Tucson's Earth Day Festival will be **10 a.m. – 2 p.m., Saturday, April 18, at The Children's Museum Tucson**, 200 S. Sixth Ave. Museum admission is free all day. But it doesn't have to be Earth Day to reduce your impact on the environment. Here are some tips you can use every day:

- **Reduce:** Consume less, and when you shop consider options with less packaging.
- **Reuse:** Can you or someone else reuse the item you're throwing away? Donate gently used items to a local social service agency or school or post it on FreeCycle.org.
- **Refuse:** Say "No, thanks" to plastic bags when you go shopping. Tell restaurant servers you don't need a straw with your beverage.
- **Recycle Right:** Make sure you only put items in your Blue Barrel that can be recycled by checking the list at tucsonaz.gov/recycle.


