NIGHT WORK - ROADWAY STRIPING INTERSECTION OF INA ROAD AND ORACLE ROAD

Pima County, Ariz. (Oct. 18) – The Pima County Department of Transportation, the Regional Transportation Authority, and their contractor, KE&G, continue work on the Ina Road and Oracle Road Intersection Improvement Project. The following activity has been scheduled:

ROADWAY STRIPING - NIGHT WORK - Sunday, October 20, through Tuesday, October 22, 2013

The contractor will be placing the final striping on the Ina Road and Oracle Road intersection. During this work there will be various traffic control changes and restrictions. Deputies from the Pima County Sheriff's Department will be on hand to direct traffic through the project area. Work each night will be done between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

All businesses will remain accessible during construction.

The Pima County Department of Transportation reminds motorists to obey traffic control signs and speed limits through the construction zone. In the event of mechanical failure or inclement weather, the schedule is subject to change.
