Re: Mandatory Pima County Curfew and Penalties

Dear Mr. Rozema:

On Friday and Saturday evening (December 11 and 12), post 10:00 p.m., Pima County Health and other County employees conducted observations of establishments that are regulated by Pima County through our Health Department have a food permit and alcohol licenses (6, 7, 12 series). The purpose of these observations was to determine the degree of compliance with the voluntary curfew suggested by the County.

In your jurisdiction we observed 7 establishments that were nonconforming with the County's voluntary curfew. Because of this noncompliance, the Board of Supervisors made the Pima County voluntary curfew mandatory through our countywide public health authority. A list of the noncompliant establishments is enclosed for your information.

The Board adopted a penalty for any establishment that permits an individual on premises in violation of the mandatory curfew will be subject to suspension or revocation of any operating permit issued by the Pima County Health Department. The length of suspension or revocation will depend on the degree of violation that is a public nuisance and dangerous to public health.

I would appreciate any assistance you can provide in stressing the seriousness of the current COVID-19 outbreak. As of December 17, 2020 the number of infections for the month of December totaled 15,942, nearly 50 more than all of the infections in November and we are less than halfway through the month of December. In just the last 9 days, 123 deaths have been recorded in Pima County related to COVID-19.

Each of the establishments on the list of curfew violators will receive a registered letter from the County explaining our voluntary curfew is now mandatory and any violation will result in their operating permit or license from the County either being suspended or revoked.
