PimaRecovers.com is now live. The website provides for public review of Pima County's use of all COVID-19 funds to ensure transparency and accountability in government spending and the efficient use of resources.

While the site currently is limited in the amount of historic information available, it will soon provide for a reliable and timely examination of the County's use of all taxpayers' dollars – specifically federal and state funds provided in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

PimaRecovers.com allows the public to monitor adherence to the policies and priorities set by the Pima County Board of Supervisors and provide feedback on programs and services. In addition, comments and suggestions about the development of the site can be shared via the 'Contact Us' tab.

This basic site will be improved over the next few months with more interactive and detailed content added. When finished, the public will be able to search the site for specific spending information and use interactive graphics to drill down from macro, generalized spending data to spending for specific programs.

Additionally, beginning next year, the site will provide success stories about how the funds benefited the people of Pima County during the pandemic and helped our community respond to, mitigate, and recover from the pandemic.
