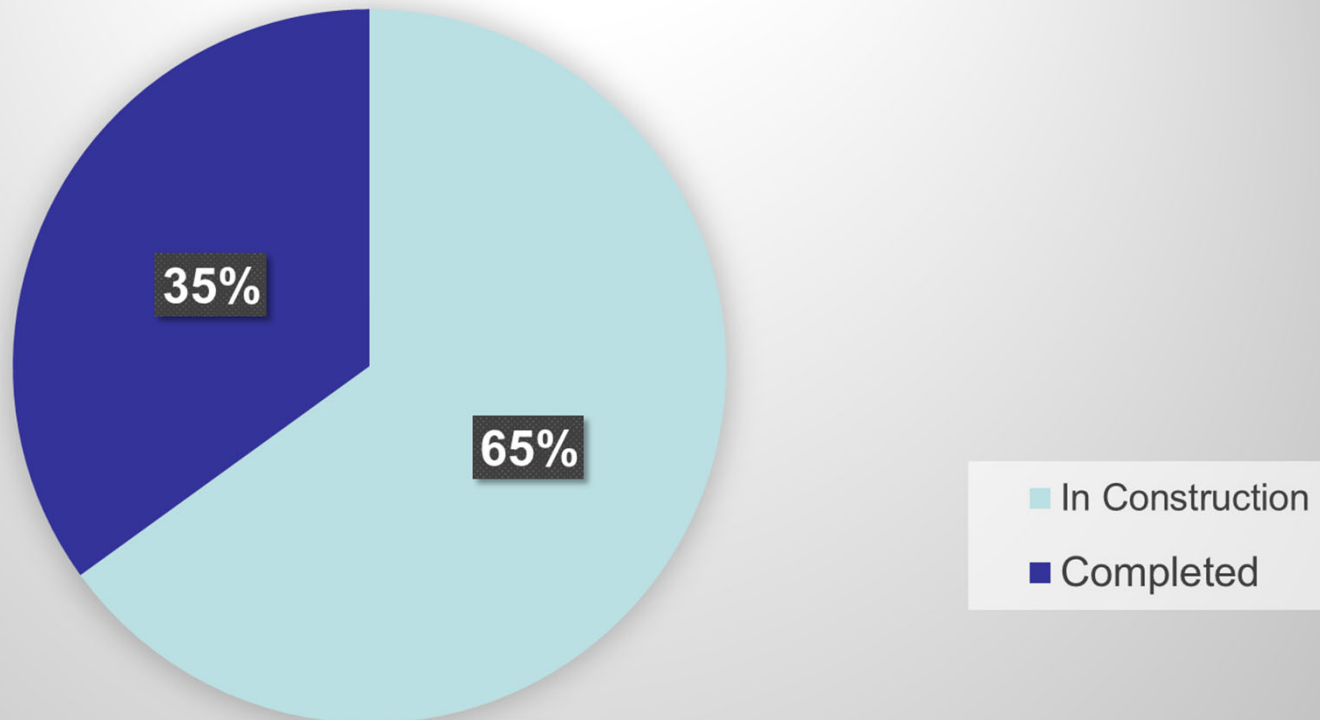

85.5 Million Total Budget


Local Roads - \$50 Million (174 miles)

- 170 different subdivisions
- 20 additional local roadway segments not associated with a subdivision
- Will include ADA Ramp upgrades where necessary

Arterials and Collector Roads – 35.5 Million (139 miles)

- 126 Arterial and Collector roadway segments
- Chosen based on benefit to cost ratio list
- Prioritized collector roadways in subdivisions on local list
- Surface Treatments list is still being finalized.

- Road Pavement Repair and Preservation Program**

Pima County has a 10-year plan to repair and preserve all currently failed and poor roads. By 2030, all roads are expected to be in very good or better condition, with an average Pavement Condition Index of 80 [see Pavement Index tab]. In FY 2020, the Board of Supervisors and Transportation Department allocated \$56 million in road repair and preservation funding which will repair 66 miles of arterial/collector roads and 127 miles of local roads.


