YES! PLASTICS

Plastics labeled with numbers 1 through 7
 Milk water and juice containers
 Liquid detergent and shampoo containers
 Five gallon plastic buckets
 Soda cup lids and straws
 Yogurt containers
 Please rinse food from items to be recycled.



YES! MILK CARTONS AND JUICE BOXES

Please rinse food from items to be recycled.



YES! PAPER

Catalogs, magazines, phone books and newspapers
 Advertising inserts are OK
 Cardboard • Paperboard, such as cereal and frozen food boxes • Shredded paper, bagged and tied
 Brown paper bags • Plans and plats
 Office paper • Sticky notes
 Neon papers and napkins are not recyclable



YES! MISCELLANEOUS OFFICE ITEMS

Bubble wrap • Shrink wrap
 CDs and DVDs • Pens
 Pens may be returned using your office writing instrument collection boxes.



YES! METAL ITEMS

Aluminum foil or pie plates
 Non-hazardous aerosol cans
 Aluminum or steel cans
 Please rinse food from items to be recycled.




RECYCLABLE BY SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT

Return rechargeable batteries to the vendor through your department program.
 Alkaline batteries are safe for the garbage.
 Toner cartridges and ink jet cartridges are reused by the manufacturers.
 Return cartridges to your vendor. Check for return shipping information on the packaging.
These items may be recycled with special arrangement-
 Blocks of styrofoam • Palettes and wooden items.
 Bulk glass and glass food containers- please rinse.

Packing peanuts • Pizza boxes • Used paper plates
 Green waste • Styrofoam cups • Medical waste • Paper towels
 Napkins • Tissues • Neon colored papers • Plastic bags
