

Summary of the presentations at the five public information meetings held for the proposed Monsanto Avra Valley agricultural facility

(Compiled and transcribed by Pima County Economic Development staff)

The five supervisorial district meetings were held January 9 – 19, 2016 in facilities identified with input from each of the Supervisors' offices. Pima County Economic Development staff requested that whenever possible a Pima County facility be utilized to avoid the cost of renting external facilities. The Supervisors' office all selected times for the meetings that were at 5pm or later with the exception of District 4, which felt a midday time was better suited for its preferred venue in Green Valley.

The Pima County staff member conducting all five meetings was Pima County Economic Development Deputy Director Patrick Cavanaugh, who was assisted by Deseret Romero, executive assistant for economic development in the Pima County Administrator's office. Security was also provided by the Pima County Sheriff's Department at all five meetings. Each member of the Pima County Board of Supervisors attended the specific meeting in their respective districts, as did some district staff members. None of the Supervisors addressed the audience at the meetings except for Supervisor Richard Elias, who voiced his support for Pima County staff and his opposition to the Monsanto project.

Dr. Amanda McClerren, Monsanto's product strategy lead for the company, presented for Monsanto. Dr. McClerren was assisted by several other employees of Monsanto who provided an 8-foot by 4-foot model of the proposed facility as well as other exhibits such as the corn expected to be grown in the greenhouse, samples of the membranes used to control air flow in the proposed facility and examples of the materials that would be used to enclose the greenhouse. A video and PowerPoint were also presented.

The meeting agendas, formats and information were kept essentially the same in all five districts. Both Cavanaugh's and McClerren's presentations were kept the same for all of the meetings with only minor variations. An exception to the format was the use of subject matter experts

recommended by the individual members of the Pima County Agricultural Science Advisory Commission. These experts were intended to be a resource for the community's technical questions. At the first meeting (January 9, District 1) the experts (from the fields of plant science, toxicology and soil, water and environmental science) received no questions related to their fields of expertise, and were instead questioned by members of the audience as to whether they had financial ties to Monsanto. All of the experts, who were affiliated with the University of Arizona, stated they did not have any ties, financial or otherwise, to Monsanto. A decision was made by Pima County administration to not utilize the experts at future meetings so as not to further impose on the schedules of these busy professionals who had graciously volunteered their time.

Each meeting began with an explanation of the format and agenda by Patrick Cavanaugh. The meetings were intended to maximize the flow of information to the public and on the process and project while collecting additional public comment for the Board of Supervisors. Question and answer segments were held after each presentation followed by a public comment period. Members of the public were asked to sign in to the meeting and to fill out a speaker card if they intended to provide public comment.

The first meeting (January 9, District 1) and the last meeting (January 19, District 2) has the largest attendance, both estimated to be about 130 attendees. The remaining three meetings all surpassed 100 attendees. Approximately 20 or more people attended multiple meetings, with some attending all five meetings. The broad gauge of asking people who lived in the supervisorial district where the meeting was held to raise their hands indicated Districts 1 and 4 had the most constituent turnout, both estimated to be approximately 50 percent or higher. The other three districts were estimated to have an average of around 35 to 45 percent constituents.

The meetings lasted two to three hours each dictated by the closing time of the chosen facilities. Meetings that began at 6pm in two of the districts were limited to approximately two hours, with meetings that started at 5pm

in two districts and the 11am in one district last three or more hours. Citizens who had filled out a speaker card and included their phone number but were unable to speak due to the time constraints were telephoned by Pima County staff and offered the ability to speak first at the next meeting, provide comment through Pima County's Monsanto information website or provide comment over the phone.

Below are transcriptions of the Pima County and Monsanto presentations held January 9, 2016 in District 1 and which reflect similar presentations made in the other four districts:

Pima County presentation by Patrick Cavanaugh

Cavanaugh introduced Pima County staff, acknowledged the presence of the member of the Board of Supervisors, asked for a show of hands from the audience members who lived in the Supervisor's district and then proceeded to explain the format for the meeting agenda

"... Let me start by explaining how we hope to see this flow today. We're going to try and keep this to about two hours which is what we have the facility booked for, so it's important that we keep things moving in order to maximize the amount of information presented to you - and make sure we have plenty of time for your questions and comments.

"One of the ways we can do that is to keep your comments short and on point, and if your comment is similar to comments previously voiced, you can just say that you agree with the previous speakers so we can avoid redundant comments. Keep in mind you also have the ability to provide comment through the county's website we put together about the Monsanto Greenhouse. You can find it at www.pima.gov in the quick links on the main page... the site has a lot of information about the project and if you haven't already reviewed it, I encourage you to do so.

"For those of you who grabbed an agenda when you came in, you can see we have it broken down in to three sections. First I'm going to give some quick background information about Pima County's involvement with

Monsanto's proposed greenhouse and the Foreign Trade Zone, or FTZ as it's commonly called.

"During me remarks, I'll ask you to please hold your comments until I'm finished with my quick summary on those issues and then we will enter in to Q and A on the areas specific to Pima County's role in relation to the Monsanto Greenhouse. If you don't have a question for Pima County, please just wait until the Monsanto or public comment period to voice your broader concerns.

"The second part of the meeting will be a presentation from Monsanto. I would ask that we keep things civil and let them make their presentation without interruption, and then again, we will open it up for questions and answers specific to the greenhouse facility and Monsanto's operation. That presentation will be led by Dr. Amanda McClarren, who is the Product Strategy Lead from Monsanto. The company has some exhibits they would like to share and possibly a video, and I would imagine that is where a lot of the questions are going to arise.

"Then for the third and final part of the meeting, we're going to open it up to public comment. This is a very important part of the meeting. The Board of Supervisors has made clear that they value your comments and want more public input on the Monsanto facility. What you say here tonight will be summarized and conveyed first to the Pima County Agricultural Science Advisory Commission for review, and then to the Board of Supervisors at their meeting scheduled for February 21.

"At the Supervisors' meeting, the board will decide whether to approve the FTZ PILOT, the associated Memorandum of Understanding, or MOU, which provide insight in to the greenhouse operation that otherwise Pima County won't have. The quarterly reports we would receive through the MOU would be regularly reviewed by the Agricultural Science Commission, and the commission would meet in public meetings which allow for additional input from the community. There is also a proposal for a community based committee appointed by the county that would review areas of impact outside the science commission's area.

“So for this public comment section, we’re going to emulate the Board of Supervisors process and ask you to fill out a speaker card if you intend to offer comment. We’re also going to limit comments to three minutes each so we maximize the amount of speakers. We don’t have fancy stop speaking lights like the supervisors have at their speaker’s podium, so instead Deseret is going to hold up a card when you’ve reached the allotted three minutes. (Show them the card Deseret, please.)

“Please be respectful of the time that so other people can get their view recorded too. If I cut you off, it’s not because I want to be rude. I’m just trying to be fair to everyone who wishes to speak. And like Chairwoman Bronson of the (Pima County) Board of Supervisors always says, we’re going to operate under the rules of civility: which means, let’s please be civil to each other. Please no yelling, interrupting or interjecting when others are speaking.

“So a quick background and some county information - then we’ll move to question and answers on the Pima County portion of the agenda:

“In March 2016, the Monsanto Company contacted Pima County and presented its plan for construction of a seven acre greenhouse on 155 acres of vacant land located at Sanders and Twin Peaks roads in unincorporated Pima County. The purchase of the Avra Valley property was completed in October 2016. The company intends to conduct corn product development at the site when the facility construction is completed, which is expected to occur in 2017. The facility is expected to create 20 to 30 full time salaried positions and 30 to 50 hourly positions. The capital investment from the facility construction is expected to be between \$95 million and \$105 million when completed.

“Monsanto has indicated its import/export inventory activity at the property will qualify the company for an activated site in Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) 174, which covers all of Pima County and portions of southern Pinal County. If Monsanto receives federal approval of its application and is activated in the FTZ, the company will receive substantial savings on foreign trade duty and will also be eligible for significant property tax

reductions based on an Arizona state law that changes the property tax classification of businesses operating in FTZs.

“That’s the primary decision being placed before the Board of Supervisors related to Monsanto. The board is not considering any significant incentive package. The property tax reduction comes automatically under state law. The reduction in duties paid on the inventory comes from the federal government. What Pima County is deciding is the PILOT agreement, the memorandum of understanding and the related committee and commission that would review the facility reports. If the Board of Supervisors approves the agreements, Pima County will send a letter of no objection to the FTZ Board. If the Board votes against the agreement, we will not send a letter of no objection to the FTZ Board.

“Pima County is not deciding whether the facility should be built. The county has absolutely no authority to prevent Monsanto from building and operating a greenhouse on the property they purchased. They are within their rights to operate on land they legally purchased - and the corn production operation they have planned in the green house is legal as well.

“So back to the agreement: In exchange for its support to the Foreign Trade Zone Board in Washington, D.C., Pima County has in the past encouraged companies seeking activation in the local FTZ to enter in to payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) agreements approved by the Board of Supervisors.

“The intent of these agreements is to mitigate the property tax revenue loss to educational entities such as school districts, the Pima County Joint Technical Education District and the Pima Community College District. Previous companies that have entered in to PILOT agreements now rebate the tax revenues the companies would have not had to pay to local educational entities. We have entered in to FTZ PILOT agreement with companies like the Home Goods Distribution Center that open last year near the airport, and companies like Ventana Medical in Oro Valley. In fact, on the same agenda that Monsanto’s agreement was on at the November

Board of Supervisors meeting that some of you attended; there was a FTZ PILOT proposal for the recently announced expansion at Raytheon.

“On November 22, 2016, Pima County staff presented a series of agreements to the Pima County Board of Supervisors including a PILOT agreement between Monsanto and the local taxing districts, a memorandum of understanding with Monsanto that required regular disclosures and reporting from the company about the greenhouse operation, the creation of a community-based advisory committee and the creation of a science-based advisory commission to review the Monsanto operation.

“Approximately 51 citizens voiced comments to the Board of Supervisors during the meeting and many others provided written comment - most of which was in opposition to the Monsanto facility. Community concerns ranged from opposition to the use of genetically modified seed in farming, the health effects of genetically modified food, the use of a proprietary herbicide, the impact on local farmers, past incidents of contamination elsewhere and questions about Monsanto’s corporate ethics.

“The Board of Supervisors voted to postpone its decision until February 21, 2017 and directed staff to hold five community information meetings in 90 days, collect additional public comment, establish and convene the Pima County Agricultural Science Advisory Commission and have Monsanto respond to the community comment received at the Board of Supervisors’ November 22, 2016 meeting.

“And that’s where we’re at now. So let’s open it up to questions about Pima County’s proposed agreement, the FTZ, the items to be considered by the Board of Supervisors or anything else related to Pima County and the Monsanto facility: When we finish that, we will move to Monsanto’s presentation.”

Monsanto presentation by Dr. Amanda McClerren

McClerren introduced herself as a scientist who is directly involved in the proposed Avra Valley facility. Dr. McClerren has worked for Monsanto for nine years and is the daughter of a farmer. She spoke about her personal reasons why she works for Monsanto. She stated agriculture and food supply have become important topics of discussion due to projected population growth in the world:

“A lot of that growth with more people eating high protein diets— more people eating more meat – and that will tax our resources. We already understand that water is at a premium and the amount of arable land available in the world to grow crops is decreasing, not increasing. That puts sustainability at the heart of the conversation – how do we grow more food with fewer resources. Monsanto’s view of sustainability has three core pillars: people, planet and company. The company’s commitment to people is to be good partners in the communities we operate. Our commitment to the planet is to develop products that help our customers become more sustainable. We’re also committed with things such as development of monarch butterfly habitat, bee health research. And at our company we are focused on making sure are people are safe, that we are doing all the right things from a human rights perspective and that are internal operations are as sustainable as possible as well.”

Dr. McClerren presented a PowerPoint that began with a graphic that showed a map of the Earth and stated:

“... that in terms of sustainability, when we think of the food that will be needed to feed the world by 2050 or 2060 it would be the equivalent of taking a continent like South America, and duplicating it. If we don’t increase productivity levels, and just keep production the same, we have to come up with another South America, hence the company’s emphasis on increasing growers’ productivity and decrease their inputs. That’s really what’s at the heart of this greenhouse project as well... the greenhouse project is going to allow us to deliver better products faster to our grower customers and it’s going to allow us to do it more sustainably. When we think of corn production in a greenhouse we think about protecting that corn from the environment. We think about being able to optimize all of the resources

we provide for that corn and really dial in on the environmental conditions – light, temperature or humidity as well as the inputs like water and nutrients. That allows us to really optimize the performance and growth of that corn and get as much out of the plant as we can.

“... What we’re planning to build is a seven-acre greenhouse facility that is completely enclosed. This will allow us to grow corn year round and really take advantage of the fantastic light quality we have here in Pima County. By growing this corn in the greenhouse, we can move some of our more technically challenging nurseries in to an environment that is really optimized for them... we’re going to be building a state-of-the-art automation facility that will allow us to grow the corn plants in pots... we’re going to be able to put these pots on movable benches and we’re going to be able to use integrated automation to move the benches around the facility, that allows us to dial in on the growth characteristics and allows us to maximize the space in the greenhouse facility. It also allows us to move the corn to the people (working in the greenhouse) when they need to interact with the plant.

“One of the things we are going to doing most in the greenhouse is called crossing... in this photo you can see a man with a plant that has just been crossed – you see brown paper bag on the corn... it starts with a (corn) tassel and shoot, so when we cross corn we place pollen from the tassel and place it on the shoot, the shoot is what develops in to the ear... after we perform this exercise, we place the paper bag over the corn to make sure that pollen from other plants can’t get in. The vast majority of what goes on in the greenhouse will be plants, growing happily, plants on benches moving to people for them to conduct this crossing activity. The greenhouse facility also has a significant impact on the sustainability of our operations. What will be able to achieve in this seven acre greenhouse is equivalent to about 190 acres (of crop) in the field – that’s an over 90 percent reduction in land we need to use to deliver this part of our production operation. Even more exciting, especially here, is the sustainable crop management. We actually have an active program where we look for trap plants and beneficial insects that help us improve the quality of corn that is grown.

“Because the corn is in the greenhouse, it’s not going to be subject to a lot of the pests that plants growing in an open field would face, but if pests are present we can use these trap plants, which are plants grown next to the corn that will attract unfavorable insects. We can also use insects like the ladybug ...which like to eat insects that are not beneficial. This greenhouse actually reduces the amount of water we would use in comparable field operations, by 80 percent. More exciting, nearly all of the water used will be part of a water recapture and recycling system – so 80 percent reduction, and on top of that, nearly all of (the water) will be reused – further contributing to the idea that we are investing in more sustainable, state-of-the-art operation.

“Finally, I just want to take a moment to talk about some of the community engagement and partnerships we have had in other place we work. In Hawaii... we have a lot of programs focused on education activities with students at schools as well as gardens that have been developed that bring in beneficial insects and native plants. It’s an active part of our operations to plant these native plants and pollinator habitats in between our fields in Hawaii and help make our operations more sustainable and which is really a great success story after interacting with the community and learning about the concerns there...

(Video shown demonstrating planned operation of the greenhouse)

... some of the expertise that we will be hiring for in the greenhouse include anything from (heating, ventilation and air conditioning) engineers to plant agronomists, plant biologists... because of the high light quality in Arizona we actually won’t have to add supplemental light very much to any degree which is another component to the selection of Arizona for the sustainability of the operation...thank you”

DISTRICT 1 COMMENT SUMMARY

(Note: Some duplicate concerns have not been listed here but are available on the District 1 Monsanto Information Meeting audio file.)

Activity inside the proposed greenhouse facility

1. Is this a prototype for future farming? Are you looking at just greenhouse growing or some other way of growing corn? Is this for (Monsanto's) use rather than global agricultural use?
2. How are you keeping your plants from cross pollinating in the rest of the world?
3. When your genetics escape from the enclosure are you going to sue the surrounding farmers?
4. Other than lady bugs, what other bugs are used in the greenhouse?
5. You said that this was a sealed operation. You also said you would have some beneficial insects. Are they able to get in or are you putting them in yourself? If it's sealed, how are they going to get in?
6. Will the experimental corn and soy grown include a built-in insecticide?
7. What will this corn be used for once it's harvested?
8. Can you clarify if any of the corn grow-outs will be for developing precursors for pharmaceuticals from the genetic material that are in the plants?

9. Where can I see a blueprint and the drafting of this state-of-the art building?
10. Your corn is unique enough to qualify for a patent but you also claim it's substantially equivalent to conventional corn. How can that be?
11. Let's say that in a couple years with climate change you change your operation. Where is it in your contract with the county that what we can hold you to it? What if things change in five years Do you have a contract with the county?
12. What happens to the plants when they're spent? They're composted?
13. You can't convince me that filter is going to keep your pollen off of my organic crops or anybody's

GMO (Genetically Modified Organism)

1. Why do 38 countries ban GMO if it's so wonderful?
2. In the European Union they require mandatory labeling of GMO products
3. I'm a farmer ...in 1990 I started my own farm in Marana it was almost impossible to grow anything because of the insects we had to battle...I was one of those people who said, no, I'm not going to pay Monsanto. Around 1996 I had a huge crop failure...I sprayed as much as I could...the very next year I said I'm going to grow GMO...it has literally changed the landscape of agriculture...there's a lot of people here in the room against GMO – that great, you all have that ability to protest, but find something else that farmers can use to grow enough to feed the world. Farmer's markets isn't going to do

it...I'm in favor of Monsanto because their products work...when I don't have to spray, that's a good thing...GMO takes that all away.

The construction of the greenhouse facility

1. You say it's a greenhouse...is it made of glass that won't break?

Monsanto's corporate reputation

1. ...Monsanto has a checkered history, toxic waste, bad community relations and then the cleanup of the waste is foisted on local governments or the feds...
2. In Western Farm Press Magazine Mr. Kai, who you purchased the property from, mentioned that the seed and the germplasm will be used in field trials in Marana and that's really concerning to me as a Marana resident and the proximity of the high school, plus we don't know if you are going to do this on the larger acreage, no clarity on that, and the new chemicals involved; Roundup Extends – which I understand is your new product... It's a major concern for the people here...based on Monsanto's history...the article also had a researcher from the UA about previous 6,000 plant research they have done and called it the advance guard for this facility...he also mentioned that Monsanto was a client, so it sounds like there was some type of payment, from the quotation from him in that article. Transparency is key...there's a history with Monsanto in State of Washington for PCB's...we don't want that here.

Chemicals and technology used at the proposed facility

1. Is there any new type of technology at this facility, or new type of corn or new type of soil or chemicals that hasn't been experimented with before?
2. Will there be new strains of chemicals used in this corn or in this facility?
3. Have you done an environmental impact study on the consequences of the waste from this facility...soils, chemical water...do you know the volume of the waste?
4. Monsanto has said that by 2025 they want to have their crops (*resistant?*) to other chemicals, other than Roundup. Is this something you're going to be bringing in to this operation?
5. You say the greenhouse will be completely enclosed but then how do the bugs get in?

Herbicides and pesticides potentially used on the property

1. Are you going to talk about the herbicide and pesticides or are you saying you're not using those?
2. Will glyphosate be used at all in the greenhouse?
3. Glyphosate has been identified as a probable carcinogen by the World Health Organization. What do you say that?

Water use and water contamination

1. You say a lot of the water is reused but your site says 100 percent of the water is recaptured and reused.

Floodplain, flooding and hydrology issues at the Monsanto property

1. What are you doing about the floodplain?
2. In the 100- year floodplain where this is, we need to make sure its properly protected so it's not adversely impacting the surrounding properties or that

the floodplain hurts your project...you also said this would be a totally enclosed project so runoff would have to go in to a basin that would need to be lined with a geo-textile to protect the soil, the soil in that area are sandy...there's concern about that water getting in to the ground and neighboring wells and aquifers...

Use of the 155-acre property besides the proposed 7-acre greenhouse

1. What are you going to do with the other 148 acres? We're not that naive to think you're not going to do anything with it...are you going to build more greenhouses? Open farming? When can we expect transparency?
2. So why would you spend money on something you didn't need?
3. Saying the land was vacant when it was bought was wrong it was actually being farmed by my father...

Wildlife and ecological issues

1. The leading factor in the 90 percent decline in the monarch butterfly is pesticide, and the U.S. fish and game wildlife services say that it is specifically Monsanto's pesticide. I don't know how many people know this but our Desert Museum is not too far from this site, as well as Saguaro National Park, and monarch butterflies migrate through Arizona - and the Desert Museum has started to tag them so we know exactly how many are coming through and if your chemicals are killing the milkweed, which is the main source of food, how can you allow that to happen? How can you mess with our ecosystem like that?
2. ...My biggest problem with Monsanto is their horrible track record of environmental damage – Washington was the first state to sue Monsanto

for leaving tens of millions of dollars of cleanup of toxins with the state holding the bag and I don't want that for Pima County.

Human health effects of the proposed facility

1. I live in the Marana Unified School District and I'm particularly concerned about the school and children being nearby...in Hawaii, they had to close the schools because of Monsanto chemicals.
2. Is there any record keeping of people who work out in the fields for Monsanto for increased incidence of Valley Fever? Would Monsanto be willing to investigate what the background of Valley Fever is in the Marana area as a baseline?
3. My father was a chemical engineer for Monsanto from 1960 to 1974 he was working on Roundup. In 1994 he died of lung cancer and his doctor said it was related to the chemicals he breathed in. Who will be the monitor of your "mild" use of pesticides? What seeds does you dad use on his fields.
4. I'm a health researcher and I have never heard once about Monsanto be good for our health...When you're a health researcher you understand what impact these GMOs have on your health...I help people with their health and all I have to do is have them eat organic. I would never have them eat GMO...I'm opposed to letting Monsanto put roots here – no good will come of it.
5. I'm also a graduate student at the UA and I'm finding it very difficult to sort out what is bias and what is a conflict of interest here...we're trying to sort out what is trustable and what is accurate...my concern is the high school ...from my research I understand the neurotoxicity and the growing evidence of adolescent susceptibility...can cause mental illness such as schizophrenia...I don't want my children close to this green house or whatever may come after it.

Effects of the proposed facility on the local economy

1. We have desert dust devils, haboobs, Valley Fever - and you combine that with toxic pesticides and you're going to have a tourism industry nightmare. Tourism provides 24,000 jobs here in Pima County which brings in \$197.3 million in direct tax revenue. We have been recognized as a UNESCO City of Gastronomy, we have a rich heritage of cuisine we want to protect – we are a culinary food destination site. We want health species, which includes bees, birds, and horses at the White Stallion Ranch which is a destination for European visitors...
2. I am president of the Tucson Metro Chamber of Commerce and represent 1,500 member businesses and 160,000 employees and I come to support Monsanto's request for an FTZ designation and Pima County's endorsement of the FTZ. Among the many organizations I visit with every week are many charitable not-for-profit organizations...they are united in one message – that our community does not have enough jobs or enough well-paying jobs and we suffer unfortunate outcomes – crime rises, domestic and child abuse rises...Tucson Metro Chamber welcomes and supports Monsanto's plan to build the facility...yes it will create STEM jobs, but it will have a bigger impact for suppliers and the presence of another Fortune 200 company will send a message that Pima County welcomes job creators...The chamber respectfully asks that the Pima County Board of Supervisors vote yes on this agreement.

The public information meetings conducted by Pima County

1. I was expecting a very different setting than how these meetings are being held. I thought our Supervisor Ally Miller -our supervisor for this district - was going to address us directly.
2. I have so much respect for the expertise and your ability to take information from a group of people who are emotional about this topic but don't trust Monsanto.

3. I don't feel that we should be told to shorten our comments when Monsanto was able to provide an entire video. I would have liked to have run a video documentary showing the effects of Monsanto in Hawaii and other places.

Federal Regulation

1. You say you're regulated and say it's not a problem...I don't trust it. I have a health condition that the EPA stonewalled. I love the science here that we're discussing and I would like to see it be used for organic gardening because that's all I can eat and be well. Because we don't trust Monsanto, with the attorney with the FDA becoming Monsanto director...

The Pima County Foreign Trade Zone/Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement

1. I want to strongly express my opposition to the FTZ designation and the tax breaks that come with it. Monsanto is a multi-billion dollar company that can afford and should pay their full taxes like us and small businesses here...Monsanto plans on spending \$90 million or more and their \$500,000 in taxes is a drop in the bucket for them...it will be shortchanging the library system, the state schools, Marana schools and Pima County. Instead we should be supporting our small sustainable farmers, fixing our roads...it's only 40 to 60 jobs with no guarantee they will be local hires and the salary will be around \$44,000 a year...Monsanto has a reputation for poisoning people...it's a threat to our Sonoran Desert...a high school is a half mile away...Monsanto is not worth it I don't trust them and a tax break would be selling us out for a few measly jobs.

2. I'm opposed to giving tax breaks to Monsanto, just this last year I had the opportunity to run unsuccessfully for county assessor and I did learn that this community cares about its values and we should not be giving tax breaks to Monsanto...and if we give our blessings to this and it goes

through then the county and the county and the county assessor have no choice than to grant that tax class change.

3. I think not only should Pima County not give Monsanto a tax break but they need to have money paid by Monsanto and put in to escrow to cover future clean up so the state and federal governments aren't left holding the bag...the county would do well to hold something in escrow.
4. I just want it on the record that I oppose both the FTZ and the tax break. I know at this point it's a done deal – they bought the land, they're here – I just want to say I oppose everything about that mostly because they have a poor track record at Monsanto...the educated people are beginning to understand about this issue, the GMO issue, pesticide and herbicide issues Monsanto has presented...I too come from a farming family and not one of my relatives is still in business because it's all about corporate farming. I also own two businesses in town and I don't see how this tax break helps Tucson...
5. It wasn't quite clear in the documents that if the company didn't achieve certain performance markers that they wouldn't be refunded money.
6. There's a business law in this state that prevents us from rejecting their application. It's called the commerce clause. However, Arizona voters passed Prop. 122 that says we can reject any federal action we deem unconstitutional. Clearly, the health effects, the GMO issue alone, I would say that's a red herring...I think you should reject the notion that we can't do anything. Prop. 122 is very clear...the county commissioners should raise the tax 10,000, 20,000 percent...the county commissioners have the ability to make their own laws and have judicial roles. The

greatest atrocities of mankind were considered legal by the court system; this interstate commerce clause is the only thing allowing it to be legal...

7. You have three members of the University of Arizona here from your county commission. What is their capacity? Can I ask them to disclose in detail whatever research they have and the amounts of grants from Monsanto. I want them to confirm and deny...
8. If the Monsanto gets the FTZ designation, they are allowed to act outside the boundaries of the United States and that gives them more leeway to do what they want. Is that correct?

Organic gardening and farming

1. You're for the farmer, and I want to support organic farmers and that's where I spend my money, at farmers' markets, organic – in fact, I don't want you here at all.
2. Step in my shoes, when I was 73 and retired... I had time on my hands and researched advocates of real whole foods ...my son was on the same path and starting growing real food using (organic methods) I'll be celebrating my 80 birthday and I'm no longer retired or tired and help my customers at three farmers' markets...the idea of someone testing unproved seeds and toxic chemicals is a direct threat to my livelihood and a risk to my grandchildren who live in the area...we know that glyphosate drifts for more than a mile...and killed 30-foot mesquite trees in a riparian area Pima County was supposed to protect...is the county willing to assume the liability for the health of young adults that may be impacted when there are zero studies saying it's safe.

DISTRICT 2 COMMENT SUMMARY

Activity inside the proposed greenhouse facility

1. Is the corn grown in the greenhouse edible by humans? Is it for humans to eat or for cattle? Or corn syrup? Is it the kind you eat as corn on the cob?
2. What else are you planning to grow in the greenhouse besides corn?
3. Are you planning to grow marijuana? Monsanto is involved in GMO cannabis seed.
4. This is my fifth district meeting and I noticed inconsistencies in your answers that make me uncomfortable. It contribute to the lack of trust in you company. I just want to read a quote from Monsanto's communication manager: "Monsanto is involved in various field trials in Arizona and works with schools like the University of Arizona and other growers in the state." Your previous statement you said just rent properties (from UA) so that was an inconsistency and last night you said there wasn't going to be any Roundup, or minimal, in the greenhouse yet but my son asked a question at the first meeting and you said you were going to be using glyphosate.

GMO (Genetically Modified Organism)

1. Will the GMO corn have (*unintelligible*) antibiotic traits and will it need to be registered? So we can get a list of all the GMO proteins that will be in the corn?

2. If your pollen escaped and contaminated someone's conventional corn here, what would happen? Would you file suit? Would that corn then be your intellectual property?
3. I'm a part time resident of Marana, half the year I live in Minnesota – in the Corn Belt. On the farm where I grew up in 1956, an acre yielded *(Unintelligible) bushels to the acre*. Today that same land yields 300 bushels to the acre. We are very proud that we have been able to increase our yield so we can feed a hungry world and growing population. I want to thank the county for having these meetings and having good open discussion. I also want to thank Monsanto...don't believe everything you read on the internet. The fact is that genetically modified seeds have been proved safe by hundreds of studies...scientific studies all over the world on the biosafety of GM foods...
4. If you are growing GMO for specific products why are most of our foods contaminated with GMO?
5. Are you saying that another company is making GMO foods exactly as you are and is putting them in the market? Did you teach them? Honestly. Do you think that GMO crops are safe for all human beings? This was a picture of me when I was younger, look at me from ingesting GMO crops in to my body. Does that look natural or human? I was covered head to toe in a rash. Is this natural?
6. I'm from here. This is my land. I'm a Vietnam veteran with 100 percent disability because of the Agent Orange Monsanto gave me...I'm not going to beg you and ask you to back down. I'm demanding. I don't need this garbage...I'm from the Southside; my family was one of like the second ones out there, where Congressman Raul Grijalva is from. We lived in a tent out there, we raised our own chickens and food...I don't want to hear this bull jive that genetics feeds the whole world. God made a stalk of corn with one ear...not four here, six here. You guys are not going to win.

7. I'm actually a supporter of biotechnology in agriculture...I appreciate your concerns. I work for the Arizona Farm Bureau and I help farmers but I will tell you my story, my family has farmed in Pima and Pinal counties...we planted out first biotech and we never looked back. We grew it for nine years and reduced our pesticide use on our cotton by 100 percent...my tagline now is the Arizona Farm Bureau represents the small medium and large farms. We represent organic...conventional and biotech. It's all good.

1. ...It sounds like you've put a lot though it to preventing pollen from escaping the facility, but Native Seed SEARCH is trying to promote biodiversity and you could potentially contaminate our precious heritage seeds...You're asking us to trust you...what is your contingency plan if pollen or chemicals get in to our environment or genetically alter our plants?

Monsanto's corporate reputation

2. Is there anything you would like to say or clarify about Monsanto being fined by the EPA in Idaho?
3. We don't want you here. You can't be trusted and your record proves that.
4. Bayer is merging with Monsanto but they are going to drop the Monsanto name to not sully their reputation. Bayer were Nazi industrialists who used slave labor and gas to kill millions. In 1995 a Bayer executive apologized for their role in the Holocaust. And this is the company that's worried about Monsanto...

Chemicals and technology used at the proposed facility

1. It's the chemicals...I changed my diet to natural and my cancer doctor says I'm doing great. He says whatever you're doing, just keep doing it... How do the bugs die that eat the chemicals in their GMO? It burns a hole in their gut and they die. It could be an hour or a day, but it dies. The bug is this big. I'm this big. I'm two and a half years GMO free, processed food free...why is there so much illness. When Reagan was in the White House, they banned GMO from the White House; I hope they didn't for the last eight years. Maybe we need to start talking to the people in Washington and say come out to Arizona. We have a problem...or the Arizona legislature.

Herbicides and pesticides potentially used on the property

1. What is the difference between a bug eating GMO pesticides and a human eating GMO? How do you know it's not going to affect us if it kills the bug? Have your pesticides been tested for human consumption?

Floodplain, flooding and hydrology issues at the Monsanto property

1. Where is the water going to come from and where is going to go from this facility?

The 155-acre property and the proposed 7-acre greenhouse

1. Who sold the land to Monsanto? Is Herb Kai here tonight? Was it sold at market value? Do you think there was anything nefarious with the councilman?

Wildlife and ecological issues

1. You understand your company's threat to our biodiversity. Is it part of your company's code of ethics to protect biodiversity? Ten years from now I don't want all on our plants being GMO.
2. Did you know we have native corn here that is developed specifically to our environment?

3. Did you know that Monsanto is purchasing seeds from Native Seed SEARCH?

Human health effects

1. ...My son was born with chronic health issues, massive GI issues, and then at five days old we stopped all his GMO foods and everything went away. Any time he ate it he got sick...now not everyone reacts as he does, but it's cumulative - we are all sickly people from GMO foods...
2. Diabetes, asthma, heart problems, organ damage, vascular problems, gastrointestinal problems, cancer...all from the introduction of GMO in to our food...that your company and other companies have put in our food supply...

Effects of the proposed facility on the local economy

1. ...We make our money off of tourism here in Arizona. A lot of it. In 2015, we had 42.1 million people visit here and collectively spent \$21 billion...does the board have a way to make up for those losses when the people don't visit...

The public information meetings conducted by Pima County

1. ...we appreciate these meetings. People have come together and they all have the same concerns. I'm asking if there is any way we can extend these meetings? We need more time...there's so many that haven't been contacted, like schools and daycares, national parks...tourism and trade businesses, local environmental groups, environmental lawyers. Is there any one from health care present? All these people need to be contacted and brought in to these conversations. There should also be other members of the science commission who aren't from the UA – there is

conflict of interest...I do hope we can continue these wonderful constructive dialogues.

The Pima County Foreign Trade Zone/Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement

1. Would Pima County arrange a community meeting with Bayer pharmaceutical that just acquired Monsanto?
2. According to the memorandum, it says Pima County has not identified any negative air quality impacts, water quality impacts...no negative impacts...so what impact studies have been done?
3. and Huckelberry, I'm sorry to say...I don't like when someone has secret meetings with Monsanto...and in an article I was reading, I guess he must be a Democrat because he had secret emails with Price Waterhouse Coopers - Mr. Huckelberry, isn't that interesting? We don't want companies, we want jobs and this is only like 40 jobs. And then they want to raise our sales tax but give Huckelberry another \$8,000? Why are you *(unintelligible?)*
4. Is it because it's a FTZ that it doesn't require a federal environmental impact study?
5. Who in Pima County was involved in these discussions since March? Did the county or Sun Corridor Inc. approach Monsanto?
6. Maybe on the State of Arizona agency conflict of interest handbook, maybe you can explain why it isn't a conflict of interest for District 3 Supervisor Sharon Bronson to be both Chair of the Board of Supervisors and on the Board at Sun Corridor, Inc.? (Is her role at Sun Corridor a paid position?)
The public thinks it's a conflict of interest

7. The county tries to expedite permitting through Development services?
Why expedite? Expedite means removing safeguards.
8. The science commission that is set up has a part that says if there are problems, they have a contract with the University of Arizona for research and analysis...the cost is going to be reimbursed by Monsanto, how is that not bias or conflict of interest?
9. Why is this the first time that we are seeing that Monsanto will have a representative on the science commission?
10. What is the relationship between the science commission and the community committee? We don't know if one can overrule the other?
11. The memorandum of understanding is voluntary and we can't trust them.
12. Can the vote on February 21 (by the Board of Supervisors) actually prevent Monsanto from operating? It sounds like a done deal. Does the state have a role in this?
13. Has Marana already received its \$500,000 under the PILOT agreement?
14. What does it mean that the FTZ board in its regulations can deny companies that are conducting activities that are unsafe or dangerous?
15. Please explain what the MOU is and where I can find it?
16. With the merger with Bayer, I want to know what the county is thinking in granting tax breaks to two multi-billion dollar corporations who have proven to be socially and environmentally irresponsible? You should start a super fund with that money to clean up the mess that might happen there.

17. Why are you helping a company that causes cancer? By giving them a tax break you are encouraging them.
18. Can you provide us contact information for the FTZ board in Washington?
19. If your job is to create jobs in economic development, but the people who live here don't want to be exposed to Monsanto, which has a horrible track record.
20. I've been speaking with Daniela Gallagher of Sun Corridor and she told me if one of the local governments doesn't provide a letter of no objection they will not move the FTZ application forward.
21. Why do I not see Pima Community College in the PILOT?
22. Has the county heard from the City of Tucson on the UNESCO Designation City of Gastronomy and how Monsanto would affect that?
23. Why doesn't the state regulate and stop this?
24. If your company doesn't get the FTZ designation will you still move forward with the facility?
25. Why does your company think it deserves a tax break?
26. I want to address the question that is before the board, which is the foreign trade zone question. You have a lot of opposition in this room, so obviously you shouldn't enter a letter of non-objection. It appears there are only two members of the FTZ board – the Secretary of Commerce and the Secretary of the Treasury...so hopefully we will find out who they are soon. We don't want you. You're not a good neighbor; the chemicals in GMO have been proven to be bad.

27....If you live in this district, go over there and tell him how you feel. Give him your name, tell him you live here. For those of you who live in my district, did you know that 162 countries banned Monsanto from being there? Ask yourself why...communities where they've been are suing. They pollute the ground, they pollute the water. Do you want that in Pima County? If you know your kids might get cancer, are you going to feed them this...we know we can't stop them from coming here, but you need to tell that gentleman back there who represents us in District 2 that we don't want them here. Supervisor Valadez. He's back there...let's focus on our health...not these tax breaks

28. Absolutely under no circumstance should we enter this letter on no objection. As you've heard at all the Board of Supervisors meetings, all the public meetings – we object, and we're prepared to mobilize recalls if need be.

DISTRICT 3 COMMENT SUMMARY

(Note: Some duplicate concerns have not been listed here but are available on the District 3 Monsanto Information Meeting audio file.)

Activity inside the proposed greenhouse facility

1. When the plants are spent, then they're mulched and set aside there has to be some latent soil or pesticide remaining that can get in to our environment, in to our water supply...is it treated somehow so that the mulch doesn't affect the outside environment...how is the compost processed in a closed system?
2. Where does the compost go that you don't use? Where does it go? It doesn't give me confidence that you don't know how you're going to handle it.
3. I'm concerned about the vent mesh will have pollen left on it and it will escape and that could contaminate fields and you could file a lawsuit for your patent. Whatever the board can do to oversee you...
4. Can you tell us how you can take corn that has been completely controlled – water, temperature, bugs – and you can grow that in a greenhouse here and how is going to use that highly controlled plant in a field in Massachusetts? Or is the greenhouse experimental and does the company plan to put more greenhouses on the property to expand it?
5. We want to know how they're truly going to control the activity in the greenhouse. How they intend to control it.

GMO (Genetically Modified Organism)

1. What happens if bugs get in to the greenhouse and eats the GMO, what happens to the bug? Then why would you think that safe on humans?
2. In all the literature I've read I keep coming across the same information that GMO crop does not increase the yield and is not sustainable...a lot of information I've seen just doesn't support increased yield and benefit. Can you direct me to peer reviewed studies that prove GMO increases yield?
3. My concern is continually seeking and building resistance for a Valley Fever fungi and the reason I'm concerned is there is a gene silencing spray, an RNA that networks in so many ways and it might just be similar to the selection of super weeds in the cornfields. We might end up with a much more aggressive Valley Fever. So my question is how will the effluent from the facility? Because that water is flowing over a very industrialized plant factory be handled...we have a soil that is prone to Valley Fever...are you going to have a baseline study so we have an understanding?
4. As a Pima County Planning and Zoning commissioner for the past 12 years I have seen the county's impressive record of sustainable land use, conception in our development practices and promoting economic prosperity...sometimes for the public good the county says no to some uncertain risky projects that may not deliver their promised benefit... (In Mexico) it's a national law banning GMO. We should be learning from the Mexicans...we should all do our homework on real solutions to food production in a time of climate change...permaculture, not the resource intensive mono-crop industrial agriculture promoted by Monsanto. Like the Rosemont Mine proposal, Pima County should say no Monsanto and say no to their bid to receive FTZ benefits...
5. I farm in the Marana area and I'm not here to speak in favor or against Monsanto. I'm just here to shed a little light on what is happening in the Marana area. We have great concerns as well...I've seen those pesticide applications go from 12 to 17 per season down to one. This year none...I

can't speak to the safety of GMO in our environment today. I can only speak about the safer environment that my children and now my grandchildren live in ...this is about the world. This is about people who don't have nearly the tools at their disposal we do, who don't eat...part of that is the tools we use that Monsanto has developed...my land is safer.

Organic Farming

1. I'm a farmer too...before when I was 275 pounds and clinically depressed and had degenerative diseases but after I started farming and stopped eating Monsanto products I lost 50 pounds...I reversed my chronic illness and I'm happier than ever. Monsanto's sustainability fear-mongering brainwash propaganda video is the direct antitheses of how I farm...Monsanto's foods are not edible in early stage for humans. They must be processed in to corn syrup and fillers and hidden in fast food or force fed to animals. That's not going to help feed a growing world. Not one that will thrive...more and more people have decided we have had enough of this. For the love of food and the love of our land we are taking back our power...Monsanto is making it harder for people like me to afford land...the future of farming is standing in front of you Pima County today...Pima County please do not give conglomerate agribusiness a tax break. My advice is you help small scale farmers and young ones like me who are going to be feeding you guys when you're older...

Monsanto's corporate reputation

1. I'm aware of Monsanto past in Costa Rica...I spoke to the president of Costa Rica and he said Sen. Jesse Helms went there frequently to protect Monsanto...and then what happened was the Monsanto seeds, the essence of those crops contaminated the organic crops and that's what I fear happening here. Are you aware a million people have gathered in Argentina and stopped Monsanto? I want to know if Pima County cares about the next seven generations.

2. Do you get great stock options and benefits for poisoning all these people?
3. ...if you get a chance look up Monsanto on the internet. I did that the other day and spent the day and the evening and the next day – it’s a horror show...the alarm that it raises is a serious concern for me - the lawsuits and controversy that goes on and on...the WHO conclude there a highly causal relationship between glyphosate and cancer...I lived in a community and worked in a factory that was polluted and 50 years it’s still contaminated by GE and many children dies...I urge the county the risk we are taking versus the petty benefit we receive.
4. Somebody said before you should just go on the internet. Here’s just one example: the testing AARC has been intimidate, and the EPA has gone through the same thing. There was a time they were going to report that herbicides are cancer causing but the Monsanto reprehensive person came to intimidate them...not to find glyphosate a danger...I think that should be a concern. And I found in my research that the County is using a lot of herbicide to kill weeds because it’s easier that way. Is some scientist going to be testifying to the Board of Supervisors?

Chemicals and technology used at the proposed facility

1. I’ve read where every waterway in the State of Washington is now contaminated. I’m aware of at least 10 municipalities that have filed suit against Monsanto for environ mental damage on the West Coast...I’m not eager to add Pima County to this list. I understand you don’t have the authority to just say “Monsanto, you’re out” but we can at least not give them this letter of no objection...in its most recent suit against Monsanto, the Port of Portland knew that PCBs were widely contaminating natural resources, Monsanto concealed these facts and continued producing PCBs...I urge you to vote no on the letter of no objection.

The 155-acre property and the proposed 7-acre greenhouse

1. What will Monsanto do with the rest of the property wants they have an FTZ benefit and a tax break on the whole property? What is the purpose of this corn? It should be in Iowa.
2. You said at a previous meeting you would likely plant a cover crop on the excess land. Will it be conventional or GMO? You say two acres for seed processing? Is that enclosed or open? Is Monsanto willing to sign a document pledging no GMO will be planted outside the greenhouse in perpetuity?

Wildlife and ecological issues

1. Thanks to the Pima County Board of Supervisors for these listening meetings and for standing up for Sonoran Desert biodiversity as exemplified by the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan that I served on the steering committee for...I've lived in a critical habitat corridor designated by Pima County...not far from Monsanto's proposal. I want to ask our Board of Supervisors to stand with this community and protect agriculture biodiversity... the way you have led our state in protecting the biodiversity of our Sonoran Desert landscape...this is something to address at the state level and we all will stand with you. How can we work with you to go to the state and say let's not do this here

Human health effects

1. I'm a board certified clinical nutritionist...in the last 10 years my practice as become increasingly complicated I believe that the great increase in digestive problems, glandular disorders and much more are due to toxins in our food...research has proven the dangers of GMPO and glyphosate in humans, animals and the environment...Pima County should not offer tax

incentives to Monsanto and navigate the deadly health consequences that are increasing and will continue to increase...please consider the long term consequences when you vote on February 21...

Effects of the proposed facility on the local economy

1. Talking to Visit Tucson and thinking about the UNESCO Tucson City of Gastronomy designation, how are you weighing the impact on the tourism economy? Visit Tucson said last year it was worth \$13.3 million. How can we evaluate this? Foodies are very particular and I would think 100 percent of them would not eat GMO. How is that going to be evaluated?
2. I'm also concerned about the city of gastronomy designation and our food and cultural heritage. Who will be in charge, who is protecting our rich heritage of native seeds that they won't be pollinated by the greenhouse? I want to know who will be protecting that. Mission Gardens and Native Seed SEARCH have protected that heritage. Who is having that conversation at Pima County?

The public information meetings conducted by Pima County

1. Why have no meetings been scheduled in the Avra Valley where the facility is going to be located? We're ground zero. Marana High School is a half mile away. It's 20 miles for Avra Valley people to come to any of these meetings. It's like you're trying to keep us out.

The Pima County Foreign Trade Zone/Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement

1. Are the agreements Pima County has with Monsanto valid when the merger with Bayer occurs? So a pharmaceutical company and a GMO company representing to the county.

2. Did the county do any studies with realtors to see if there would be a loss of property value in area around the facility? No? So there might be a property value loss?
3. I represent the Avra Valley Coalition. With Monsanto closing or has closed three other facilities...eliminating 90 jobs. How many of these 40 or so jobs here would actually go to unemployed Pima County residents and how many would go to Monsanto employees being dislocated elsewhere.
4. There have been suits against Monsanto for toxic waste cleanup. Is the county going to do anything to mitigate and possible future taxpayer responsible cleanup? There's no bond or anything?
5. I'm on the Pima County Board of Supervisors website and I just want to quote the responsibility of the five member board is to work to ensure safe communities, economic development, sustainable managed natural resources...what will Pima County do if they approve this 66 percent tax break and there's a health concern or a cleanup that has to happen...it would be wise to deny the tax break.
6. If Pima County doesn't approve the FTZ PILOT, why do they send the letter of no objection? What is the tax reduction if they do approve the FTZ PILOT and send the letter of no objection?
7. I'm opposed to Monsanto even if they're paying 100 percent tax...I urge the supervisors to vote no. We don't want the company here.
8. Why did it take so long to schedule these information meetings after the Board of Supervisors meeting?
9. Why is Monsanto allowed to show a video and we are not?

10. Help me understand: if they get the tax break, they will report what is going on in the facility. If they don't get the tax break, they don't report? Is that true? How do we believe the validity of the reporting?
11. This MOU thing keeps coming up. It seems to me that if this company is really trying to be a good neighbor, open and honest, that shouldn't be required. They should want to do that, to be open...even if just because all these people here want to know what they are going to do in the facility.
12. For a foreign trade zone approval, the designation must adequately serve the public interest and it must not be detrimental to public health or safety...so, just by that little part of FTZ regulation it seems to me that this should be a non-issue. They should not be able to qualify...it should be the Board of Supervisors carrying the message to the FTZ board that this does not serve the public interest.
13. What other considerations are the supervisors taking in to account besides their constituent's wishes toward the letter of no objections? Is it enough that their constituents oppose it?
14. Does Pima County consider corporations to be people that have the same rights as us? Does Pima County not have the ability to not make its own laws? And they could levy a huge tax on Monsanto...but there's enough people to get the company kept out - or recalls, there's been talk of recalls on Facebook... you're just saying the companies will regulate themselves instead of the county commissioners doing it...
15. With Bayer about to pay \$60 million for Monsanto, why do you need a tax break from us?
16. I would tell the supervisors to please stand up for us and watch out for all of us who are busy working and with our lives and please don't give Monsanto a tax break.

17. I don't feel a \$60 billion company need this, Gov. Ducey signed a budget that was around \$10 billion and Monsanto wants a tax break. The roads are just horrible and there's talk of a half-cent sales tax, so how can you justify not paying your fair share.

18. I'm speaking for the board of directors of the Tucson Mountains Association and we have very sincere concerns about letting this go forward...our biggest concern is the integrity of this community...

My name is Lauren Kanzler. I am a board certified clinical nutritionist , I've been working in the Tucson community in private practice for over 35 years, counseling people of all ages, and for many varieties of physical ailments. I want to share with you this evening that in this last 10 years, my practice has become increasingly complicated ... I believe it to be mostly due to great increases in digestive problems, glandular disorders, and much more due to toxins now in our food.

Research has proven the dangers of GMO's, and glyphosate – to humans, animals, and the environment... and to boot, weeds and pests are becoming more resilient. Pima County should not offer tax incentives to Monsanto – believe me, over the course of time, we are going to need that money and all of our resources to support the future health of this community and navigate the devastating health consequences that are increasing and will continue to increase.

In the past 10 years I have seen a tremendous increase in the problems of the digestive system – which is my areas of expertise. . I'm seeing it in all ages but also many more of our younger generation coping now with severe intestinal problems like chronic constipation, reflux disorder, IBS, IBD, gluten sensitivity, bacterial and yeast over-growth, gastric paresis, and severely depleted micro-biomes. Also, massive increases in food allergies and auto-immune problems.

...Those of us that understand physiology of the GI tract - know that auto-immune conditions have their origins in the dysfunctions of the gut, leaky gut syndrome (which has been scientifically linked to glyphosate) ... where the gut barrier function is broken down and damaged and now undigested food molecules are able to infiltrate the blood stream and the immune system cannot recognize these undigested food compounds. From there the immune system goes into a red alert, attacking everything in its path, including the healthy tissues, and this is known as the auto-immune precursor.

It has also been scientifically proven that glyphosate suppresses critical enzymes in the liver that are needed for detoxification of environmental chemicals, hormones, and pharmaceutical drugs. If these enzymes don't work properly, our bodies cannot clear metabolic wastes and environmental toxins. The build-up of these xenobiotic toxins will cause myriads of health problems and indeed decreased life span along with huge medical bills.

When a client comes to me for help with these problems, the protocol is to completely eliminate all GM foods, and recommend supportive supplements along with eating only organic foods to decrease the toxic burden. And they do indeed get well again. I can help these people who can afford to pay.

But what do I do for the young mother of 5 who comes to me only because she happens to have insurance that covers my time. How will I help her? She can barely afford to put the food on the table. I struggle with what to tell these clients. Do I tell them the truth -- only to have them leave my office feeling completely depressed? How do I help these people and these families? I will tell you in a nutshell, no matter how experienced I am, there is not a lot I can do. They simply cannot afford the expensive supplements and organic foods necessary to shift the dangerous consequences of a diet that contains GMO's. And what about all the people who don't have insurance or decent health care?

Chances are these children will grow up to a harder life, with a variety of health and mood problems. They are at a disadvantage going into their adult worlds and may or may not become productive members of our community. Who will foot this bill?? It will be society's burden to address this growing problem, and Monsanto will be off the hook.

Please consider the long term, broader picture when you vote on Feb 21st. Monsanto does not need a tax break nor do they deserve it.

As a Pima County Planning & Zoning Commissioner for the past 12 years I have witnessed the County's impressive record of sustainable land use, species protection, smart development practices, and promoting economic prosperity. Sometimes to further the public good, the County says no to uncertain, risky projects which may not deliver their promised benefits.

Like the Rosemont Mine proposal, Pima County should say no to Monsanto and reject their bid to receive Foreign Trade Zone benefits and tax subsidies. As a Free Trade Zone, Monsanto would be allowed to lower its operating costs by reducing U.S. Customs duties on imported goods. Why would Pima County risk our branding as World City of Gastronomy with a 4,000-year history of food crop evolution? Why would we welcome Monsanto with gifts and then reap the backlash by associating with Monsanto, one of the world's most reviled and protested corporations.

Monsanto appears to be aiming for markets south of the border and elsewhere, both sales of GMO seed and locating GMO seed production in countries like Mexico for export back into U.S. and Canada. Concerns about health effects aside, recent major studies comparing the North American GMO crop experience with the non-GMO crops of Northern Europe where GMO's are largely banned, shows little difference in crop yields and chemical pesticide use. Promise of higher yields and less use of chemicals have been the two main arguments supporting GMO proliferation. Newly acquired by the German chemical giant Bayer, Monsanto can't sell their unwanted GMO products there, so they are looking to the developing world for sales. As for Monsanto's possible role in solving our invasive species

problems in Pima County, forget it. There are more sustainable approaches, and unending increases in chemical applications in the Sonoran Desert is not the answer.

Having just returned from holidays in Oaxaca, Mexico, I witnessed firsthand the Mexican resolve to protect their past while preparing for the future by continuing to evolve their rich plant heritage. Many common food plants now enjoyed around the planet were cultivated first by the peoples of Mesoamerica. Corn, beans, chilies, and squash in particular have been the dietary mainstays in this region for thousands of years. Go to Oaxaca for one of the most tantalizing, delicious food experiences ever. But remember, the Mexicans do not want Monsanto's GMO corn. In fact, it's a national law. It should be the other way around. We should be learning from the Mexicans. The Botanical Garden in Oaxaca is a good start.

We all should do our homework on real solutions to food production in a time of global climate change. For example, The Land Institute in Salina, Kansas is pioneering the promising approach of perennial food crops. Currently 85% of human food calories come from annual plants, seeded and plowed annually. Such disturbance is both costly and erosive of soil carbon and other nutrients as well as perpetuating plants which have poor resistance to global warming and climate change. Domestication of wild perennials and perennializing annual food crops promise long-lived plants with deep root systems that can withstand the new temperature extremes and climate volatility we see with emerging climate change. These perennials are developed using age-old traditional techniques which are compatible with the more sustainable path of "ecologically intensive" agriculture – also known as permaculture. Say No to the unsustainable, resource-intensive, mono crop industrial agriculture promoted by Monsanto.

My name is Echo Casey, I'm an alum of the UofA and I currently teach at Pima community college! But I am first and foremost a citizen, born and raised in Tucson Arizona!

Tucson, Pima county, and our surrounding neighborhoods and barrios have always made up a resilient quilt-work of food cultures; this quilt is comprised of a unique and abundant array of native foodstuffs, fused with Spanish & Mexican traditional eats, and infused with a modern American twist! For this unique food heritage, we have been designated a World City of Gastronomy by UNESCO! As the first city in America to have been bestowed this prestigious title, it's our duty to protect our food heritage by finding sustainable ways to maintain the genetic and cultural biodiversity of our region! We have one of the world's most prized seed libraries, containing almost 2,000 arid-lands adapted heirloom seed varieties! We have robust community, school and home gardens and a complex system of indigenous farming cultures, all of which provide a cornucopia of tasty fruits and vegetables to the many prestigious and lesser-known chefs producing imaginative culinary creations for Tucsonans and tourists alike! Our food culture here is a part of who we are and it is also crucial to preserve our food heritage if we hope to remain a unique place with a viable cultural and economic future!

Now here comes Monsanto, the big bad wolf in Sheeps clothing...trying to convince us to let them in so they can force their poison apples down our throats! They promise to offer jobs, though very few will be created at this new site; they promise to improve our economy, though our closest foreign trade partner, Mexico does not want GMO products on their market; they promise to contain their poisonous chemicals and Frankenstein corn and soy pollen, though all it takes is a gust of wind for them to contaminate our heirloom crops with their patented and genetically modified seed stock! And just imagine what will we be left with when they have depleted our soils, contaminated our water and air, and pulled up their roots to seek out greener pastures to take over...nothing but the dusty footprint of yet another corporate takeover, and the tattered remains of our once robust food heritage!

Activity inside the proposed greenhouse facility

1. Are there filters on the vents to prevent cross pollination?
2. How are you going to not have cross pollination in the greenhouse when you're growing both conventional and GMO corn?
3. What keeps the environmental issues in the greenhouse from getting out?

GMO (Genetically Modified Organism)

1. Can I and the board get a file of your studies that show your (Monsanto's) technology is safe?
2. Are you going to use organic Arizona seed to cross with your GMO seed?
3. Will you disclose to the public your experimental use permit?
4. I don't want you continue to say your GMO crops have decreased the use of pesticides when there are too many studies that say it doesn't decrease pesticide use.

Monsanto's corporate reputation

1. I find it extremely disturbing when you state that you're not finding any evidence of the effects of GMO or pesticides because the fact is there are hundreds of websites that Monsanto has financed that are arguing in favor of GMO and there may be dozens that argue against it...but you have to apply logic. Often the simplest explanation is correct. There are hundreds of years of history of them bribing governments, getting kicked out of governments, destroying the ecosystem...they've been involved in the highest levels of corruption over 500 offices in our federal government are filled with Monsanto representatives...
2. I take issue with their corporate ethics. They were part of the Manhattan Project which was a huge failure...the lie, why would we want to take a risk...if you are for Monsanto you are against organic farms because the two are not compatible...they are invested in Bayer that makes people sick...

Chemicals and technology

1. Did your company produce Agent Orange? Did you produce RBST? Did you produce Roundup? You're a chemical company trying to promote food production...
2. You're not implying that all products at Monsanto are tested for safety? My understanding is it's a voluntary program for companies to determine safety? Do you test all products?
3. I lived in Sauget, Illinois...Monsanto chemical manufacturing was done there...I taught school with students who lived there...it was decimated. My question is, are you going to turn Tucson and Marana in to Sauget? Monsanto spent 30 years dumping its waste in the Mississippi River; there is a dead zone there now. Are you going to do the same thing here...

4. What about the lawsuit from the patent seeds you use that spread to other fields? What are you doing to contain the facility? The membrane doesn't seem very aggressive in sealing the facility and there's an issue there with the patent seed...

Herbicides and pesticides potentially used on the property

1. Are you going to spray the plants in the greenhouse with herbicide?

Floodplain, flooding and hydrology issues at the Monsanto property

1. How was the land sold to Monsanto? Was it a private party or was the land given to Monsanto?
2. What about the wash behind the facility – the open wash. What will go in to it? In an earlier meeting we asked if the facility was going to be enclosed, but the greenhouse with the groundwater – with the water going out in to the wash, how is that going to affect our water and all that...my sister is healthy. If she drank that water she might be okay. But if I drank it – big problem...

Use of the 155-acre property and the proposed 7-acre greenhouse

1. We have high winds in that area. While that doesn't affect the greenhouse as much, I am convinced we will have open fields and spraying on the remainder of the 155 acres.

Wildlife, biodiversity and ecological issues

1. Has there been any attention paid to the fact Tucson has the largest seed library in the country and that if this is allowed to go forward that will be damaged? The concern is cross contamination...

Human health effects

1. How will Monsanto guarantee damages they have caused locally, globally nationally so we know locally this will not happen in Pima County? We know from every independent study national and global that GMO cause organ damage, infertility, folds in our gastrointestinal tract, multiple organ system failure and more. How will Monsanto guarantee damages so it won't happen here in Pima County?
2. I love science...I wish your scientist were working on things that promote health instead of causing harm...
3. Are health is under siege and we need fresh food, fresh air and fresh water... now we have fluoride in the water...GMO in the food, and senior citizens are heavily affected

Effects of the proposed facility on the local economy

1. It will affect the UNESCO designation of gastronomy and that will affect tourism and our economy.
2. ...Some people come to Arizona to escape illness. They come here from all over the country for the climate, the alternative lifestyle, hippies coming here because it's a healthy place – think of how much money we are going to lose?
3. I'm the president of the Arizona Farm Bureau...we have a chance to work hand in hand and I think this facility will be an economic benefit to all of us.

The public Information meetings conducted by Pima County

1. I think at the future meetings we need to move the public comment before the Monsanto presentation so we make sure the citizens have more time to voice their concerns...

The Pima County Foreign Trade Zone/Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement

1. Is it possible to have Pima County zone Monsanto as an experimental agricultural area and have notification in a five mile radius to anybody that might purchase a piece of land in this experimental agricultural area? So there's no way people could be notified of living next to that before an escape occurred? So the county has no obligation to warn people of potential hazards? If there is litigation is Pima County responsible for bringing Monsanto here?
2. If the PILOT requested by the board of supervisors and Monsanto, if it's approved, is Monsanto required to make that payment?
3. ...I do not wish for Pima County to vote for an FTZ designation granted to Monsanto or the tax break, but I understand that FTZ is to promote business coming to our city and offer them a tax break but a FTZ designation can also allow for businesses to have lower EPA standards than the country they are operating in and how are we going to know that this is part of your negotiation...
4. Can you speak to how the PILOT to the three educational entities was computed, for example, Marana Unified School District was offered \$500,000, and I think they had three alternatives...but how that \$500,000 would overcome the loss of property taxes. Activity inside the proposed greenhouse facility

1. You said there would be the use of Bt technology and beneficial insects in the greenhouse. What insects are you targeting with that approach? There are studies that say Bt can kill the ladybugs you plan to use in the facility.
2. Will the corn be coated with Neonicotinoid?
3. Are you using new herbicide on the plants in the greenhouse? What herbicides will you be using?
4. Is the facility for production or experimentation?
5. Is the power for the greenhouse coming from solar? There is a great solar industry here and it would be best if you could use it.
6. How does 7 acres in the greenhouse equate to 192 acres in the field
7. If a dust storm hits the greenhouse and breeches the containment, is there a requirement for notifying the county?
8. Are you familiar with the pollen aspects of our Sonoran Desert vegetation? Are you familiar with the Biosphere in Oracle?
9. Is the floor lined?

10. What about your workers in the facility...how are they monitored to ensure they are not bringing out pollen that can lead to cross contamination? How can you guarantee that pollen won't escape and cross pollinate?

GMO (Genetically Modified Organism)

1. So the farmer wants to use your patented GMO seeds, they have to buy the seeds from you every year? You say you favor sustainability but it's not very sustainable if the farmer is at the mercy of Monsanto and has to buy seed from you year after year...
2. So, you're saying Monsanto is not responsible for any GMO contamination...what are the GMO product names? How long has the drought resistant GMO been on the market?
3. There's a very good reason why many European countries have banned GMO...it is a menace to society and the world. We don't want you here in Pima County.
4. One half (GMO) of the planned greenhouse is hazardous to my health and the FDA admits they made a political decision on GMO, not one based in science...we have not had choice in our food supply for 30 years.

Monsanto's corporate reputation

1. How can you say you have a good relationship in Hawaii when there are documented evidences, including videos and studies, of the problems in Molokai?
2. Would you agree you company is a multi-billion-dollar Fortune 500 company with many shareholders? Do you agree the company's first

obligation is to its shareholders and their profits? You have a difficult task in convincing us of your altruism...your goal is to make money...

3. Do you have experience with the MOU that you have with Pima County...what is your level of volunteer compliance? With your track record we don't have much confidence.

Chemicals and technology

1. Will any of the corn be used by Bayer or be going to a pharmaceutical industry?

Organics

1. I'm the director of Food Conspiracy...our board of directors unanimously passed a resolution against the Monsanto proposal...we oppose the FTZ and we urge the Board of Supervisors to oppose the proposal...Monsanto is a threat to our local agricultural system.

Use of the 155-acre property and the proposed 7-acre greenhouse

1. If the (FTZ/PILOT is approved) do they get the same benefit to the rest of the property...if you have additional phases, you have more infrastructure need, more services...and more tax advantage...
2. If the seven acres is so great, why not use the rest of the 155 acres you bought?
3. What are you going to do with the other 143 acres? Would you plant on it?

Wildlife, biodiversity and ecological issues

1. I'm a beekeeper and I'm going to be right across the road from you and I have great concern...there is a lot of documentation on your products effect of GMO and your pesticides on honeybees...
2. ...I believe the partnership with Pima County, Monsanto and the UA shows leadership as we move in to the uncertain future of climate change...and I look forward to the solutions Monsanto brings along with the jobs.
3. My concern is the biodiversity of our city, not only Pima County but all over the world. Monsanto contributes to monoculture and we've lost 93 percent of our seed diversity and that's serious. It leaves us vulnerable. We thought antibiotics were great until resistance...our pest and weeds are becoming resistant and there are many scientist banking our remaining 7 percent of see diversity and banking it...

Human health effects

1. Is Monsanto in favor of a survey of instances of Valley Fever in the Marana area?
2. I moved to Tucson with severe chemical sensitivity...I am a canary in the mine and we do not want toxins in our environment...

5. If this happens Monsanto will pay lower taxes. Usually there is reason for that. What is the positive in this for Pima County and Tucson?

7. What is the process that the Science commission and the community committee were selected? Have they been chosen?
