Dear Mr. Huckelberry

I am writing on behalf of the "Oro Valley Committee for Innovation Park Development" to support a request to be submitted by the University of Arizona for the proposed technology park referenced above. As you are aware, our Committee has developed the plan for the proposed life sciences innovation center in Innovation Park of Oro Valley, adjacent to Sanofi and Ventana.

We believe this community has lacked adequate laboratory space and the necessary environment to optimally support and nurture the translation of research to products for the growth of our existing companies and the establishment of new companies. The Oro Valley proposal is focused on life science/health care, while the potential for efforts in additional technology sectors is significant. The UA is recognized worldwide for top programs in optics, space sciences and physical sciences overall - all disciplines which should spark translational innovation in the private sector. The UA Tech Park building at the Bridges would provide another node to complement the Rita Road UA Tech Park, the Oro Valley innovation center, the downtown Co-Lab and Start-Up Tucson/Thryve sites for fostering economic development. Phoenix has established an entrepreneurial ecosystem with a number of incubator-type sites such as SkySong, Peoria, CEI and Chandler that have spurred economic development in the Valley. Indeed, Tucson is on the cusp of creating a similar rich environment for start-up and entrepreneurial activity. We believe the community is best served by having multiple sites in order to meet the varied needs of early stage, technology-based businesses.






