An apprenticeship is not just a job, it is a career. Graduates who successfully complete their apprenticeship training will receive nationally recognized completion certificate. In this regard, an apprenticeship is considered "the other four (4) year degree." Apprentices earn a salary while learning their craft. An apprenticeship combines on-the-job-training experience with

related (classroom) instruction. Apprenticeship occupations last from one (1) to six (6) years, but most average three (3) to four (4) years.

Many occupations offer apprenticeships, including healthcare, construction, information technology, cyber security, advanced manufacturing and business services.
