



## ***It Pays to Hire a Vet!***

Employers who hire unemployed veterans between Nov. 21, 2011, and Jan. 1, 2013, may qualify for:

- A Returning Heroes Tax Credit of up to \$2,400 if the veteran has been unemployed for at least four weeks or up to \$5,600 if the veteran has been unemployed for more than six months.
- A Wounded Warrior Tax Credit of up to \$9,600 if the veteran has been unemployed for more than six months and has service-connected disabilities.

***Veterans are valued members of the civilian workforce, with the skills, training and character to meet the toughest challenges faced by today's employers.***

Pima County One-Stop Career Centers provide veterans and eligible spouses with access to the tools needed to find good jobs with good wages and career pathways. They will ensure that you have a personal guide to help access many state and federal programs designed to assist veterans and their families; direct links to housing and other immediate transitional services; and one-on-one vocational assistance.



***What kinds of services are available to veterans?***

Veterans and eligible spouses receive access, on a priority of service basis, to the full range of public employment and training services, including:

- Career counseling
- Job search assistance
- Assistance with resumes and interview and phone techniques
- Skill and aptitude assessments
- Computer labs and office equipment
- Support services for personal, family and emergency needs
- Financial assistance for training and education programs

***What does priority of service mean?***

Priority of service means that those veterans and eligible spouses who meet all the eligibility requirements for a program or service are to receive access to that program or service either before or instead of persons who are not eligible for priority of service.

***Priority of service is provided to:***

- Veterans who served in the active military, naval or air service and who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable. Active service includes full-time National Guard or Reserve component other than full-time duty for training.
- Eligible spouses of those veterans who have total service-connected disabilities or who died as a result of service-connected disabilities.
