

Tale of the Turf



1. Manicure the dormant Bermuda grass by vacuuming out old clippings, then mowing the grass to about half an inch.



4. Add a slow-release fertilizer to keep the Bermuda green while it's still going dormant and phosphorous to help the rye germinate faster and thicker.




2. Drop in winter ryegrass seed. Begin overseeding 75-80 acres of turf across the North, Main and South Complex fields with more than seven billion seeds.



5. Paint the field with greenlinks pigment, which acts as a blanket to trap heat and accelerate the germination process.



3. Top-dress each field with 25-50 tons of sand to hold down the rye and lock in moisture at the top of the soil bed.



6. Water, water and more water.
