Regulatory Updates

Technical Policy 27 – Private Driveways

Eric Shepp stated that Suzanne Shields, director of the Regional Flood Control District, approved Technical Policy 27. The committee reviewed the policy again and, with exception of staff verifying the axle load of 75,000 pounds, the committee unanimously supported the approval of the policy.

Technical Policy 25 – Sand and Gravel and Other Excavation Operations

Eric Shepp distributed Mike Zeller's comments and Keith Brann's comments for discussion (attached). Mr. Shepp stated that he will incorporate their comments into the policy. Mr. Shepp stated that he is expecting comments from the Arizona Rock Products Association next week and will incorporate their comments as well. He will distribute another draft illustrating where the changes are made to the committee for review and comment at next month's meeting.

REPORT FROM FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT STAFF

Suzanne Shields stated that Pima County received news that the work plan has been released from Washington and there is an additional \$3.2 million in it for the construction of Arroyo Chico.

Ms. Shields also stated that the revised Riparian Habitat Mitigation Guidelines are expected to go to the Pima County Board of Supervisors for approval in July. She will have staff give a PowerPoint presentation to the committee at next month's meeting.
