

## **Bond Authorizations**

At five special elections, two in 1997, one in 2004, one in 2006 and one in 2014, Pima County voters approved \$1.520 billion in General Obligation, Sewer Revenue, and HURF Revenue bonds. Since 1998 Pima County has sold \$1.42 billion of authorized bonds.
