- I. **Called to Order, Welcome, and Introductions:** Dr. Vaughn E. Croft, Chair, 3:31 p.m.

- III. **Affordable Housing and Support Services for Vulnerable, At-risk Individuals, Families and Seniors:** Jamie Snyder, TMM Family Services, presented information about the organization and said they are primarily a housing provider and they focus on foster children.

The One-Stop Service Providers (SER, Goodwill, TYD, etc.) have service provider contracts with the Pima County CWD to help represent the One-Stop System and that require them to assist with meeting the WIOA Title I-B Performance Measures that were negotiated with the state.
