### TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The Pima County Horsemen's Association has the current lease for Horse Racing at Rillito Park Race Track. This lease will expire on May 2, 2014, and we have submitted our proposal for renewal. Pima County Horsemen's Association, together with the Pima County Fair Horse Racing Commission, has had this lease since 1987. We currently have two years remaining (2015 and 2016) on a three year racing permit, with the Arizona Department of Racing, for racing at Rillito - if we get a lease for that period of time.

Attached is a preliminary plan which we have submitted to the Pima County Board of Supervisors, the County Administrator, and the Parks Commission. It adds 3 more full-sized soccer fields while taking advantage of all usable land without sacrificing any "parking" or existing features. This brings the total number of full-sized soccer fields to eleven. All 88 acres of Historic Rillito Race Track, plus the Jelks property, are now on the National Historical Register.

On Sunday, our closing day, March 30, 2014, we had 10,300 spectators and parked over 3,500 cars in the parking lot with special attention from attendants. Many families enjoy Horse Racing and related horse activities. The Horse Racing industry is a \$15,000,000,000.00 a year industry nationwide. Currently, Rillito Race Track generates over \$3,000,000.00 in revenue during a 16 day meet. This all goes back to the public "now" and is not based on future speculation. Currently, the "Centurions" have Rillito leased for their annual charity party. They selected Rillito because it has the space for 5,000 to 6,000 people.

Please look at our Rillito Park proposal. It is basic and features multiple use for all concerned. It does not sacrifice any activity for the benefit of another.


The demand for soccer fields appears to be reaching epidemic proportions and seems unattainable. We should continue to take care of our youth in Tucson and give them ample opportunity to compete. To push for Regional Western United States tournaments, etc., seems a bit opportunistic. Possibly, Tucson Soccer Academy, or the powers that be, should put up some money and not rely entirely on the taxpayers alone. With this type of rabid demand, five additional soccer fields at Rillito Park Race Track will hardly suffice. The surrounding community is well established and is hardly going to change to accommodate soccer.

\$14,000,000.00 is a stiff price to pay for 16 soccer fields with limited parking and limited multiple use. Especially when there are larger areas conducive to a Reach 11 Site (currently Marana has 500 acres near I-10 ready to go). This will also lead to the destruction of a very unique historical site which is a part of Tucson's western past and needs to be preserved. Thank you for your time.
