SUBJECT: Ward 1 priorities for the Pima County bond election

I am a strong supporter of the Pima County bond program to provide infrastructure and investment in this region. From neighborhood reinvestment to affordable housing to conserving our natural and cultural resources, to economic development, a comprehensive bond program is critically important to its success.

I know Ward 1 constituents consider investments in Parks and Recreation facilities, greenways, neighborhood and housing programs and road improvements as both job creators and quality-of-life economic drivers for residents and visitors to our Sonoran Desert City.

I have spoken with you many times about important projects, but I want to reiterate again individual projects that I strongly support, including **all of the Parks Subcommittee recommendations of the Bond Advisory Committee (BAC)**. Other projects include:

Support for projects in Ward 1 approved by the BAC – Parks Subcommittee

1. **PR 201 – \$620,000** currently approved by BAC for Oury Pool– With the support of Pima County Supervisor Richard Elias and myself, the Barrio Anita neighborhood is finalizing a master plan to prioritize cultural heritage improvement projects in the area.
2. **PR 267- \$2.5 million** - Sentinel Peak Park (“A” Mountain) –the master plan is complete and Phase I City-funded improvements have begun. The \$2.5 million will pay for phase 2 improvements including Native American interpretation, trails, erosion control, water harvesting, visitor amenities, buffelgrass removal and wildlife connectivity.

Projects to be added that are not currently approved by BAC – Parks Subcommittee

1. **PR 256 \$5 million for Joaquin Murrieta Park** – The City of Tucson is paying for a Master Plan for tournament-level sports fields, irrigation, concession stands, bleachers, trails, pool replacement and other needed improvements.

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2. **PR 46 \$2.5 million for Kennedy Park** – replacing lighting and irrigation systems and concessions for a tournament-level sports facility

Economic Development Project – NEW

1. **\$1.5 million - South 12th Avenue Cultural and Culinary Corridor** (like Olvera Street in L.A. or Mission District in San Francisco) - The City of Tucson applied for a federal Transportation Enhancement Grant in 2012 that was ranked as a high priority. Unfortunately, that program no longer exists, so we are looking for master planning and infrastructure funds to do pedestrian, bike and road improvements, shade, corridor signage and art to celebrate our unique Mexican American cultural heritage and bring investment to a highly used transportation corridor.

Neighborhood Reinvestment and Housing Reinvestment – I support these critical infrastructure investments that improve the quality of life for working families and the entire community. I support funding at the same level or higher than previous bond programs.

SUBJECT: Ward 1 priorities for the Pima County bond election -- Amendment

I am a strong supporter of the Pima County bond program to provide infrastructure and investment in this region. I recently shared a memorandum highlighting priority projects within our community. I would like to clarify projects relating to Oury Park in Barrio Anita and give you an update on the positive work we are doing with another proposed bond item at Sentinel Peak Park.

Support for projects in Ward 1 approved by the BAC – Parks Subcommittee

1. **REVISED PR 201 – \$1,500,000** tentatively approved by BAC for Oury Pool– With the support of Pima County Supervisor Richard Elias and myself, the Barrio Anita neighborhood would like to incorporate design and construction updates to the aging Oury Pool and bathhouse facility. A recent collaborative planning process between the City of Tucson, Pima County and the neighborhood indicates a need for a slide, splash area and zero depth pool entry. Oury Pool has been a culturally significant amenity in the neighborhood for three generations, and was the first pool facility in the region to be desegregated. It is currently in need of significant renovations to be operational. The purpose of this project is to bring the pool up to national design recommendations for pool accessibility and operation, expand the features of the pool to meet the needs of pool users of all ages and interpret the history of the region through public art and signage. This project will address the community's needs for water-oriented recreation and cultural and historic interpretation as identified in the neighborhood driven master planning process.
2. **PR 44 – Oury Park Cultural Festival Area - \$1,500,000** Planning, design and construction of a festival area to support regional cultural festivals and commemorative events. The festival area concept is the result of ten years of neighborhood driven master planning to revitalize the Barrio Anita neighborhood and Oury Park. The festival area compliments the existing park as well as planned future nearby amenities such as regional alternate modes transportation corridors, an expanded arterial roadway upgrade at St. Mary's Road to connect to I-10, neighborhood infill projects, public art related to the culture and history of the area, and improvements to the historic Oury Center. Bond funding is requested only for the festival area. Other funds will be pursued for nearby amenities. The festival space requires infrastructure to support vendors, performers and the public to include an extensive electrical system and a large, lighted public space with ramadas, hardscape, landscape, irrigation and parking.

PR 267- \$2.5 million - Sentinel Peak Park (“A” Mountain) – I wanted to give you an update of the Phase I improvements we are doing right now with City funds. The \$2.5 million will pay for phase 2 including Native American interpretation, trails, erosion control, water harvesting, visitor amenities, buffelgrass removal and wildlife connectivity. To date we have had 10 buffelgrass workshops with more than 1000 volunteer hours and more than 500 bags removed.

Current Construction Activities at Sentinel Peak Park - May 1, 2013

- **Park Entry Signs:** Signage to direct the public to the park entry is being constructed at the intersection of Congress Street and Cuesta Avenue. Entry signs are being constructed in water-harvesting road “chicanes” on either side of Cuesta Avenue. These chicanes are planted with native low water-use vegetation and are designed similar to other traffic-calming structures installed throughout the neighborhood. These signs will not only reduce confusion about where the entry to the park is, but will also include an indicator to let people know whether the gates to the park are currently open or closed.
- **ADA Accessible Parking Improvements:** Two handicap accessible parking spaces are being added to the park’s upper parking lot.
- **Trailhead Plaza:** An ADA accessible plaza is being constructed adjacent to the park’s upper parking lot to orient visitors regarding the various trail opportunities present in that area of the park. This plaza includes colored/textured concrete seatwalls, interpretive signage, trail map signage, bicycle parking, and benches.
- **Overlook Plazas:** Two ADA accessible overlook plazas are under construction on the south side of Sentinel Peak. These plazas include rusted steel and colored/textured concrete shade ramadas, colored/textured concrete seatwalls, and interpretive signs.
- **ADA Accessible Path:** An accessible path is being constructed to connect the ADA parking improvements, the trailhead plaza, and the two overlook plazas. This path will be constructed of “XeriTec” paving, a stable, porous, colored natural rock paving system designed to blend with the geology of the site.
- **Trail System Signage:** A variety of signage will be installed to alert visitors regarding trail difficulty, directions, and mileage. An interpretive sign is also to be installed near the top of Sentinel Peak.

Improvements are currently scheduled to be complete by mid-July, 2013 and the cost of current construction is approximately \$320,000. Funding for this project has been provided via Restricted Use City of Tucson General Fund (from the sale of land around Juhan Park), CDBG funds provided by Ward 1, City of Tucson HURF funds, 2000 City of Tucson General Obligation Bonds, and West District Impact Fee funds.


Dear Mr. Huckleberry:




Dear Mr. Hecker and Members of the PC Bond Advisory Committee:

Re: Neighborhood support of funding for the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program at the \$30 million level

Dear Mr. Hecker and Committee Members,

The Pima County Bond Advisory Committee in 2010 recommended that the next county Bond Election Package include \$30 million for Neighborhood Reinvestment. Assistance to neighborhoods has declined, our needs have grown as infrastructure has declined, and costs have risen. Feldman's Neighborhood Association asks you to recommend full funding for the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program at the \$30 million level.

The goal of the program is to "promote stability and revitalize stressed communities through the funding of small capital improvement projects selected through a community consensus process." Neighborhoods like Feldman's across the southern and central portions of Tucson and Pima County are "high stress" and "medium high stress" neighborhoods. These are older neighborhoods that need infrastructure upgrades and safety features. As you may know, the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program does not fund luxuries, but basic necessities such as:

- Sidewalks
- Street lights
- Pedestrian crossings
- Parks where children may play safely


Feldman's Neighborhood received a \$500,000 NR grant in 2005 that was used to install sidewalks completed in 2008. Located between UA and Pima Community College Downtown Campus, Feldman's is a neighborhood with high pedestrian traffic. Previously, the sidewalks were short, disconnected stretches installed by the WPA in the 1930s. Some sidewalks were badly broken by tree roots, we had no ADA curb access ramps, and most easements consisted of bare dirt, rock and weeds, which pushed neighbors to walk in the street. Most importantly, the neighborhood experienced pedestrian and cyclist fatalities.

\$500,000 allowed our small 50-square-block neighborhood to put sidewalks on only one side of the street. If the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program is not fully funded, it will provide smaller grants that can't buy much in public safety improvements.

Other funding sources have not been available to our neighborhood. We were unable to create a city improvement district (year 2000 Census data from Pima County: median household income in our neighborhood is \$21,815, and per capita income is \$12,819). In the past, our neighborhood received two Back-to-Basics grants, and currently these grants are unavailable. We unsuccessfully applied three times for ADOT Transportation Enhancement grants. Transportation Enhancement grants no longer are awarded to individual neighborhoods, because projects must have a regional focus.

In light of the growing need, Feldman's Neighborhood requests that you recommend the full \$30 million in funding for the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program.

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Adaptive Recreation Center

PHASE II

Presented by P.A.R.C.

Patrons of the Adaptive Recreation Center

Our mission is to provide a universally accessible sports and fitness center for all ages and disabilities.

Phase II is an expansion of the existing Edith Ball Adaptive Recreation Center (ARC). This aquatic center is centrally located in Reid Park near the zoo and features two pools, accessible showers, locker rooms and family changing rooms.

The gymnasium will have a climbing wall and indoor track as well as multipurpose rooms for classes and events – i.e., arts and crafts, tai chi, yoga and dance.

The exercise rooms and universal weight room will be large and spacious to accommodate all users with ample room between equipment for wheelchairs and staff support.

Pima County Statistics to consider: *Older Americans 55 years and older: 30%*
Under 18 years with a disability: 7,190
18-64 years with a disability: 52,270
65 years and over with a disability: 46,574
Obesity Among Adults: 24%

Physical activity is an essential component of a healthy lifestyle for everyone.



30% of people in Pima County are permanently disabled, and thousands more are *temporarily* disabled.



Children and adults with and without disabilities, seniors and community members from all walks of life need a place that is safe where they can participate in leisure activities and fitness programs that are exciting and challenging.



Many people in our community are not afforded this essential component.

According to the World Health Organization, physical inactivity is the fourth leading risk factor for mortality.



Pima County has one of the lowest rates of physical inactivity in Arizona.



Everyone in our community knows someone with a disability.
Accessible, safe and inclusive recreation facilities are an important
element in building a strong community.



Regular physical activity can reduce the risk of multiple diseases, including
diabetes, colon and breast cancers.

Older individuals who regularly exercise can achieve improved cardiovascular function and muscle strength.



Maintaining muscle strength between the ages of 50 and 70 is critical in order to maintain mobility and to be able to lead an independent life and manage everyday tasks.

A facility that offers universally accessible sports and fitness programs as well as, multi-purpose rooms for gatherings is vitally important to Pima County and its citizens.



This is not a gym for *everybody*, but everyone can use it.



ARC Phase II – To provide a universally accessible sports and fitness center for people of all types of disabilities and ages.

Phase II – Unmet Needs

Indoor Track

- Would provide conditioned and well lighted space for year round and evening use and protection from the sun.
- Handrails around the perimeter would provide support for those with balance or distance issues, relieving anxiety first and foremost; making goals more realistic.
- Providing benches at pull out areas along the track with seating at varying heights (standard and hip chairs) for those needing a rest, thus accommodating and empowering all levels of activity.

Gymnasium/Sports Court/Multipurpose Room

- Would provide 2 sports courts for standard sports and fitness activities like basketball, volleyball, badminton and other activities for an all inclusive clientele promoting teamwork, confidence and coordination.
- Courts would be adaptable for specific activities and programs with specialized equipment, such as hoops and nets at varying heights, specialized programming for additional wheelchair sports, bocce and floor hockey, and training of Special Olympic teams.
- Rock/Climbing wall.
- Adjacent seating supporting the needs of the end users their families and supporters, yet in a safe area from court activity (will require a larger area than usual due to accommodating special equipment needs).
- Area large enough for multiple functions such as a gathering place for people with disabilities, summer camps and large programs, social dances for adults with disabilities, etc.
- Storage areas for adaptable equipment and tables and chairs.

Weight/Exercise Room

- Large and spacious enough to accommodate a variety of standard weight training equipment as well as adaptive training equipment and mobility devices with room for all users to maneuver in and out of the equipment on their own or with the support of trainers/facilitators.
- An area for free weights with ample room for users and support staff to assist.
- Full height wall mirrors to monitor correct movement.
- Support for trainers to work with users; overhead lifts to maneuver users onto and out of specialized equipment or areas as well as portable lifts that could be moved to various equipment with ample space between equipment to maneuver through and set up next to equipment.

- Large lockable storage rooms for storing portable lifts when not in use to keep the floor open and uncluttered.
- Large height adjustable exercise mats for clients and staff to exercise on and around.
- Adjustable height parallel bars with overhead lift equipment to facilitate walking and support throughout the course.
- A large area for aerobics, yoga, dance outfitted with full height mirrors for clients to monitor their movements and activity; with large nearby storage for props utilized by these activities.

Dance/Aerobics Room

- Area with wood floor for dance and aerobics classes designed for people with varying abilities.
- Storage adjacent for specialized equipment and chairs.

Need for energy efficiency

- The Adaptive Recreation Center, phase one, was developed with solar panels for heating water, energy efficient materials, and energy efficient cooling methods. This focus needs to continue.

Other Considerations

- The current ARC was built, not only with a focus on being universally accessible, but with specific abilities and disabilities in mind. Walls and decking utilized tactile features for those with visual impairments; separate family changing rooms were designed to accommodate specialized space needs and levels of assistance; the lobby was designed so those using “Van Tran” would have a safe, comfortable place to wait; and many other specific considerations were built into the plans. Many, many people had input into the design to insure that the needs of the disability community were met. This same design process has to continue. It is a more lengthy and costly process than general building design.

Dear Ms. Lucas and Whom It May Concern,

I am President of the Board of Directors of DIRECT Center for Independence of Tucson Arizona, and a physician at Tucson Orthopaedic Institute. As a physician, I have suggested too many of my patients with spinal conditions that they utilize the Edith Ball Adaptive Recreation therapeutic pool. It is a wonderful environment where my patients can rehabilitate themselves under the watchful eyes of the Parks and Recreation staff.

I am extremely excited about the Phase II of the Edith Ball Adaptive Recreation Center (ARC). I myself am a C7 quadriplegic following a ski injury in 2004. Part of my own rehabilitation came by playing wheelchair rugby. My team, the Tucson Pterodactyls were the United States Quad Rugby Division I National Champions for the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 seasons. Two of my team members were on the US Paralympic Quad Rugby Team that won Bronze Medals at the Olympics in London. We would gladly welcome access to a gym with adapted weight training facility at which to practice and work out.

Our entire team looks forward to Phase II of the Edith Ball Adaptive Recreation Center. I am Board Certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, and I know on a personal level how important recreational sports are to the disabled population. After leaving formal rehabilitation facilities, recreational adaptive sports become a major means of affordable rehabilitation at the community level.

If you need any community members to be a part of future planning committees, I would gladly donate my time to the Tucson Parks and Recreation Department. I am also a clinical instructor for the University of Arizona Family Practice Sports Medicine Fellowship Program. One of my interests is research in the area of sports related injury in wheelchair athletes. The Phase II Edith Ball ARC by attracting competitive wheelchair athletes would be an excellent resource for the collection of this type of epidemiologic data.



Since I can remember, I've always experienced pain and discomfort in my back. Approximately seven years ago, I was diagnosed with Degenerative Disc Disease (DDD). There is no cure or repair for this. Losing weight and remaining active are the only things that can improve my pain. In September of 2012, my pain increased significantly and has resulted in my inability to walk more than 500 feet without experiencing excruciating pain and numbness in my legs. I was running 3 miles a day up to this point. Physical exercise that has impact on my joints has become too painful for me. I decided to try swimming. I've always been an athlete, but never a swimmer. Because of its non-impact nature, I thought it may help me be active without experiencing pain. I can say that I think it's saving my life! I downright LOVE my swim classes and wish so badly that I could take more of them, but they are not offered during times that are conducive to my work schedule. My increased physical activity has led to a reduction in back pain in recent months. I've signed up at the YMCA so that I can get back on the Elliptical machine (fingers crossed) and do more swimming.

As a result of the completion of Phase II of the ARC, I would be able to cancel my YMCA membership and have the ability to get a complete workout at this facility instead. My records from the City will indicate that I used to use the facilities at the Udall center, but no longer live near there and it is not convenient for me to drive to that center anymore. I would love nothing more than to be able to use a facility similar to the Udall center to maintain my physical activity and improve my overall health. I wouldn't trade those benefits for anything in the world! You have the power to approve Phase II of the ARC, resulting in the opportunity save more lives! These have been enormously helpful for 4 main reasons.

- 2) core/strength training to improve posture and help with the movements needed for daily activities.
- 3) encouragement to keep moving, even with disabilities
- 4) social contact focused on health and healing

An indoor walking track would provide another much needed outlet. The severe summer heat leaves few opportunities for outdoor walking. 

Many places don't have enough space, the proper equipment or the facilities to meet the needs of the disabled community. The gymnasiums are hard to use because it is difficult to share with ambulatory people who are also trying to exercise. I understand the want for floor space, I have been athletic my entire life. After becoming disabled I continued to be athletic, in fact I played on the world basketball team in 1998 in Australia.

I am currently coaching Tucson's local community wheelchair basketball team the Tucson Lobo's. We in the Mansfield Park neighborhood have benefitted enormously from the public funds available for neighborhood improvement. We have tapped every resource possible to bring revitalization to our area and the quality of life in here has improved dramatically. We as citizens and neighbors have accomplished much and are at a critical step in our progress. The funds offered by Bond Money fund projects of a larger scale that addresses critical infrastructure projects, the cost of which cannot be deferred to smaller groups.

The projects we have completed thus far:

- The Chicanes on Elm Street and the 5th Ave Greenway were part of a Pima County reinvestment grant.
- Community Garden was part of a federal grant the city received
- Pocket Park and wash mural was part of a Pro Neighborhoods grant.

All of it ties together. We still need funding to complete our projects, as they are all fragmented. We have a greenway for the west side of our neighborhood, but what about the east side? We have a greenway that goes to the park, but literally no bridge for the gap at the wash. Many of our projects were done with lots of sweat and other resources, but things like bridges and greenways in 100 year flood plains can't be handled by a small group of neighbors. There are neighborhoods all over the county facing these kinds of issues, and cutting funding on the bond initiative would be a shame. Cutting 1/3 of the projected money from the proposition is significant.

Please continue to support Neighborhood Reinvestment in the next bond package. The city benefits from these programs!

More specifically:

- PCNR (Pima County Neighborhood Reinvestment) project, Elm ST chicanes, 5th AV greenway (walkway - decomposed granite, bump outs and storm water catchment basins), and greenway between Linden/Waverly and Waverly/Mansfield Park (walkway, concrete, and catchment basins) within the easements.
- Federal grant (city, county, UA were co-partners and there were other partners), community garden in the Mansfield Park. One of the purposes of the grant was to decrease obesity in youth and healthier adults.
- PRO Neighborhoods, pocket park at the SE corner of 6th/Linden and medium in Linden just east of 6th AV.
- RTA, Bike Boulevard with traffic circles along 4th AV to 6th AV/Fontana AV between 4th/University Boulevard and Prince RD. Joint effort by five or six neighborhoods and Tucson Bike Coordinator to make this happened.
- Upcoming project, E2C grant opportunity, storm water catchment basins north and south of Seneca/1st AV on the west side of the latter.

Unfinished projects include (on our website, www.neighborhoodlink.com, enter 85705 and click on our neighborhood.

Greenway along 3rd AV from Lee ST to Seneca ST including the easements between Linden/Waverly and Waverly/Seneca. (Excessive storm water flow is a problem in these easements.)

- Bridges - plural, at 3rd AV and 5th AV over the Bronx Wash.
- Other projects not mentioned in the Neighborhood Plan that have been mentioned, include water catchment basins along 1st AV, within El Cortez to lessen storm water flow through the 3rd AV easements and into the Bronx Wash, and greenways along 2nd AV between Lee and Linden Streets.

Thank you for your continued support of inner city development. We are so close to 4th Ave, UofA and downtown. Our community integrates with these areas and we need to continue to offer modern services to the residence here and coming here to invest.





I support a fully funded open space bond program, including the maximum funding for *Habitat Protection Priorities* and *Community Open Space*. Our community supports open space preservation. The 2004 Open Space Bond Program was approved by Pima County voters by an overwhelming 2-to-1 margin. The approval and diligent use of these funds has protected saguaro studded hillsides in the Tucson Mountains, canyon lands in the Tortolita Mountains, unique riparian lands near Cienega Creek and the Brawley Wash, desert grasslands in the southeast area of the County, the rolling hills of the Altar Valley, and much more.



Deseret:

Below is the response Mr. Huckelberry is sending to Sahuarita residents who have emailed regarding the Sahuarita pool project.

Thank you for taking the time to share with me your thoughts on the need for a recreational public pool complex in your area.

I understand it might be disconcerting to hear there are more projects proposed for an anticipated 2014 bond election than we are able to fund; but at this time, the Anamax Pool and Recreation Complex remains on the tentatively approved list of projects as determined by the Pima County Bond Advisory Committee. The Committee gave initial support for the \$12.6 million project as it was submitted in 2006.

Recently, given the time that has elapsed since initial submission, all jurisdictions were asked to go back and reassess their projects. The Anamax Pool and Recreational Complex proposal was revised in April to reflect a projected cost of \$15.8, an increase of roughly \$3.2 million.

There are a great number of needs throughout the community, and the County's bonding capacity is limited.

The base project remains on the tentatively approved list, and I do appreciate the work the Town of Sahuarita has done to date to secure the land and to consider a collaborative partnership with the YMCA for operation and maintenance of the project. However, given the constraints we face, I will be reluctant to recommend the requested **increase** to the Bond Advisory Committee and ultimately, to the Pima County Board of Supervisors. To be clear, I am not recommending deletion of the project from the tentatively approved list.

I would, however, ask that the Town continue to refine its costs. If the cost still exceeds the initial request, I would ask that the Town revisit the scope of work, prioritize needs and, if necessary, explore a local match or other funding opportunities to make up that difference.

The Bond Advisory Committee is not expected to adopt a final list of projects until early 2014. The Committee is in the process this year of continuing to work through the list and will **prioritize** the submissions after assessing the public benefit of every project. The Board of Supervisors is expected by mid-2014 to approve a final list of projects to go to voters.

I would encourage you to remain active in the bond project planning process and continue to advocate for your project.

Thank you, again, for sharing your concerns.

I have lived with my family in Sahuarita since late 2005. During that time, the only option for swimming is to make the trek into Tucson to go to one of the public pools there. With the price of gas and the time it takes to travel there and back, that is just not practical. We do not go swimming. It bothers me that my four children do not know how to swim, especially because my wife, a former lifeguard, could easily teach them herself if the facilities were available.

It is my understanding that the complex is planned to be built near Anamax park. My family and I frequent Anamax park fairly regularly. Every time we go the park is full of visitors. There is no doubt in my mind that the pool would be regularly used. Most of my neighbors have young families like me, and I am sure they would also use the pool regularly. I also know of many adults, such as my wife, who would use the pool frequently for lap swimming.
