This letter is to indicate my support for the inclusion of the Ajo Community Golf Course in the next Bond Election tentatively scheduled for November 2015. Their need is for funds to repair old and deteriorating infrastructure.

The presence of the golf course enhances economic development in Ajo.

Local businesses benefit from the presence of the golf course as a draw for full-time and part-time residents who bring their talents and resources.

Ajo's economy is highly dependent on tourism. Tourists come to Ajo to play affordable golf in a relaxed atmosphere, and linger to patronize local businesses. The golf course will again host the 37th Annual Ajo Old Time Fiddlers Show and Contest which brings tourists from all over the country.

The golf course complements the Eric Marcus Municipal Airport. Those who fly in are able to use the facilities of the golf course restaurant and bar, which are within walking distance. The airport has no facilities, and air traffic is increasing.

I am a full time resident of Ajo, Arizona. The population here consists of locals, but relies on the influx of winter visitors as well as events held here to be a viable community. Winter visitors come from all over the United States and Canada to enjoy a sunny location. Ajo is a wonderful place, but offers little in the way of shopping, eating establishments, medical care or recreation. I personally do not play golf but know many who do and who are loyal to the golf course. My name is Benjamin Alesse, I was a coach for USA Youth Sports, and I will be applying to coach at Copper Hills Little league this next season. I have gotten into coaching youth baseball mostly in part because my son loves the sport. I have coached only one season so far, but I plan on coaching for a very long time.

I am writing this email to show support for the Tucson Youth Baseball Association and its quest to develop a premier youth baseball facility on the grounds of the Kino Sports Complex. Such a facility would do wonders for the youth baseball community in Southern Arizona, and create a positive impact for local businesses, families and many more. The youth baseball community is facing many problems right now that have an impact on many people.

Currently, there is a lack of field space to accommodate the number of players playing baseball at the ages of 14 and below. With the lack of field space and the increase in year-round travel baseball, families and teams are forced to travel to Phoenix and other cities outside of Tucson to play in tournaments and leagues. With beautiful year-round weather, and a strong club baseball community, Tucson has all of the ingredients to be a national level tournament destination. A premier youth baseball complex would make this happen, keeping local families and teams in Tucson, saving them thousands of dollars, while bringing in families and teams from all over the state, the country and the world, having a positive impact on local businesses year-round.

The costs of field usage for many city and county baseball fields have increased to a level that has made it very tough or impossible for many families to allow their children to play the sport of baseball. With high prices and the limited number of age-specific fields, the number of entry-level players in Southern Arizona has decreased. With the development of a youth baseball complex, that is funded by tournament usage, the price to play to play the sport for Pima County residents will lower dramatically allowing more kids to play, creating energy for baseball in the region which will result in higher participation numbers for entry level organizations such as Little League.

Having the Kino Sports Complex for youth baseball would be absolutely amazing. I would love to sign my son up for tournaments, but they are so far away either in Florida or North Carolina. If Tucson had the facilities here it would make signing my son up for tournaments much easier. It would also help offset the lack of youth baseball fields in Tucson. I know this first hand because I had to share the field on our Thursday practices with 4 other teams. Youth baseball or not, if we don't have a full field to practice on we can't teach them base


