Who is eligible for Family Planning?

Men, Women and Teens who are:

- At or below 250% Federal Poverty Level
- Reproductive Age
- Seeking Family Planning Services
- Teens can access **ALL** Family Planning Services **without** parental consent; however parental involvement is encouraged. All services are offered in a confidential setting.

Female Services

- **Birth control methods**
 - Abstinence
 - Intrauterine Device - Mirena and Paraguard (IUD)
 - Depo Provera Shot (DEPO)
 - Birth Control Pills
 - Barrier Methods (Diaphragm and Condoms)
 - Cycle Beads (Natural Family Planning)
- **Emergency contraceptive pills**
- **Pregnancy testing, Counseling and Referral**



- **Physical Assessment**
- **Breast Exams**
- **Pelvic Exams**
- **Pap Smears**
- **Sexually Transmitted Disease Testing and Treatment.**
- **Counseling and Education**
- **Referrals for other Medical/Social needs**

Male Services

Teen Services

There are two ways that teens can get services:

- Walk into **ANY** of our family planning offices
- Being a student at any of Sunnyside Unified School District's high schools

REMEMBER

Teens do not need parental permission to access Family Planning Services; however parental involvement is encouraged.

Arizona Pregnancy Facts

- Everyday in Arizona, 26 teens become pregnant. (9,490 per year) –Arizona Department of Health Services (2010)
- Teen childbirths in Arizona cost taxpayers at least \$303 million in 2008. -National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy
- AHCCCS and IHS paid for 87% of teen births in Arizona during 2010. - Arizona Department of Health Services (2010)

Mobile Services

- **Project CONTACT** provides quality reproductive health care to eligible teenagers at little or no-cost. The program focuses on reaching youth who are homeless, at risk of being homeless, or are high risk for pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections. All services are confidential, nonjudgmental, do not require parent permission, and can be provided on a walk-in basis.

Services currently are provided on the Mobile Health Clinic and specifically for students at:

- Desert View HS
- Sunnyside HS
- STARS Academy



Juvenile Detention

- The Pima County Juvenile Court Center offers family planning services to at-risk youth in temporary custody of the Juvenile Detention System. Clinics are held on-site on a weekly basis. The POET Program also provides weekly health education classes to male and female detainees.




Pima County STD Program

- Low/no cost routine health exams and treatment for sexually transmitted diseases.
 - **Express testing** is available for Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis and an HIV Test and does not require a clinical exam
 - **Clinical exam** is available for persons who are experiencing symptoms
- Walk-in appointments
- Minors do NOT need parental consent for exams and treatment.

Arizona STD Facts

- In 2010, 33.5% of 15-19 year old teen births had contracted an STD (Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis, Genital Herpes)
- 34% of females testing positive for Chlamydia in Pima County (2010) were high school age (15-19).
- Importance of routine screening, Education and access to confidential resources and services.

Pima County Well Woman Services

- Screening, diagnostics, and case management
- Public education and Outreach
- Professional education
- Promoting and providing quality health care
- Supporting other local breast and cervical cancer early detection organizations and treatment networks
- Using surveillance and data analysis to improve program planning, implementation and evaluation

Well Woman Eligibility

- Must reside in Arizona
- Gross household income can not exceed 250% of the federal poverty limit
- No insurance or, has insurance that **does not** cover Breast or Cervical Cancer Screening or has insurance that has a deductible of \$100 or more for preventative screening
- Must be at least 21 years old for a Cervical Cancer Screening
- Must be 40-65 years old for Breast Cancer Screening
 - 18 or over for a person presenting Breast Cancer Symptoms

Community Education (POET)

- Community Education is an vital component of the Pima Outreach and Education Team (POET). POET is dedicated to making Public Health awareness and education available through presentations, participation in health fairs, and distribution of health literature to residents of Pima County.
- POET also provides opportunities for HIV and STD testing. Using our mobile units, the Health Department provides testing opportunities and services for people unwilling or unable to receive services at our clinics.
