Re: **Summerhaven Road Maintenance**

Supervisor Steve Christy and his staff have received continuing requests from Summerhaven homeowners to accept a number of remaining dirt roads in the area.

Please review the roads in Summerhaven and indicate the reasons why they are not maintained by the County. Perhaps the confusion arises due to the County maintaining some roads and not others. There are likely a substantial number of reasons for each individual road that have not been taken into the maintenance system. Please review the roads not maintained by Pima County and state the appropriate reason they are not maintained, while other roads are maintained.

While we would like to maintain all roads in Summerhaven, financial funding limitations restrict our ability to provide maintenance, particularly when the larger part of our maintenance dollars for the Mount Lemmon area are dedicated to the main access roadways. These roadways are US Forest Service property for which the County is not appropriately, reasonably, or even proportionately reimbursed for our costs from the federal government.

Please provide your response to Supervisor Christy and his Executive Assistant Beth Borozan.
