# Children's Memorial Park

## Children's Memorial Park

is a fitting tribute to the children who have died in our community. This Pima County Park, near River and Oracle at 4851 15th Place, was formerly known as Edgewater Park. After being destroyed by the 1983 flood, it was rebuilt and rededicated as Children's Memorial Park on November 14, 1987.

The Children's Memorial Plaza, set off from the more active areas of the park, provides as opportunity for quiet reflection to remember the children who have died.

*This park is a community effort: a coalition of Pima County Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation, Pima County Flood Control, Tucson Clean & Beautiful, and other organizations, with support from the Pima County Board of Supervisors and the Pima County Parks Foundation.*

*Tucson Clean & Beautiful is a 501(C)3 non-profit organization and any contribution is tax deductible.*



The memorial consists of granite walls on which the names of the children are engraved and includes a sculpture called "Omni," which was created in 1978 by 700 boys and girls at a summer camp. The area also includes a sculpture, "The Magic Carpet," which was donated by the Thomason Family in 2002.

The park also contains a playground with new playground equipment donated by a grant from the Wolslager Foundation in 2003, bike path, exercise trail, a sports court, a multiuse sports field, picnic areas, and group ramadas.
