All other specifications, terms and conditions remain the same.

Attachment A - Detailed Specifications/Specification Check-List

Detailed Specifications:

1. Equipment shall be manufacturer’s current model in production at time of delivery.
2. Equipment shall be new and unused. (Demonstrator models shall not be acceptable).
3. Contractors must be an authorized dealer/reseller for at least three (3) years for the manufacturer of equipment being proposed to Pima County. **Manufacturer may bid directly to County.** Upon request by Pima County contractor must provide proof of this authorization within two (2) days of initial request.
4. Successful contractor will fully train Pima County personnel on the operation, maintenance, and any other technical information regarding use of the machine (i.e. process for different types of dirt and/or asphalt, etc.)
5. If repairs (warranty and non-warranty) cannot be handled by Pima County personnel a local factory authorized maintenance facility within the Tucson area (service hours shall be from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, will provide parts and the repairs. The successful contractor shall be responsible for all parts and repairs needed within the warranty period.
6. The warranty period shall be a minimum of one (1) year for both parts and labor. Warranty repair and/or replacement will be performed at no additional charge to Pima County
7. Contractor **shall include with response** a statement outlining what “green” programs, if any, have been implemented that may include, but not limited to: Recycling of paper, glass and cans; efforts to conserve energy on offices and work areas; utilization of alternative fuels for vehicles and production equipment.

The following documents shall be provided to Pima County upon delivery of the asphalt attachment:

1. Warranty Document.
2. Manufacturer’s unaltered invoice
3. Invoice specifying the purchase order number and the serial number of the equipment.
4. A total of 3 keys shall be included and delivered with equipment.
5. Successful bidder(s) receiving award shall provide 2 each CD’s or thumb drives for the following (a-d):
 - a. Maintenance-Overhaul (shop) manuals*
 - b. Operator’s and Service manuals*
 - c. Wiring Diagrams*
 - d. Manuals for auxiliary equipment*

*Successful bidder may also provide a web site to enable Pima County to acquire information directly as long as there is no subscription to join or a fee to pay to get this information.

The Asphalt Reclaimer Attachment for Loaders will be used for repairing failed road shoulders and pavements by reclaiming existing materials.

Specification/Check-List:

Failure to not respond to the items below may be cause for rejection as non-responsive. Contractor shall fill in the following based on the equipment you are offering to Pima County per this solicitation. If your response is “No” to a specification(s) you must supply a detailed explanation for each deviation/“or equivalent” (separate sheet) of what you are bidding and how it will impact the end performance of the attachment. All “or equivalent” offers must meet or exceed the specifications listed below.

Specifications are those of an Asphalt Zipper, Model AZ-600B “or equivalent”.

A 6-foot wide asphalt reclaimer attachment that is self-powered with a minimum 203 hp, 3-tier Cummins engine with approximately 695 foot pounds of torque. Approximate cutting speed of 6000* (sq. ft. per hour) with a maximum cutter depth (with standard cutting head (72”) for normal asphalt) of at least 12”. Staff must have easy access to cutting teeth that are carbide tipped and are replaceable. Asphalt Reclaimer attachment must mount to the loader with an easy connect type system to allow Pima County to use this attachment on any 3 yd. loader without having to remove the bucket. The asphalt reclaimer attachment must not restrict the view of the loader operator for safety reasons. There should be a hydraulic depth control and bucket clamps.

The option of a water system is required. A 300 gallon water system (minimum) must be included with all associated hardware (tank, pump, hose, attaching hardware, etc.) so it can be attached to the loader. The water system will help save the bits and aid in compaction.

* speed will depend on asphalt thickness, temperature, age, etc.
