Today's Paseo de las Iglesias Event celebrates the completion of the newest section of The Loop.

The Paseo - a \$14 million flood control, ecosystem restoration and park project - was funded through the 2004 bond election and runs along both sides of the Santa Cruz River from Silverlake Road to Ajo Way.

This project adds seven miles to the County's 100-plus mile Loop pathway by connecting existing Santa Cruz River segments north of Silverlake Road and south of Ajo Way to the Julian Wash Greenway.

This project is a community effort to provide cultural and habitat awareness and improve health and fitness outcomes in the region.
