Application Procedures

- A Reduced License Fee Application must be completed to be eligible for the special Low Income Discounted Dog License Fee.
- Please submit 2 copies of this form. A copy will be given to you after processing. Please keep that copy as it may be required for future actions.
- The Low Income Discounted dog license fee for altered dogs is **\$9.00**.
- Late Fees will be charged where applicable.
- All dogs three months of age or older are required to be licensed according to local ordinances. Failure to license your dog may result in criminal citations being issued.
- Before a license is issued, the owner must present a vaccination certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian.
- According to A.R.S. 6, § 11-1008, "The licensing period shall not exceed the period of time for revaccination".
- It is YOUR responsibility to license your dog.
