





Tame the Grease Monster!


SSO (Sanitary Sewer Overflow)

An SSO is the backup of raw sewage into the street, the environment or into homes and other buildings.

To keep the "Grease Monster" at bay and to avoid grease-related SSOs, don't pour grease down your drain! After cooking with grease or oils, allow them to cool and then pour them into an empty can.

Wipe grease from pots, pans and plates with a paper towel before washing them. Both the can and the greasy paper towels can be safely discarded in household trash.

By following these simple rules, we can tame the Grease Monster and keep him out of our pipes and homes.



Never pour grease down a drain!

Don't pour grease down your drain!

Ordinary kitchen cooking grease can wreak havoc in the private pipes beneath your home and in the public sanitary sewer system.

Over time, grease build-up clogs pipes, reduces sewage flow, and acts as a magnet for other debris.

Eventually this build-up can clog pipes and cause a Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO).

Grease in the sewer also attracts sewer roaches.

You can recycle your grease!

Another way to dispose of your cooking oil is to recycle it. In Pima County there are opportunities to recycle cooking grease into biodiesel.
