- I. **Called to Order:** Dr. Mark P. Vitale, Chair, Performance and Accountability Committee and Danielle Duarte, Chair, Planning Committee, 8:35 a.m.
- II. **Zoom Meeting Protocols and Chat Moderator:** Marcelino Flores, Special Staff Assistant – Senior, Pima County Community & Workforce Development Department (“CWD”), reminded attendees about turning off computer microphones and telephone ringers; please

III. Governance: Mark explained how the WIB has policy and support objective framework to be applied. The state and local EPTL tools are available for the WIB.

A. Local Workforce Development Plan 2020-2023 – In-Demand Industries and Occupations need to be updated per results of data analysis and local area needs.

B. WIB Committees’ and Staff Roles

1. Marcelino reminded the Committee members that P&A oversees the required and other partners’ performance; the development of Requests for Proposal (“RFP”); and reviews/evaluates Eligible Training Provider List (“ETPL”) requests; and the ETP’s Performance.
2. Designate a coordinator; submit reports.
3. Technology-based learning and; outreach and marketing ARIZONA@WORK.
4. Training Provider Process of Applying to ETPL; it can take up to 30 days for the process to be completed. The checklist will be emailed to the Committee members.

C. Pima County Eligible Training Providers List (“ETPL”) Guidelines 2017 – reviewed and discussed for possible update needs.

D. Pima County Career Pathway Guidelines 2020 – reviewed and discussed for possible update needs.

IV. Pima County Performance Measures and Analysis/Data Gaps

A. Eligible Training Providers (“ETP”) – The Performance Committee should continue to review performance and the Planning Committee should review and confirm that the ETPs are offering trainings for the WIB’s in-demand occupations.

B. ARIZONA@WORK Pima County One-Stop Service Providers – The P&A Committee reviews and reports all WIOA Service Providers’ performance who are the contracted organizations approved by the WIB to provide career services for One-Stop WIOA clients.

V. Next Meeting(s)

Danielle Duarte said that she will ask the WIB Planning Committee to work to define the WIB’s Target Industry Sector Emerging Technologies and look at where there is room ad opportunities for training providers to be added to the Pima County ETPL.

Mark said the Performance Committee will continue oversight and try to work closer with staff. If another joint meeting is needed, both Chairs will communicate to staff and their Committees.
