1. Call to Order

2. Adoption of the Minutes

- Adoption of the February 18, 2016 Meeting Minutes

Ms. Schwerin said her discussion on page five of the draft minutes was recorded inaccurately in that it states: "However, Ms. Schwerin's point was dogs which should be declared dangerous..." when it should reflect it was former Mayor Miller's point she was bringing up. Ms. Schwerin chose to edit the text verbally in lieu of providing a written edit as requested by Mr. Neuman.

The motion was made and seconded (Smith/Emptage) that the February 18, 2016 meeting minutes be adopted with the aforementioned edit. The motion carried (6-0).

3. Animal Care Center Budget Discussion

Ms. Flanagan introduced Garrett Hancock, Health Department Business Manager, who utilized the attached PowerPoint presentation to explain how budgets are done in Pima County.

In June of 1980 Arizona voters amended the Arizona Constitution prescribing an expenditure limitation for each county, city, town, and community college district. The purpose of the expenditure limitation is to control expenditures and limit future increases in spending to adjustments for inflation; deflation; population growth. There are exceptions for natural or manmade disasters or if approved by two-thirds of the governing board and a majority of the qualified voters. The budget process cycle

begins in October for the fiscal year which begins the following July. Mr. Hancock discussed the budget timeline and in-process adjustments that occur, often due to State cost transfers and insurance cost changes. In May the Board of Supervisors passes a tentative budget, which sets the budget limit, and then the final budget adoption is in June. To come up with the Department's total budget Finance starts with the current adopted budget figure and makes adjustments for any known differences. Anything in excess of the adjusted figure has to be pursued as a supplemental budget request and most of those do not get approved.

PACC's budget is divided into three parts: the PACC special revenue fund (fund 2001), the PACC grants fund (fund 2042), and the PACC bequests fund (fund 2131). Mr. Neuman asked which fund general donations go into. Mr. Hancock said donations go into fund 2001; while a grant from PetSmart goes into fund 2042; and if someone dies and leaves PACC their house it (the money from the house) goes into fund 2131. Spending authority is based on projections. Mr. Neuman asked what happens if the projected revenue amount is exceeded. Money taken in in excess of the expenditure authority goes into an account. Mr. Hancock said it cannot be spent during the current fiscal year because it is not in the budget, but can be budgeted in future years. He gave the example of the bequest money coming in and being included in budgets going forward, but not in the budget year the money was received. Ms. Emptage asked about how general donations are divided out and Mr. Hancock said a portion goes to cover costs attributed to the various municipalities. Once the County puts money into PACC's fund, the County cannot take it back. Dr. Smith asked if surplus funds in PACC's account carried over to another year result in the County reducing the general fund contribution. Mr. Hancock said in theory the County could do so, but has not. He continued that this year is the first year of his three years with the Health Department wherein PACC is not over budget. PACC's overages have been covered by the Health Department's budget in years past. Ms. Barrick said that the Committee has trouble accepting that donations are being rolled into PACC's budget to cover operations instead of for the animals specifically. Ms. Hubbard asked if money given for a specific purpose, such as spay and neuter, actually goes for that purpose. Mr. Hancock said it does. He continued that the County's financial management system tracks all the money and has stops within the system to prevent spending beyond authorized thresholds for specific master agreements (contracts) and commodities. Ms. Schwerin asked, "Let's say I donate \$500 and I earmark it for spaying and neutering, and you said it would be spent for spaying and neutering; but the big question is will it be spent for \$500 more spaying and neutering than would have been done had I not given that money?" Ms. Flanagan responded that it would be above and beyond. Ms. Schwerin asked why people should give donations for things PACC is already doing. Mr. Hancock said because PACC is traditionally over budget and could not do all the things they want to do without the donations. Mr. Neuman said there is a pie of money which comes into the County; asserted that the community wants PACC to have a larger portion of the pie; and continued that donations should not be considered part of the pie. Mr. Hancock said he, PACC and the Health Department administration all agree PACC needs more money. He went on to relay that prior to PACC's tent going up the Board of Supervisors granted an extremely rare mid-year adjustment to cover the additional costs associated with erecting the tent, but PACC still went over budget due to the additional operating cost associated with housing the additional animals in the tent.

PACC's fiscal year 2015/2016, current, budget is \$8.8 million with projected revenues of just under \$6.5 million. The difference is made up by the general fund subsidy. Next year's budget is over \$9.175 million. Dr. Smith asked if the revenues include donations; Mr. Hancock said they include anticipated donations based on trends, but would not include a bequest. In response to a question Mr. Hancock explained grants have reporting requirements and audits.

4. Welfare and Dangerous Dog Cases from January and Recent Animal Care Center Holds Snapshot

Ms. Schwerin referred to welfare case one and said the officer recommended the owner get kennel runs for outside and crates for inside. She asserted that kennel runs are bad enough and crates are even worse. She said crates are cruel and she wished officers would not recommend crates.

Regarding the third case, Ms. Schwerin asked why the case is closed if the dog is not licensed. Supervisor Neil Konst said the situation is now in Justice Court's hands. Ms. Emptage pointed out that at the last meeting the Committee recommended owners be required to license their dogs within 30 days of a no-license citation. Ms. Flanagan said the Committee's recommendation has been forwarded to the County Attorney's Office. Supervisor Konst added the owner may have given the dog away and would therefore no longer needs to license it.

Ms. Schwerin said case four had dogs without water and the owner was allowed to redeem one of the dogs without it being neutered and she asked why the dog wasn't neutered. Supervisor Konst said all five dogs were given up to PACC, four were confiscated and the fifth was brought in.

Ms. Schwerin said case five was very bad. She said a dog was on a tie-out without water or shelter, which indicates a very bad owner. The owner received citations and the dog was eventually returned to the owner and the question was asked why. Supervisor Konst replied the report had nothing about the dog being in distress or bad shape. There has not been a follow-up visit.

Ms. Schwerin said case seven included a badly injured dog and the owner surrendered the dogs, but she added the owner should not be allowed to own animals. Supervisor Konst reported two of the dogs were euthanized and one died; he added the owner is on the do-not-adopt list. Ms. Emptage asked if the list is shared with other agencies and Konst replied it is not. Ms. Emptage requested that topic be an agenda item going forward.

5. Call to the Audience

There were no speakers from the audience.

6. Management Report

Ms. Flanagan reported on two topics.

- Accreditation Site Visit

The Department is going through the accreditation process and had a site visit last week and it went well. There were a number of positives noted by the accreditation body: dedication and passion, high function, good leadership, good work with community partners, and good relationship with governance. Areas for improvement mentioned were: there were a couple ADA accommodations on the second floor they wanted addressed, having a data analysis person who can make reports to help operational efficiencies, and having a data analysis system. The Department should hear back on the accreditation in April or May.

- Pima County Animal Care Advisory Committee Ordinance Change

The ordinance went to the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday. Ms. Flanagan said that the Board made some minor changes. They added that the Committee will include a member from the Board of Health. The terms of the current Committee members will end at the end of June this year, as opposed to the phase out originally proposed. And the County Administrator appointed staff position will be a non-voting position.

Ms. Schwerin commented that four individuals, including her, will have their terms expire earlier than originally proposed, originally the end of June 2018. She attributed this change to comments by Mr. Neuman at the Board of Supervisors meeting.

## 7. Old Business

- Shortening Lengthy Animal Holds

Ms. Flanagan said [Deputy County Attorney] Paula [Perrera] is on her final revision of language aimed at reducing these holds, but it was not done in time for the meeting, so Ms. Flanagan will bring the language to the next meeting for the Committee's review, then to the Board of Health, then to the Board of Supervisors.

## 8. New Business

- Introduction of New Volunteer Coordinator

Ms. Flanagan introduced the New Volunteer Coordinator Gina Hansen. Ms. Hansen came to PACC from the Humane Society. She briefly listed programs she ran at the Humane Society and expressed her desire to bring new programs to PACC, bring in more volunteers and do anything to help the animals.

- Pima Animal Care Center Enforcement Officer Numbers

Mr. Neuman said he was moving this item to next month's agenda, but requested information from staff regarding how the enforcement officer numbers compare to numbers from the 60s and 70s and how numbers compare to the community population numbers. PACC Operations Manager Jose Ocano said there are two final candidates for the enforcement manager position; and he is presently looking at how enforcement operations are handled and how they can be made more efficient.

## 9. Donations: A total of \$24,655.02 in donations was received during the month of February.

Ms. Flanagan commented that donations not specified for a particular purpose are used to offset medical costs; and that donations have to be projected as revenue to be budgeted in to be able to be used.

## 10. Complaints and Commendations: There were no complaints and no commendations received by staff during February.

There was no discussion on this agenda item.

11. Call to the Audience

There were no speakers from the audience.

12. Announcements, Schedules and Proposed Agenda Items

Mr. Neuman said a number of volunteers have complained about adoption criteria and wants this to be an agenda item for the next meeting.

Ms. Emptage said she is still working on compiling applicable animal care statutes and will eventually be able to present it to the Committee.

Dr. Smith suggested paper conservation be considered at some point going forward.

13. Next Meeting – April 21, 2016

The next meeting will be at the Abrams building.

14. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 7:06 pm.

1. Call to Order

Mr. Neuman called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm; Ms. Emptage was delayed.

2. Adoption of the Minutes

- Adoption of the January 21, 2016 Meeting Minutes

The motion was made and seconded (Hubbard/Smith) that the January 21, 2016 meeting minutes be adopted as written. The motion carried (7-0). (Mr. Marshall and Ms. Emptage arrived after the vote on the minutes.)

3. Recent Animal Care Center Holds Snapshot

There was no discussion on this item.

4. Call to the Audience

There were no speakers at this call to the audience.

5. Management Report

Ms. Flanagan reported on four topics.

- Budget

Ms. Flanagan provided a handout on the Pima Animal Care Center (PACC) budget (included in the record). The handout showed personnel, operations and total budget, as well as revenue figures, including total budget, actual year to date figures, and straight line year to date projections. Personnel expenditures are slightly above projections; however, they are better than in years past. Operations expenditures are lower than the straight line projections; however, the summer months are normally busier. Year to date revenue well exceeds the projection. Ms. Flanagan asked for input on the information presented. The comments were positive. Additionally, there was some discussion on monthly budgets and adjusted predictions versus straight line predictions due to fluctuations and the seasonal nature of animal care.

Mr. Neuman referred to previous budget discussions and asked if Health Department Director García would be coming to a future meeting to talk about the budget. Ms. Flanagan said the Department's Business Manager, Garrett Hancock, is more closely involved with the budget and she could request he come to the next meeting. Mr. Neuman requested a budget discussion be on the next agenda with Mr. Hancock participating in the meeting.

Mr. Jacobs asked about the statistical reports the Committee had been receiving in the past. Ms. Flanagan explained no one could identify and duplicate how those reports were generated. Therefore she has tasked PACC's Chameleon (electronic animal management system) expert to generate new reports to ensure the numbers are accurate. She said different individuals using different methods have come up with different numbers in the past, so staff wants to ensure the data is authentic. There was concern voiced about being able to compare new data with old data to show trends. Ms. Flanagan said there has been considerable discussion on what should be counted and she felt confident historical data can be produced from the Chameleon system for comparison purposes.

- Personnel Updates

PACC is in the process of recruiting a Pet Support Coordinator and a new Enforcement Operations Manager. Both positions have garnered strong interest nationally. The new Volunteer Coordinator starts Monday and is to be introduced at the next meeting. Ms. Hubbard said positive things about the new coordinator who is being hired away from her organization.

- PACC Satellite Site

The Health Department recently combined two previously separate clinics into one facility and as a result can repurpose the old Walter Rogers clinic facility located at 175 West Irvington. By the end of May the Department expects to start weekend micro-chipping, vaccine and spay neuter clinics, as well as special events at this location. Also a County charter school will occupy a large portion of the building and one of the Department's WIC (women, infants and children nutrition program) offices will be moved there. Discussion brought out that the location already has clinical space which is highly suitable for the aforementioned clinics. Ms. Flanagan suggested the Committee could hold a meeting at the satellite location.

- Current Events

Ms. Flanagan reported that activities pursuant to the new animal care center will require the admin trailer, which is where the Committee typically meets, to be moved fairly soon. In light of this, the motion was made and seconded (Emptage/Mendelsohn) that the Committee will meet back at the Abrams building. The motion carried (8-0), Ms. Schwerin abstained.

## 6. Old Business

- Shortening Lengthy Animal Holds

Ms. Flanagan reported that the internal group she talked about at the last meeting has met twice with the County Attorney's Office (PCAO) on this issue. She broke the issue down into two categories: stray holds, and owner bond and appeal holds. Concerning strays some of the jurisdictions have a seven-day hold for licensed pets, while the State requirement is only five days. Staff prefers the five day hold. The thought is to work with the City of Tucson and explain the financial benefit of five days versus the seven. Hopefully once they see the benefit they will change their code to five days and the other jurisdictions will follow. PCAO is already working on updated language for the animal care IGA contracts.

Concerning owner bond and appeal holds Ms. Flanagan reported PCAO said the State Legislature would have to enact changes to impact hold times on appeals to Superior Court. PCAO will be doing research to reduce hold times on holds not appealed to Superior Court. Ms. Flanagan presented to PCAO the Committee's request for a judge to attend a Committee meeting and was told it would be against judicial code of conduct for a judge to do so; it would be inappropriate and PCOA wanted nothing to do with the request. Dr. Smith asked about using fosters for animals on holds. Ms. Flanagan said PACC does use fosters when appropriate, but the situation has to be very safe and well contained because of liabilities associated with animals escaping and/or being aggressive. There are liabilities if a held animal attacks someone. Also PACC would have to pay for the value of an animal if it is lost. Mr. Neuman suggested legitimately purchasing a held dog could be cheaper to the County than a lengthy hold process. Ms. Mendelsohn suggested binding arbitration and Ms. Flanagan said she will research it.

Ms. Schwerin said bonding is for animals in distress or danger. She went on to refer to Tucson City Code, Section 4-11. Procedure to remove and forfeit animals; notice; order to show cause hearing; disclosure; appeal, which states in part:

(j) After a hearing conducted under this section, the magistrate or special limited magistrate shall issue an order that includes written findings of fact and conclusions of law.

She compared that to Section 4-13. Dangerous animals, which states in part:

(9) The hearing officer shall make a written decision within five (5) working days of the hearing and notify the owner of the animal of the decision.

Ms. Schwerin said the County Code has a similar comparison wherein the dangerous dog code is stronger, requiring the five day decision; and suggested code regarding animals in distress should be

amended to require a decision within five working days like in Section 4-13. Ms. Flanagan said when it comes to Superior Court City and County code does not apply, but acknowledged the local codes could be updated to tighten up timeframes for before any appeals to Superior Court. She said she would discuss it with PCAO. Ms. Schwerin asked if there have been many appeals to Superior Court. Supervisor Tenkate said there have been such appeals, but not many and none have won. She said one dangerous dog case took six months. Mr. Jacobs asked about numbers of case completely handled in the lower courts compared to those going to Superior Court. Supervisor Tenkate said very few go up into Superior Court. A quick recollection of animals currently on holds came up with ten or so animals, of which four cases were involved with Superior Court. Supervisor Tenkate indicated the four is atypically high. A rough estimate of less than ten percent going to Superior Court was mentioned. It was stated (Hubbard) that it is not good for any animal, even one, to be confined for a lengthy time period due to court proceedings. However, it was also pointed out (Jacobs) that it is a hard sell to go to the legislature and ask them to go through the time and expense of changing State Law for one dog. Ms. Emptage requested this item be on next month's agenda.

## 7. New Business

- 72-Hour Pet Waste Law

There was no discussion on this item.

- Timeframe to License Dogs

Ms. Emptage referred to discussion at a previous meeting wherein it was stated that judges sometimes give cited individuals months to license unlicensed dogs. The motion was made and seconded (Smith/Mendelsohn) that the Committee recommends owners be required to license their dogs within 30 days of a no-license citation. Supervisor Tenkate gave an example of an owner with numerous dogs given approximately a year and a half to comply with licensing. The motion carried (8-1), Mr. Jacobs voted against.

- Dangerous Dog Form and Point System

Copies of the dangerous dog evaluation form were provided. Supervisor Tenkate said a dangerous dog evaluation can be requested by a bite victim or a dog on dog attack victim; it can be due to frequent aggression, initiated by an officer or initiated by the court. Once a dangerous dog has been determined guilty of a bite or an attempted bite it is declared vicious; and only a judge or magistrate can declare a dog vicious. Dangerous dog evaluations are assigned to an investigator. The investigator does research in Chameleon and does neighborhood interviews. If an owner has lived at a current address less than a year, then the previous address is also researched. Ms. Emptage asked about if a dog bites a burglar and Supervisor Tenkate called that scenario a provoked bite which would not be counted against the dog. She referred to bites in the home as no-violation bites, worth three points on the form; whereas a violation bite is worth six points on the form. Regarding quarantine, she said if a bite does not break the skin the animal is not quarantined. Supervisor Tenkate went over points for severity of injury to humans, citations and severity of injury to animals. She continued that if a person is hospitalized or severely injured, or a domestic animal is killed the attacking dog is automatically declared dangerous. Supervisor Tenkate said investigators are trained with a PowerPoint presentation and by senior investigators. Discussion brought out that the point system was believed to be established by PACC officers many years ago and there are no known

national standards for dangerous dog determination. Supervisor Tenkate said investigators look for tendency, propensity and disposition.

Ms. Schwerin referred to a recently discussed case in which a dog on a leash bit and injured another dog and an officer said the dog in question showed unsafe behavior, but the dog was declared not dangerous. She used that example to say there is something wrong with the point system. She also said that to her it doesn't take repeated bites for a dog to show it has a tendency to bite; one bad bite is enough. She said former Tucson Mayor George Miller was the one who got the dangerous dog law passed. She continued that a law is supposed to mean what the enactor's intended it to mean. She referred to a letter the Mayor Miller wrote saying that the intention of the legislative body regarding the dangerous dog law is not being followed. Ms. Schwerin said Mayor Miller made the point that the innate characteristics of the animal are what make it dangerous, not the wall surrounding the animal. Ms. Schwerin contended that a dog being dangerous has nothing to do with confinement. She added that Mayor Miller said dangerous animals should be spayed or neutered. Supervisor Tenkate confirmed dangerous dogs are spayed or neutered. However, Ms. Schwerin's point was dogs which should be declared dangerous, but are not, and are therefore not automatically spayed or neutered and are able to reproduce. Ms. Emptage asked if staff encourages spaying and neuter to owners of dogs under investigation, to which Supervisor Tenkate said staff are continually educating the public. Ms. Emptage requested a copy of the spay/neuter information provided to the public. Dr. Smith asked what Supervisor Tenkate thought about the score sheet, and she replied that she felt the neighborhood comments should carry more weight.

Discussion included possibly changing the form. Mr. Jacobs suggested any changes go through legal representation. The motion was made and seconded (Mendelsohn/Hubbard) that the Committee requests staff review the dangerous dog form and get back with the Committee to discuss any recommended changes. The motion carried (8-0), Ms. Schwerin abstained.

- Dog License Sticker Suggestion

Ms. Emptage said currently there are many dogs with permanent tags which don't have PACC's current phone number. She suggested that, just as with license plates, the tags could have a sticker. The sticker could show the license is current and have PACC's current phone number. Dr. Smith was concerned about the cost. Dr. Kaluzniacki pointed out that the permanent tag doesn't mean much, in that it doesn't indicate the dog is currently licensed. Ms. Hubbard expressed that she liked it better when there was a new color-coded tag each year as opposed to the current permanent tag. The motion was made and seconded (Kaluzniacki/Mendelsohn) recommending staff investigate either new tags every year or a sticker for the permanent tag. The motion carried (9-0).

8. Donations: A total of \$54,671.88 in donations was received during the month of January.

There was no discussion on this agenda item.

9. Complaints and Commendations: There were no complaints and no commendations received by staff during January.

There was no discussion on this agenda item.

10. Call to the Audience

There was one speaker from the audience, Marcie Velen. Ms. Velen said No-Kill Pima County has been collecting raw data from PACC since 2012 and she reviews the data. She said the data indicates consistent improvements in many areas, and gave the example of adoptions recently going up to 61 percent compared to 55 percent for the prior six month period. She said the data has never matched. She referred to a modified rate which she said does not include owner requests for euthanasia. Foster care has been a nightmare for her statistically; if fosters are not taken into consideration, then those animals can be double counted, which influences the live release rate. Ms. Velen referred to the discussion on reducing the standard seven-day hold for licensed animals to five days, which she said she has no problem with. She continued that someone has proposed changing the three-day hold for strays down to two days, which she is not in favor of.

11. Announcements, Schedules and Proposed Agenda Items

Ms. Emptage said in light of the potential for the Committee to be restructured in the near future she is compiling an electronic list of relevant animal statutes as a reference tool.

12. Next Meeting – March 17, 2016

As established during the Management Report, Current Events, the next meeting will be at the Abrams building.

The meeting adjourned at 7:22 pm







had access to shade/shelter and potable water. I photographed the dogs and  
then returned to the residence and knocked on the door. I was met by the dog  
owner, I stated my name and the reason for my visit  
and asked first if he had seen a small white dog that was possibly injured. He  
told me that he had not seen the dog in question. He did tell me that he owned  
a small black Terrier mix named Spike and the two dogs on chains. I observed  
that Spike appeared to be in good health and did not appear to have any  
injuries. He told me that the female Pit Bull, Missy belonged to a friend who is  
in jail and admitted that he has had care and custody of Missy for longer than  
30 days.**

**I asked why the two dogs were chained on tie-outs. He  
explained that the recent rains caused problems with his fenced area. He also  
told me that his female Pit Bull was in heat and the other Pit Bull is her  
brother. He stated that because they are closely related he does not want  
them to breed and felt he had no choice but to chain them up to keep them  
apart. I explained the laws regarding tie-outs and asked him to remove both  
dogs from the chains and place them indoors and he complied.**

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I next requested to see proof of current rabies vaccination and licenses for his three dogs. [redacted] was not able to supply me with proof of either current rabies vaccination or licenses. At that point I issued citations for three counts of No License, and two counts of Neglect-Tie out. [redacted] acknowledged, signed, and accepted his citations. I returned his ID to him and provided him with his court date, time, and location. I also supplied him with a copy of the Pima County dog laws and a 'pet-fix' flier to obtain low cost spay/neuter services for his three dogs. I thanked him for his time and cooperation and left the area.

On January 19th 2016 at approximately 1616 hrs. I, Officer Baugus 1918 arrived at reference to multiple leash law complaints. Upon arrival, I observed five dogs in the yard. I observed is field fencing along the East side of the property and a heavy metal gate with fencing to prevent the dogs escape, however, four of the five dogs slipped under the gate and met me in the road. I honked and received no response from the home. I put the three young dogs in my truck and entered the yard through the unlocked gate. I knocked on the door and received no answer.

Next to the house were two metal pots, the adult Pit Bull was licking the bottom of one of the pots which has maybe 1/4 inch of water in the bottom. I photographed the empty pots and had to tilt the one pot to show the amount of water on the bottom of the pot. The two adult dogs were thirsty and continued to lick the bottom of the pot. The puppies could not reach the bottom of the pot to lick the bottom of the pot before I tried to fill it. I turned on the faucet to provide the dogs with water. The water slowly stopped as the pipes emptied. The water to the property was turned off.

The two adult dogs ran to the north end of the property chasing a rabbit and slipped through a second gate that had the fencing removed and ran across the road. Eventually, the blue Pit Bull was captured, but the adult black dog was skittish and would not approach me. I was unable to capture the fifth dog on the property. I fed and watered the remaining dog and posted a notice advising of the impound as well as the need to provide water for the dogs at all times and the lack of confinement.

There are previous complaints about these dogs not being confined that go back to August 2015. Another Officer also posted a leash law notice on September 4th 2015 (A15-177418). The dog owner has been made aware of the need to keep the dogs confined to the property.

The dog owner called Pima Animal Care Center an hour after I left the property inquiring about her dogs. stated she would come into the center to redeem the adult Pit Bull but would sign over ownership for the puppies.

On January 20th 2016 the dog owner came into Pima Animal Care Center and met with Supervisor N. Konst #2002 who obtained her Arizona driver license and issued Neglect-No Water and Leash Law citations on all five dogs on my behalf. signed the citations and received her copies. She was advised of the date, time and location of her court appearance.

On January 21st 2016 she again returned to Pima Animal Care Center bringing in the fifth dog and relinquished ownership for the adult dogs as well, stating that the dogs dig out of her yard and she can't afford to license them.

This complaint is now closed.





**01/24/16 18:18 hours I, Investigator Foster #2042 arrived at and as I walked up the driveway the dog owner opened the door. I stated my name and the reason for my visit and asked her if she knew why I was there and she stated yes it was because her dogs were fighting. I asked her if I could see the dogs and she walked me into the backyard.**

**As I entered the yard I was met at the gate by a black and white Pit Bull type mixed breed dog that I initially believed was 3 or 4 months of age. I later checked his teeth and found he was closer to 8 or 9 months. The owner stated that the puppy was called Zeus and that she had owned him for two or more months. She explained that her other two dogs are sisters and that one or both are in heat and they began to fight today. s herself pregnant and nearly full term, as such she hesitated to try to break up the fight. She stated that one of the dogs was badly hurt but the other two seemed fine. As we progressed farther into the yard I saw a brindle and white mixed breed dog limping toward us. The owner told me that her name is Princess and that she is the one that got the upper hand in the fight. She told me that Zeus was involved but kept running in and out of the fight. She added that the dogs have no history of fighting and that she does not know what started the fight today.**

**The back yard was full of trash, debris, and possessions. I observed that there was excessive animal waste present the yard and much of it contained foreign objects such as parts of clothing and chewed trash. I observed that the dogs had access to a large container of potable water and a large pile of kibble poured out on the back step. I also observed that the dogs had access to shade/shelter in the form of an open shed with a large mattress inside. On the mattress I saw the third dog. She was lying with her back to the door and appeared to be covered in blood. I observed that her demeanor was depressed, lethargic, and she was unwilling to stand or move. told me that the dog in the shed was called Bella. I asked if she was going to take Bella to the vet and she told me that she was not due to financial constraints.**

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I asked the woman, \_\_\_\_\_, if Zeus has been seen by a vet for his weight. Based on the Purina/LaFlamme Body Scoring System I determined that Zeus was a 2-2.5 and very underweight. The owner stated that she could not afford vet care and that she was thinking about feeding him wet food and/or high protein food but had not done so yet. I asked her when she first noticed he was underweight and she claimed that she got him two months ago and was thin at that time but has gotten worse since then.

I explained that all three dogs need to be seen by a vet and that if I issued a premise inspection, that she would only have 24 hours to comply or I would issue citations and confiscate the dogs. I told her that I need to confer with a supervisor to be sure that I was not overlooking anything and returned to the PACC truck to place the call.

I spoke to Supervisor Tenkate #1911 and was instructed to issue a citation for neglect of vet care on the puppy named Zeus and to try to suggest that the owner to release ownership of all three dogs. I returned and issued the citation and after explaining her options the owner agreed to sign her three dogs over to PACC. \_\_\_\_\_ acknowledged, signed, and accepted her citation. She was given her court date, time, location, and her ID was returned. I then had her sign the owner surrender form and impounded the three dogs.



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On January 25, 2016 at 1625 hours the Pima Animal Care Center received a call from an anonymous complainant who reported observing a small black and white Terrier type dog in a beige Cadillac. The complainant also said that dog had been in the car all day and that they did not obtain the vehicle license number. They did state that the windows were cracked but did not get close enough to see if the dog had food or water.

On January 25, 2016 at 17:01 hours I, Officer Tovar #2021, arrived at an apartment complex at [redacted] I found the gold Cadillac with AZ license plate [redacted] on one of the parking lots of the apartment complex. I walked up to the car and saw a tricolored terrier mix inside of the vehicle. The dog appeared to be in distress as it was standing up on his hind legs and yelping. The dog was also scratching at the front windows of the vehicle. I took pictures of the dog inside of the car. I could clearly see into the front seat area and saw that there was no water for the dog. I could not clearly see into the back seat as the window tint was very dark. I photographed the entire vehicle including the license plate.

I asked for the Tucson Police to respond to the area in case there was a need to gain forced entry to remove the dog from the car. While waiting for the officer to arrive I walked to the office where I spoke with Assistant Manager, Mr. [redacted] who said that he had just been working at the complex for three weeks. He walked to the vehicle with me and saw the dog inside of the car. He told me that he had never seen the car at the complex before.

TPD Officer Waer #51934, Event #E160250648, arrived and she saw the dog inside of the vehicle. Officer Waer and I were told that the vehicle owner might live in one of the apartments in front of where the car was parked. One tenant at an apartment said that she did hear a dog crying but did not know who the car belonged to. Another tenant said that they did not know who the car belonged to. We finally knocked on a door of apartment #9106 and found the dog owner, who was identified himself as Mr. [redacted] on his AZ ID card.

... said that he did not own the vehicle and that it belongs to his boss who let him use her car today. ...rk said that this morning at 0400 hours he was kicked out of his apartment by his girlfriend so he took his dog and left. He stated that he went to work but "was not in a good space" and his boss told him to take her car and leave for the day. He explained that he was looking for a place to stay and the only place he found was with his friend at this apartment complex. ... asserted that his friends have a large male dog and that this dog and his dog 'Jake' did not really get along. He stated that he put Jake in the car to keep him and his friend's dog apart. When I asked him why the dog did not have water he said that he just did not give him any and that he did not have an excuse for not giving him water.

I asked ... what time he put Jake in the car and he said around 1615 hours this afternoon. He then said, "time just got away from me." I advised ... that I was going to cite him for Cruelty and Neglect-No Water based on Jake being left in the vehicle without water. I then asked him if Jake had a current rabies vaccination and license. ... said that he could not afford to have that done. I asked him when he got Jake and he said that he has had him for a year and got him as a small puppy. I also cited ... for No License and No Rabies Vaccination. ... signed and received his copy of said citations.

I had ... remove Jake from the car and I observed that Jake was of good weight and appeared healthy. After ... removed Jake from the car I asked him if I could look in the back seat of the car and he told me I could. I photographed the area to show that there was no water for the dog. I also took additional pictures of the front seat to show the same. I advised him that should he leave his dog in a car again his dog would be impounded and he would receive additional citations. ... said that he was going to look for a place to stay tonight and if he was going to stay at the apartment with his friend he would keep the dog away from his friend's dog.

I saw the dog was released from the tie out chain and was told the dog would not be returned to the tie out I also saw the dog had access to clean water and a large shelter. I saw though the chain had wrapped around the porch post, the dog still had adequate room to reach both the shelter and water. I was very cooperative and accepted citations for No License and Neglect-Tie Out. This call was closed.

Officer's Case Report

01/18/16 16:08 | Investigator Foster #2042 was in the on an unrelated call and observed a dog on a tie-out at . When I completed the call I was working on, I relocated back to 12811 to address the issue of the dog on a tie-out as well as to continue searching for an injured dog that was last seen running from towards . At 16:38 I arrived back at and exited the truck and noticed that there were actually two Pit Bull type dogs on chain tie-outs. Both dogs had access to shade/shelter and potable water. I photographed the dogs and then returned to the residence and knocked on the door. I was met by the dog owner, . I stated my name and the reason for my visit and asked first if he had seen a small write dog that was possibly injured. He told me that he had not seen the dog in question. He did tell me that he owned a small black Terrier mix named Spike and the two dogs on chains. I observed that Spike appeared to be in good health and did not appear to have any injuries. He told me that the female Pit Bull, Missy belonged to a friend who is in jail and admitted that he has had care and custody of Missy for longer than 30 days. I asked why the two dogs were chained on tie-outs. He explained that the recent rains caused problems with his fenced area. He also told me that his female Pit Bull was in heat and the other Pit Bull is her brother. He stated that because they are closely related he does not want them to breed and felt he had no choice but to chain them up to keep them apart. I explained the laws regarding tie-outs and asked him to remove both dogs from the chains and place them indoors and he complied. I next requested to see proof of current rabies vaccination and licenses for his three dogs. . was not able to supply me with proof of either current rabies vaccination or licenses. At that point I issued citations for three counts of No License, and two counts of Neglect-Tie out acknowledged, signed, and accepted his citations. I returned his ID to him and provided him with his court date, time, and location. I also supplied him with a copy of the Pima County dog laws and a 'pet-fix' flier to obtain low cost spay/neuter services for his three dogs. I thanked him for his time and cooperation and left the area.

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Summary

Four of the dogs were impounded by the officer. All of the dogs were surrendered to PACC. The dog owner was cited. This complaint is closed.

On January 19th, 2016 at approximately 1616 hrs. I, Officer Baugus 1918 arrived at reference to multiple leash law complaints. Upon arrival, I observed five dogs in the yard. I observed is field fencing along the East side of the property and a heavy metal gate with fencing to prevent the dogs escape, however, four of the five dogs slipped under the gate and met me in the road. I honked and received no response from the home. I put the three young dogs in my truck and entered the yard through the unlocked gate. I knocked on the door and received no answer. Next to the house were two metal pots, the adult Pit Bull was licking the bottom of one of the pots which has maybe 1/4 inch of water in the bottom. I photographed the empty pots and had to lift the one pot to show the amount of water on the bottom of the pot. The two adult dogs were thirsty and continued to lick the bottom of the pot. The puppies could not reach the bottom of the pot to lick the bottom of the pot before I tried to fill it. I turned on the faucet to provide the dogs with water. The water slowly stopped as the pipes emptied. The water to the property was turned off. The two adult dogs ran to the north end of the property chasing a rabbit and slipped through a second gate that had the fencing removed and ran across the road. Eventually, the blue Pit Bull was captured, but the adult black dog was skittish and would not approach me. I was unable to capture the fifth dog on the property. I fed and watered the remaining dog and posted a notice advising of the impound as well as the need to provide water for the dogs at all times and the lack of confinement. There are previous complaints about these dogs not being confined that go back to August 2015. Another Officer also posted a leash law notice on September 4th 2015 (A15-177418). The dog owner has been made aware of the need to keep the dogs confined to the property. The dog owner called Prima Animal Care Center an hour after I left the property inquiring about her dogs. stated she would come into the center to redeem the adult Pit Bull but would sign over ownership for the puppies. On January 20th 2016 the dog owner came into Prima Animal Care Center and met with Supervisor N. Konst #2002 who obtained her Arizona driver license and issued Neglect-No Water and Leash Law citations on all five dogs on my behalf. signed the citations and received her copies. She was advised of the date, time and location of her court appearance. On January 21st 2016 again returned to Prima Animal Care Center bringing in the fifth dog and relinquished ownership for the adult dogs as well, stating that the dogs dig out of her yard and she can't afford to license them. This complaint is now closed.

I signed and received his copy of said citations. I had remove Jake from the car and I observed that Jake was of good weight and appeared healthy. After removed Jake from the car I asked him if I could look in the back seat of the car and he told me I could. I photographed the area to show that there was no water for the dog. I also took additional pictures of the front seat to show the same. I advised him that should he leave his dog in a car again his dog would be impounded and he would receive additional citations. k said that he was going to look for a place to stay tonight and if he was going to stay at the apartment with his friend he would keep the dog away from his friend's dog.





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**01/08/16 08:10 Pima Animal Care Center Dispatch (PACC) received a complaint from [redacted] / stating that the dogs who previously killed her rooster were back in her yard at [redacted] Rd attacking her animals. The caller also stated that one of the dogs bit her and ran away. She informed the dispatch operator that she believed that the dogs were still at large.**

**01/08/16 09:38 I, Investigator Foster #2042 arrived at [redacted] and was flagged down in the street by a woman who identified herself as the caller, [redacted] was very upset and informed me that the property at [redacted] belongs to the dog owner. There was a woman in the yard of that address with two dogs. The woman was later identified as a tenant of the dog owners. I observed the two dogs to be a tan colored Chow type dog and a white and black Springer Spaniel type dog.**

**The caller was very angry and to keep the peace between the two women I requested that [redacted] return home and wait for me to come interview her. Before she left [redacted] positively identified the two dogs, a Springer Spaniel and a Chow as the dogs that she witnessed attacking and killing one of her chickens this morning. She also stated that she is now requesting citations be issued to the dog owner for the situation she observed at 06:45 hours as well as a Dangerous Dog Evaluation be conducted on the two dogs.**

**Once the complainant left I met with the second woman who introduced herself as [redacted]. She told me that she had planned to assume ownership of the Springer Spaniel but the dog owner's wife is opposed to that arrangement. I asked if the owner was available and she stated that was not and added that she rents one of the mobile homes on the property. She stated that when the owner stays at the property he sleeps in a RV located at the [redacted]**

North East corner of the lot. provided me with a cell phone number for the dog owner. I explained to her that unless I could get ahold of the dog owner that I would have to impound the dogs. I also explained that PACC has received numerous complaints about these two dogs. Additionally, the reports state that the dogs are able to escape their area of confinement at will. Due to that information I could not leave the animals due to public safety concerns. stated that she was unhappy about that but also stated that she understood.

I attempted to contact the owner via the two telephone numbers I had. When I called the land line I received a message stating that the 'Magic-Jack' number was not assigned to a subscriber. When I tried the cell number I received a message stating that the number does not accept incoming calls.

I explained to the tenant that I was unable to reach the dog owner and would be impounding the two dogs. assisted me with loading them into individual kennels on the PACC truck. Both dogs were loaded without issues. I provided with a notice of impound to give to the dog owner and thanked her for her time. As the dogs were being loaded PCSO Deputy Summey #752 (Case #160108076) arrived. I explained the situation and he relocated to the caller's address to take her statement.

I arrived at , the caller's address, and explained that I was impounding the dogs and would be placing a Dangerous Dog-Hold on them pending an investigation. ay explained that at approximately 06:45 hours she observed the female tan Chow known as Princess, and the black and white Springer Spaniel from attack and kill a Rhode Island Red laying hen. She stated that both dogs had the bird on the ground and they were attacking it. She told me that she tried to save the bird and rushed toward the dogs screaming and kicking. She told me that the Spaniel ran but the Chow bit her foot /ankle and shook it. She told me that her knee high Doc Martin boots prevented the dog's teeth from breaking her skin. went on to say that the dog let go of her leg and grabbed her forearm and would not let go for a moment or two. She stated that her heavy Carhart style, double thick, canvas jacket prevented a break in the skin. She did show me that her forearm appeared swollen in the area where she stated the dog bit it.

She added that the dogs killed two other Chickens that morning but she did not witness them killing those birds but witnessed the dogs carrying the carcasses off her property. I saw a trail of feathers leading from the barn area toward the front gate that seemed to support the claims. I then photographed the area where the three birds were killed and photographed the remains of the dead hen that was not taken by the dogs.

On 01/09/16 12:18 hours Supervisor N. Konst #2002 met with [redacted] at the Pima County Animal Care Center. [redacted] had a come to that facility that to redeem his two dogs Princess and Bart. Supervisor Konst explained the complaint that was filed against him and the fact that the person had also requested that he be issued third party citations. He also explained to [redacted] that the complainant has requested that Pima Animal Care Center conduct a Dangerous Dog evaluation of Princess and Bart and as such they would not be released until an area of suitable confinement was approved. Supervisor Konst issued the citations to the dog owner as requested. [redacted] acknowledged, signed, and accepted his copy of the citations. He was given his court date, time, and location.



[redacted] stated that her son was still at school but that she believed that the dog who bit her son resides at [redacted]. [redacted] also stated that she has seen the dogs from that address at large on many occasions and stated that her children have informed her that they are aggressive towards them. I advised [redacted] that I would patrol the area and photograph the dogs in that yard and any dogs I observed loose to have her son ID at a future date. I then left her residence and patrolled the length of North [redacted] for the biting dogs. While patrolling the area I did not observe any loose dogs, but I was able to photograph the dogs contained in the yard at [redacted]. As I was leaving the area I observed that [redacted], was picking up her son at the bus stop, she flagged me down and I was able to photograph [redacted] injuries and present him with the photos I took. [redacted] positively identified the blue and white dogs involved in his bite, but stated that he is unsure which dog actually bit him. [redacted] also stated that he believed that the incident took place at approximately 07:50 hours on 10/29/14. [redacted] stated that she is requesting citations be issued on her and [redacted] behalf. I then thanked [redacted] and her son for their time and returned to [redacted].

16:40 I arrived at [redacted] and honked the Plma Animal Care Center truck horn to attract the attention of any occupants. I did not receive an answer. As I was preparing to write a notice the neighbor from [redacted] approached me and asked if I was responding to a different complaint. I stated that I was not but asked her if she knew the name of the residents of that address. The woman stated that she believed that the owner/resident was named [redacted] and that she drives a Yellow car. I then provided the neighbor with information that she requested about response times and photographing leash law violations to achieve a resolution to her issues with a different neighbor and their aggressive dogs. When I completed the discussion with the neighbor I posted a notice advising the residents of [redacted] that neither of the blue merle and white dogs should be moved, sold or transferred from the property until the owners have met with an officer. I photographed the notice and posted it on the walk through gate.

DD#5

11/05/14 12:41 I arrived and did not observe any cars or trucks in the driveway. I honked the horn in an attempt to be heard by anyone at home but did not receive a response. I did not observe the two blue merle and white mixed breed dogs but did observe the black and tan heeler mix that was not involved in the bite incident.

12/03/14 17:20hrs I arrived at [redacted] and met with dog owner, [redacted]. [redacted] provided me with proof of current license and vaccinations both of her Catahoula mix dogs named Kuma and Texas. The quarantine period ended on 11/07/14 and both dogs were seen by a vet at North West Pet Hospital shortly after the quarantine release date. The attending vet deemed them healthy at that time. As requested, I issued third party citations for leash law violations for both dogs and one biting animal for Texas. [redacted] /I also volunteered the fact that she had built a six foot high fenced enclosure to protect her dogs. She chose to construct the dog run well away from any of the perimeter fences as she has previously seen neighborhood kids tormenting her pets by throwing objects. [redacted] stated that she has located metal pellets under the skin of both the dogs and believes they were shot with a pellet gun. I photographed the newly fenced area and the two dogs believed to be involved in the bite incident. I then asked [redacted] to provide me with a copy of he driver's license. I explained that the victim's mother has requested citations be issued on her and her son's behalf. I then returned to the Plma Animal Care vehicle and completed the afore mentioned citations. [redacted] was very cooperative and signed the citations. I then provided [redacted] with her court date, time, location, and provided her with a copy of the citation. I then returned [redacted] license and thanked her for her time and cooperation.
