Re: **Additional Arterial and Collector Pavement Preservation Funds for Fiscal Year 2017/18**

Based on favorable bids received for a number of projects that are contracted and underway as well as receiving a State Highway Fund Special Distribution in the amount of \$183,768, an additional amount of approximately \$335,000 will be applied to pavement preservation actions identified in the October 25, 2017 from the Interim Transportation Director. This work supplements the Arterial and Collector Pavement Preservation Program. The available funds will be applied to the highest priority preservation projects, intended to provide long-term serviceability of the arterial highway system where average daily traffic volumes are the highest.

**SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2017/18 Arterial and Collector Pavement Preservation Program
Remaining Funds**

The Fiscal Year 2017/18 Arterial and Collector Pavement Preservation Program is underway and all of the planned work identified in the June 26, 2017, memorandum from Deputy County Administrator, Carmine DeBonis Jr., has been bid. We received favorable bids on the work and, if there are no additional costs, we will have approximately \$335,000 remaining in funds to spend this fiscal year. In addition, Senate Bill 1523 included a State Highway Fund Special Distribution, totaling \$3,185,200, for FY 2017/18. Pima County's share of this distribution is \$183,768, and this funding will also be used for the Arterial and Collector Pavement Preservation Program, bringing the total available funding to \$518,768. The table below shows a list of good candidates for pavement preservation that we recommend completing. These roads were selected based on high traffic volumes and the ability to preserve the pavement by applying a fog seal treatment. The estimated cost of these segments is \$477,974.

We intend to bid these in total, using our JOCs. The work will not start on these until the majority of the ongoing work is completed so we have a more definite number on the remaining funds. If necessary, we will eliminate segments, starting with number 6, to remain within available remaining funds.

Re: Fiscal Year 2017/18 Arterial and Collector Pavement Preservation Program

The following responds to your May 9, 2017 request to identify pavement preservation repairs on arterial and collector roadways using Highway User Revenue Funds (HURF).

Pima County Department of Transportation (PCDOT) maintains over 669 miles of collector and arterial roadways. Roughly, 134 of these miles rate failed, with an estimated repair cost in excess of \$ 28.6 million. Another 449 miles are rated in poor, fair or good condition, with 86 miles rated in very good condition. Since the cost to repair failed roadways is significant, only a small portion would be repaired with limited available funds while other roads continue to deteriorate. In order to prevent additional roads from declining to a failed condition, which is more costly to repair, it is recommended that approximately \$6.0 million of available HURF and PCDOT budget contingency funding be applied to pavement preservation treatments on poor, fair and good rated arterial and collector roadways.

The attached list, prepared by PCDOT, identifies the roadways recommended for repair. These roads were selected based on road condition, travel volume and ability to prevent further deterioration. Shown for each roadway is the current rating, segment length, proposed treatment, and treatment cost. Subject to your concurrence, PCDOT can begin this work in September, when temperatures are lower, using existing paving contracts or by bidding as necessary. It is expected that the work will be complete by December.
