Re: **State Legislative Agenda for 2023**

This is to begin the process of developing Pima County's Legislative Agenda for the 2023 Regular Session of the State Legislature. Pima County will participate in the County Supervisors Association (CSA) Legislative Summit October 5 – 7, 2022 at which time legislative priorities and strategies will be developed, which represent the important issues facing all Arizona's counties. For that reason, the timeframe for receipt of legislative issues or projects that you believe should be pursued in 2023 has been moved to **July 29, 2022**.

I plan to forward to the Board of Supervisors any proposed legislative items for consideration at the August 15, 2022 meeting of the Board of Supervisors, which is the day proposals and resolutions are due to the CSA for statewide review.

I encourage you to identify items within your department and budget that are:

- resulting from statutorily mandated procedures that are not beneficial to the public or cost effective;
- costs that have been unjustifiably shifted to the County from the State;
- mandated services for which the State provides no or inadequate funding; and
- existing revenues and authorities from the State that you have reason to believe will be at risk next year.
