Re: **Downtown Disturbance - May 29, 2020**

Significant vandalism occurred Friday night throughout downtown Tucson and County facilities were not exempt. A number of windows in Superior Court were broken, including door windows. Facilities Management Director Lisa Josker and her staff were in the downtown area late Friday evening to take action to secure broken windows in Superior Court and assess other damages, which involved extensive graffiti on County facilities.

Most of the damage occurred to private property along Congress Street and Broadway Boulevard. Early, Saturday morning, Chief Deputy County Administrator Jan Leshner, Ms. Josker and myself met with Downtown Tucson Partnership (DTP) staff to discuss the actions that occurred the previous night and to assist in cleanup as well as securing property from further damage.

Saturday night's damage was limited to areas north of downtown, along 6<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Avenues. The Sheriff's Department secured the Superior Court building and were in place to prevent any attempted intrusion into the building.

Early Saturday morning, our staff began removing all graffiti on County buildings and assisting DTP by providing additional plywood to be distributed to businesses attempting to secure their facilities.

We will continue to work with DTP to assist them with any further repair and restoration activities they may be engaged in with private businesses. In addition, we will also work with DTP in providing services in response to the COVID-19 pandemic for downtown restaurants and business who plan to reopen during the current public health emergency.
