Re: **Distribution of County Residents who Received the First Dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine**

As has been emphasized to the Board, the County public health agency has had a targeted vaccine strategy directed to those individuals who are most likely have severe health complications associated with the COVID-19 infection, including hospitalization and potentially death. This targeted response has been to try and vaccinate those individuals over a certain age group.

The most recent data indicates the County has been largely successful in providing targeted County residents a COVID-19 vaccine. In fact, of the population size and the vaccinations applied to those between the ages of 70 to 79, 72 percent have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. For those individuals 80 years and older, 75.6 percent of this population have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccination. Therefore, our targeted strategy related to age and potential severity of outcome is entirely successful. With this susceptible group largely vaccinated, we now turn to minority and disadvantaged communities to ensure they have equitable access to the COVID-19 vaccine.
