. Brakey.

Chairman Elías stated the Board of Supervisors' would be committing a misdemeanor if the canvass was not approved 10 days after the election and it was not a question of if it was a requirement pursuant to A.R.S. §16-45B.

On consideration, it was moved by Chairman Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez, to approve the canvass of the September 2, 2008, Primary Election, and to direct the Elections Integrity Committee to conduct an investigation into the arrest of John Brakey and the conduct of Brad Nelson, Elections Director. In addition, to direct the Elections Integrity Committee to investigate why the seals on the ballot bags were not properly handled and to provide a report regarding what mistakes were made during this election process by the poll workers and provide recommendations regarding how those same problems can be prevented in the General Election. No vote was taken at this time.

Supervisor Bronson stated questions were raised by the speakers, and she would like direction to be provided to the County Administrator or appropriate department to respond to those questions and to make the response a matter of public record.

Chairman Elías, as the maker of the motion, and Supervisor Valadez as the second, accepted the amendment.

Supervisor Day asked what was the status of the Elections Integrity Committee.

Chuck Huckelberry, County Administrator, stated appointments were made by himself and four members of the Board of Supervisors'. He stated he would provide the report and answers to questions raised by the public and recommendations from the Elections Integrity Committee. In addition, he referenced that additional training should be undertaken regarding the seals and the return of machines as stated in his memorandum dated September 2, 2008.

Supervisor Bronson asked whether the Elections Integrity Committee could also respond to assertions made at a press conference that the ballots could have been counted faster than what occurred.

Chairman Elías, as the maker of the motion, and Supervisor Valadez as the second accepted the amendment.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Carroll to continue the canvass to the Board of Supervisors' Meeting of September 16, 2008, due to the unanswered questions that were posed by the public speakers. The motion died for the lack of a second.

Supervisor Carroll stated he wanted to continue the canvass due to the irregularities that were identified and the arrest of a poll worker because that hurts the image of a clean election process in Pima County. He wanted all questions answered as a way to help restore the confidence of the voters.

Upon a roll call vote being taken, the motion as amended, carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Carroll voting "Nay."

45. **ADJOURNMENT**

As there was no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:51 a.m.






