

**Tucson Drainage Area Project-Arroyo Chico/ Tucson Arroyo  
Segment IIB- Park Avenue Basins, Upstream Channel Improvements, and High  
School Wash**

**Neighborhood Informational Sheet**

*October 28, 2010*

Hunter Contracting and the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) biologist continue to work on verifying and identifying existing trees that can be salvaged. Tree salvaging operations will begin when the ACOE biologist has approved the final selection of salvageable trees, which is expected this week. Salvaged trees will be stored at 211 S. Fremont next to the building owned by the Pima County Regional Flood Control District (RFCD). A construction perimeter fence is to be installed this week, and clearing operations will begin after tree salvaging operations have been completed. The contractor is responsible for controlling dust, and will be continuously watering the site during clearing and excavation operations. If you have any concerns about blowing dust from the project site please contact Nanette Reynolds at 740-6542. She will work through appropriate channels to respond to your concerns.

Work on the Highland Avenue detour from Manlove Street to 14<sup>th</sup> Street is scheduled to begin November 1<sup>st</sup>, with traffic being moved to the detour November 10<sup>th</sup>. The detour will be in place until the new concrete arch culvert, and the repaving of Highland Avenue are completed probably in January 2011.

Excavation for Basin 3 (between Highland Avenue and Cherry Avenue) is currently scheduled to begin on November 11<sup>th</sup> and should be complete in late December. Construction traffic will exit from Basin 3 onto 15<sup>th</sup> Street at Cherry Avenue, using the light at Winsett Street and Kino Blvd., head south to 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and then onto I-10. The material being excavated from Basins 3 will be utilized on a Pima County project to establish new building pads for the planned expansion and upgrades for the Roger Road Wastewater Treatment Plant.

A call for artists was issued by the Tucson-Pima County Art Council (TPAC) on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. The notice calls for up to 3 potential artist, and will follow the established procedures and policies of TPAC for the selection of artist and the establishment of public art.
